## Children's Mental Health Services for SFY 2009

### Outcome Information of Youth who Received Services

Family members of children and adolescents diagnosed with a severe emotional disturbance who receive public mental health services were asked to participate in the "Human Service Center Consumer Satisfaction Survey," by completing the Youth Services Survey – Family in October 2008. The results are as follows:

- 67.37 % of family members rated *Client Perception of Care* positively
- 83.54% of family members rated *Increased Social Support/Social Connectedness* positively
- 68.64% of family members rated *Improved Levels of Functioning* positively
- 79.34% of family members rated *Access to Care* positively
- 86.67% of family members rated *Parental Involvement*, defined as being actively involved in decisions regarding their child's treatment, positively
- 87.71% of family members rated *Quality and Appropriateness* positively

### School Information from the Single Plan of Care (SPOC) for SFY 2009

- 86.27% of school-aged children and adolescents diagnosed with a severe emotional disturbance who received public mental health services attended school regularly

### Child and Adolescent Functional Assessment Scale (CAFAS) from SPOC for SFY 2009

- 42.11% of children and adolescents diagnosed with a severe emotional disturbance who received public mental health services had positive changes in their level of functioning
- 21.74% of children and adolescents diagnosed with a severe emotional disturbance who received public mental health services had improvements in school functioning
