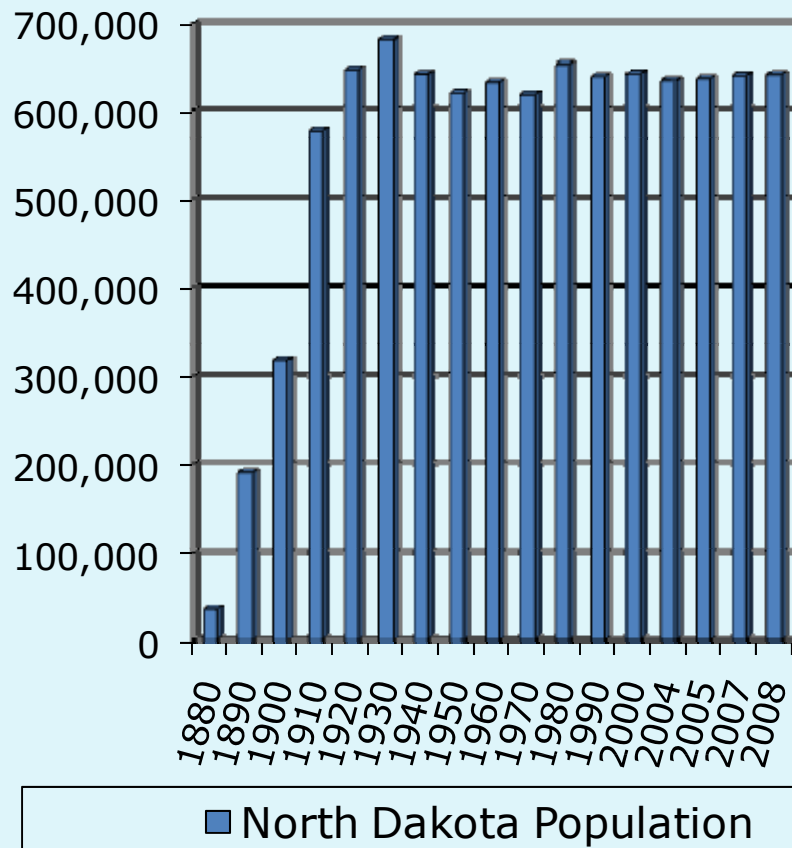

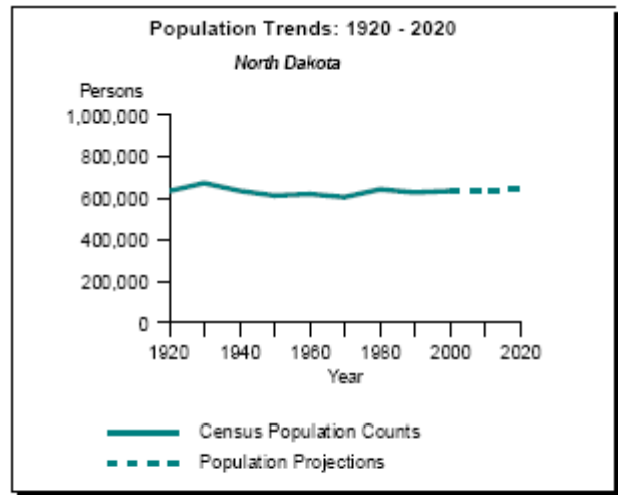

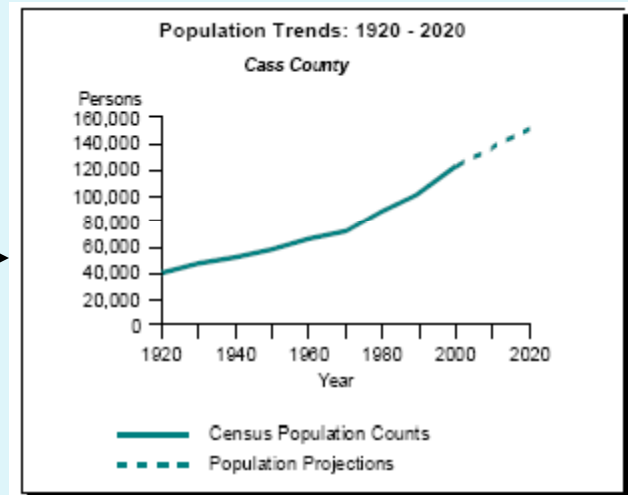

