

2011-13 Major Capital Project Priorities

Consistent with SBHE policy 902.1 and capital budget changes adopted by the SBHE in December 2009, I am forwarding to you my remaining 11-13 capital budget recommendations.

In December 2009, the SBHE adopted several capital budget changes. I have noted these below along with their status:

- 1.) Increased BASE funding for regular renewal and replacement (extra-ordinary repair formula funding). Equity differentials in funding levels among campuses would also need to be addressed, as well as campus differences in special assessments. (The already-approved SBHE operating budget request included: \$4.4 million base funding increase for extraordinary repairs, distributed equitably to campuses based on statewide formula; and, \$4.3 million in one-time funding for special assessment pay-off.)
- 2.) A. Prioritized systemwide list of major capital projects (major renovation and/or new construction); (list attached-Attachment 1)
 - B. A new pool of funds to be allocated to earmarked (or non earmarked) projects at each campus. (none recommended)
- 3.) Prioritized list of individual campus small-to-medium size projects (list attached-Attachment 2). These are projects that: are \$250,000 or less at BSC, LRSC, WSC, MaSU, VCSU, DCB; \$500,000 or less at MiSU and NDSCS; and, \$1,000,000 or less at UND and NDSU.
- 4.) SBHE discretionary fund to address capital emergencies (The already-approved SBHE operating budget request includes \$2.5 million one-time funding request.)

SBHE policy 902.1 states:

"The Board shall approve a rank order list of funding requests for major capital projects from all fund sources listed in categories defined in subparagraphs a and b.

- a. (1) Major renovations to existing facilities.
 - (2) Major renovations to existing infrastructure, including technology upgrading.

- b. New construction and additions to existing facilities, including the cost of renovating existing facilities that are made necessary by an addition or new construction.
- 1. Major capital project priorities shall be consistent with the following categories, which are listed in order of priority (except that a and b have equal priority):
 - a. Projects to meet life, health and safety requirements.
 - b. Projects that are necessary to comply with local, state, or federal law or requirements.
 - c. Projects that preserve current assets.
 - d. Projects that represent new strategic investments through the enhancement of current assets or the creation of new assets.
- The Board shall use the following criteria to determine a rank order of projects listed. These
 criteria are not weighted, but shall be considered in their totality when determining rank order of
 priorities.
 - a. Project addresses current life, health and safety issues.
 - b. Project addresses compliance with local, state or federal law or requirements.
 - c. Project corrects significant deferred maintenance.
 - d. Project addresses a critical maintenance need defined by those which must be addressed, and which, if neglected, could result in substantial damage to the structural integrity of the building.
 - e. Project meets a compelling programmatic or accreditation justification consistent with campus mission and strategic goals.
 - f. Project has been partially funded by the legislature in a previous biennium, but is not yet complete.
 - g. Project is supported by significant outside funding.
 - Space will be used to advance a specific program or activity that is a high priority of the state.
 - i. Project addresses an urgent infrastructure need.
 - j. Project is consistent with campus master plan and is highly rated by the campus.
 - k. Project is necessary based on clearly demonstrated condition of existing space.
 - I. Project fosters the consolidation of services or enhances operating efficiencies.
 - m. Project enables the institution to remove obsolete or unnecessary facilities."

Attachment (1) is my recommended rank-ordered major capital project priority list for the 11-13 biennium. Different from past practice, Section 1 includes three categories of state-funded projects: 1.) campus; 2.) university system; and, 3.) energy related projects. In addition, sections 3, 4, 5, and 6 include separate rank ordered state-funded projects for the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences (SOMHS), NDSU Experiment Stations, NDSU Extension Service and the Forest Service. Also, Section 2 includes non-state funded projects for inclusion in the 11-13 budget request. If legislatively authorized, each of these projects will require additional information and analysis prior to SBHE authorization to proceed, closer to actual construction timeframes.

Campuses presented information to the SBHE on most of these projects at the April, 2010 meeting. Thereafter, you received via email a large-packet of background material on each project from Ms. Glatt.

The SBHE will be asked to approve projects for inclusion in the 11-13 budget request at your June 17th meeting. As an alternate meeting date of June 24th has also been set aside in the event the SBHE is not able to reach a conclusion on June 17th. Projects for inclusion in the 11-13 budget request need to be finalized in June, so that budgets can be submitted to OMB on a timely basis in July.

Proposed motion: Approve recommended major ranked capital project priority list as outlined on Attachment (1) and approve small-to-medium size capital project priorities, by campus, as outlined on Attachment (2).