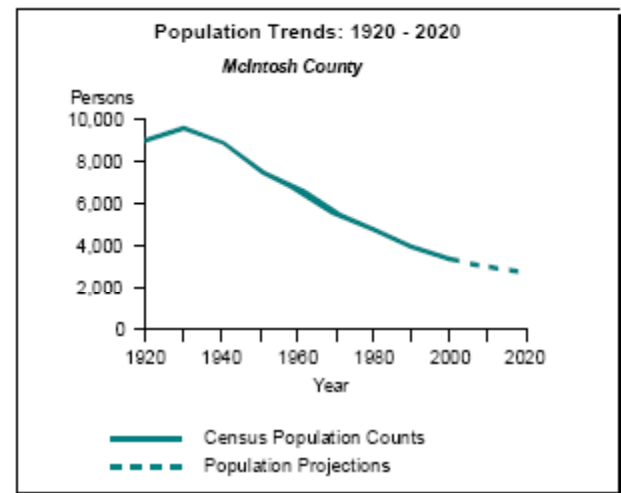

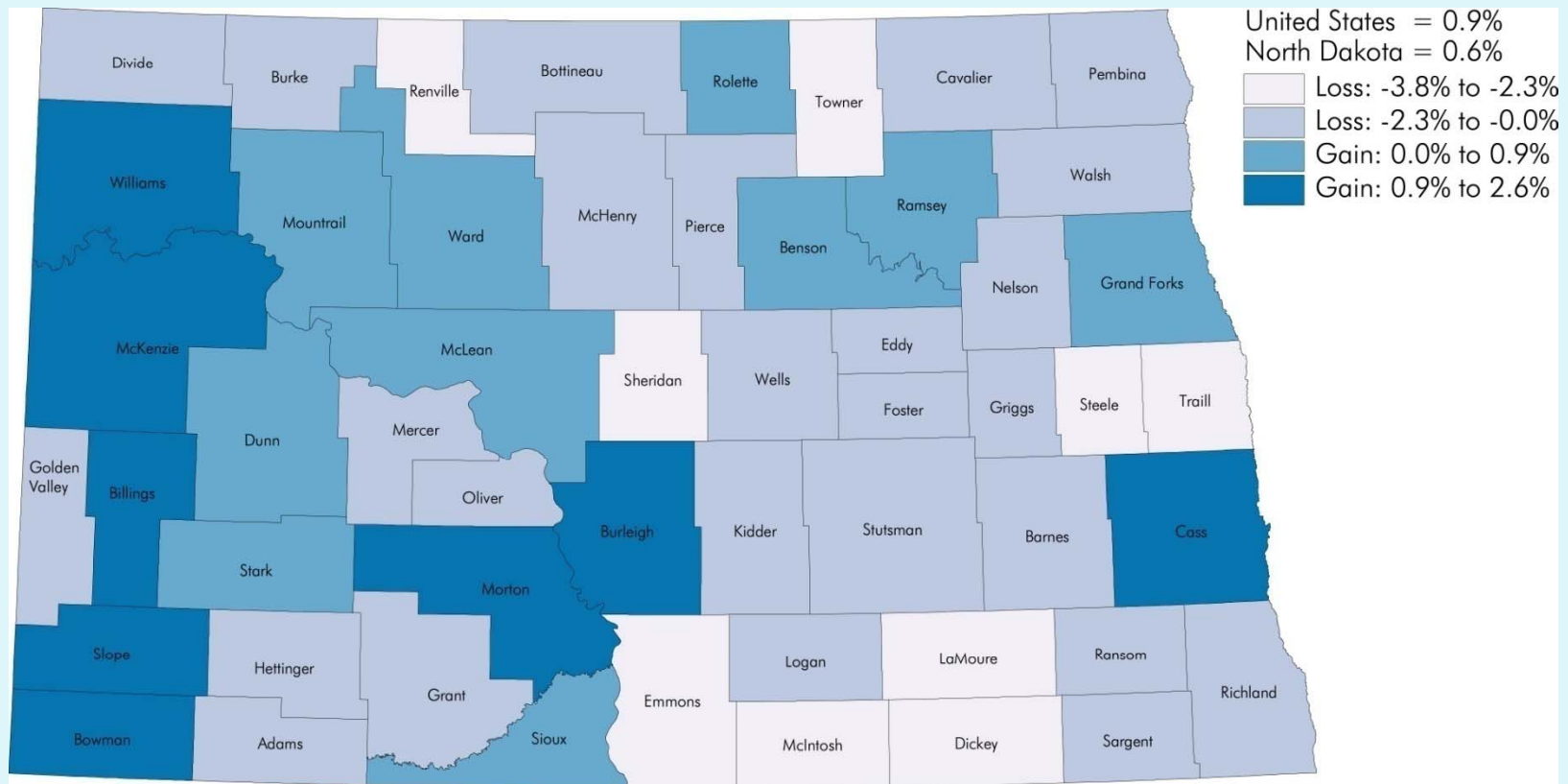

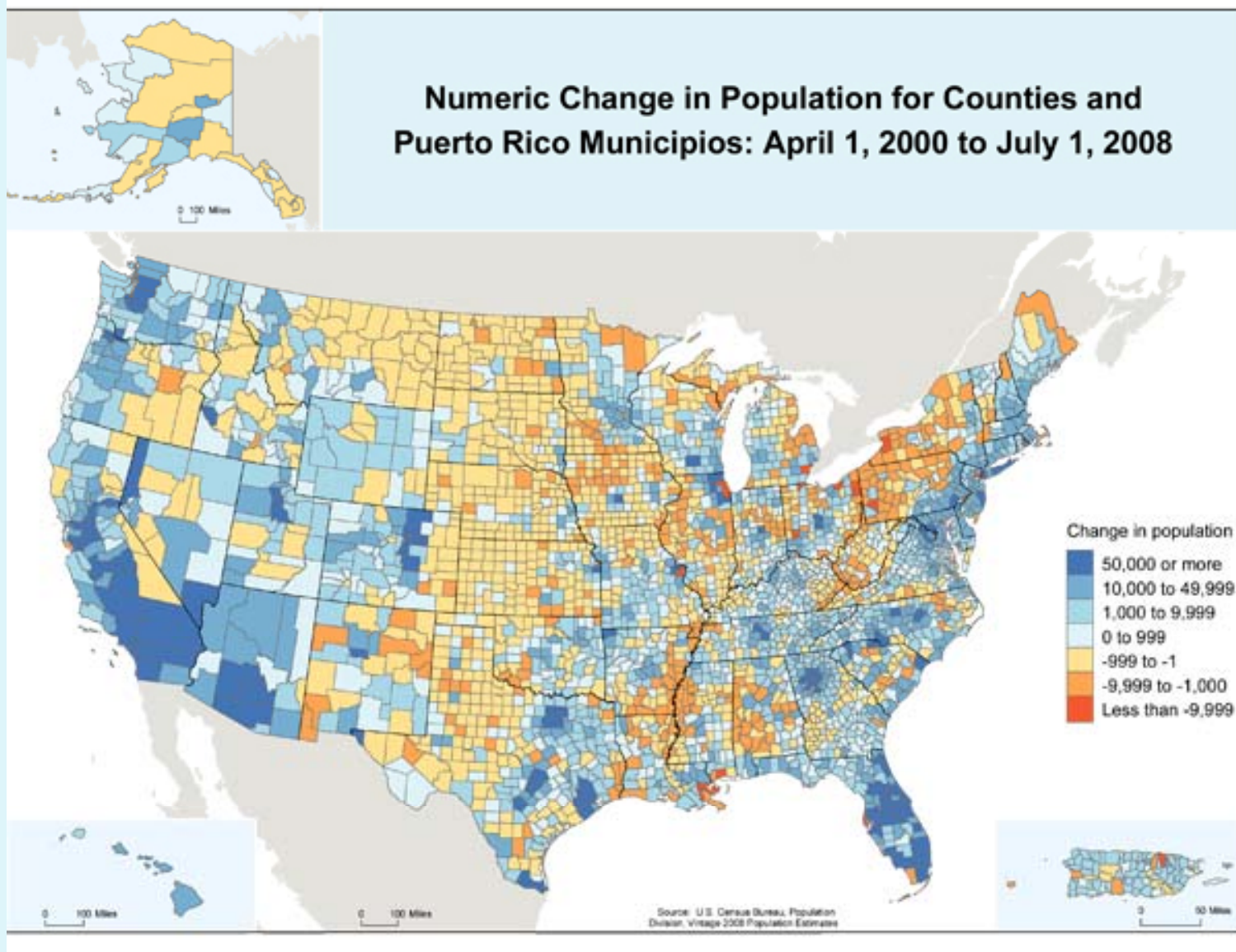
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Percent Change in Total Population Estimates for North Dakota by County: July 1, 2007 to July 1, 2008



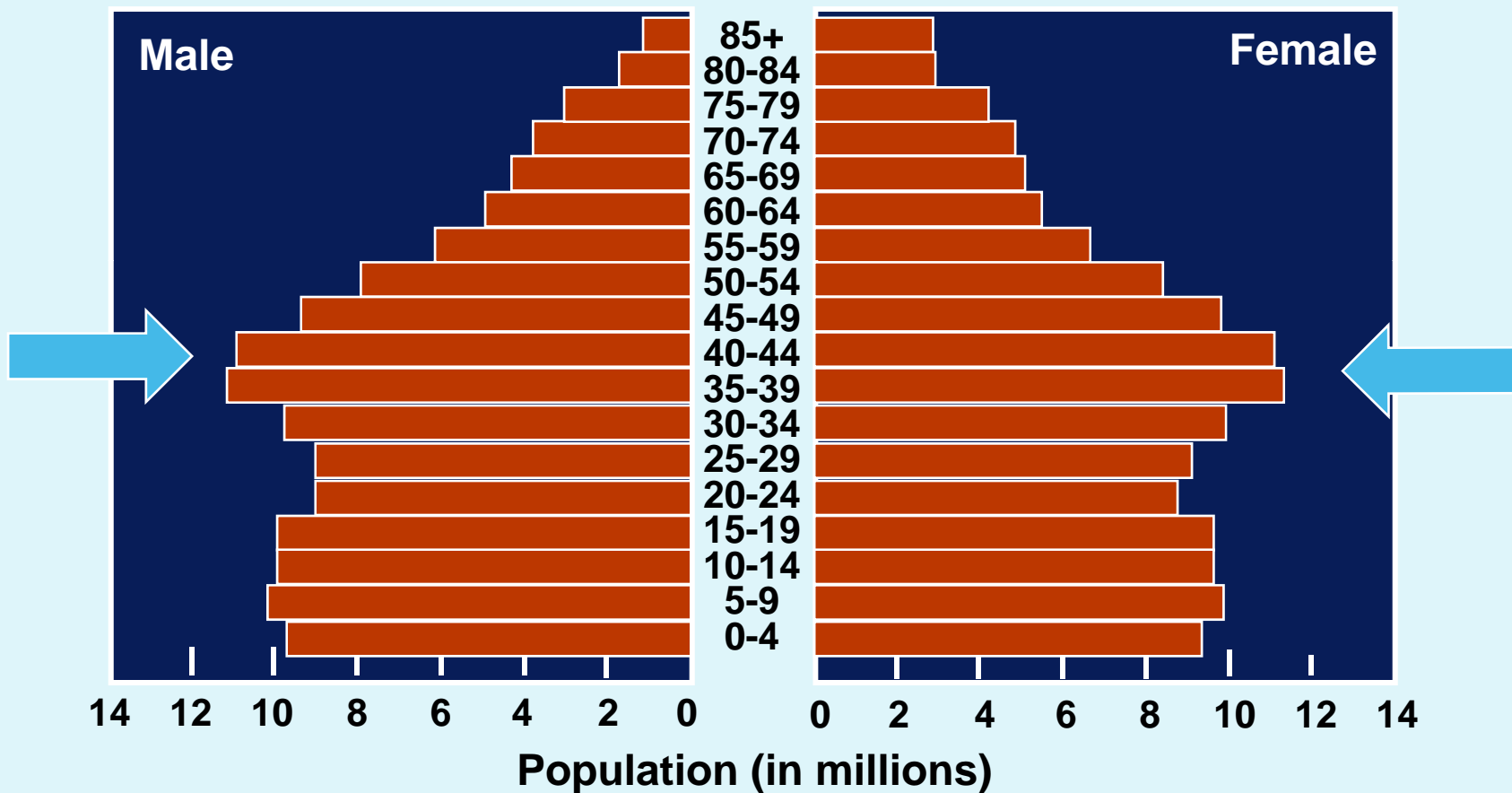
Numeric Change in Population for Counties and Puerto Rico Municipios: April 1, 2000 to July 1, 2008



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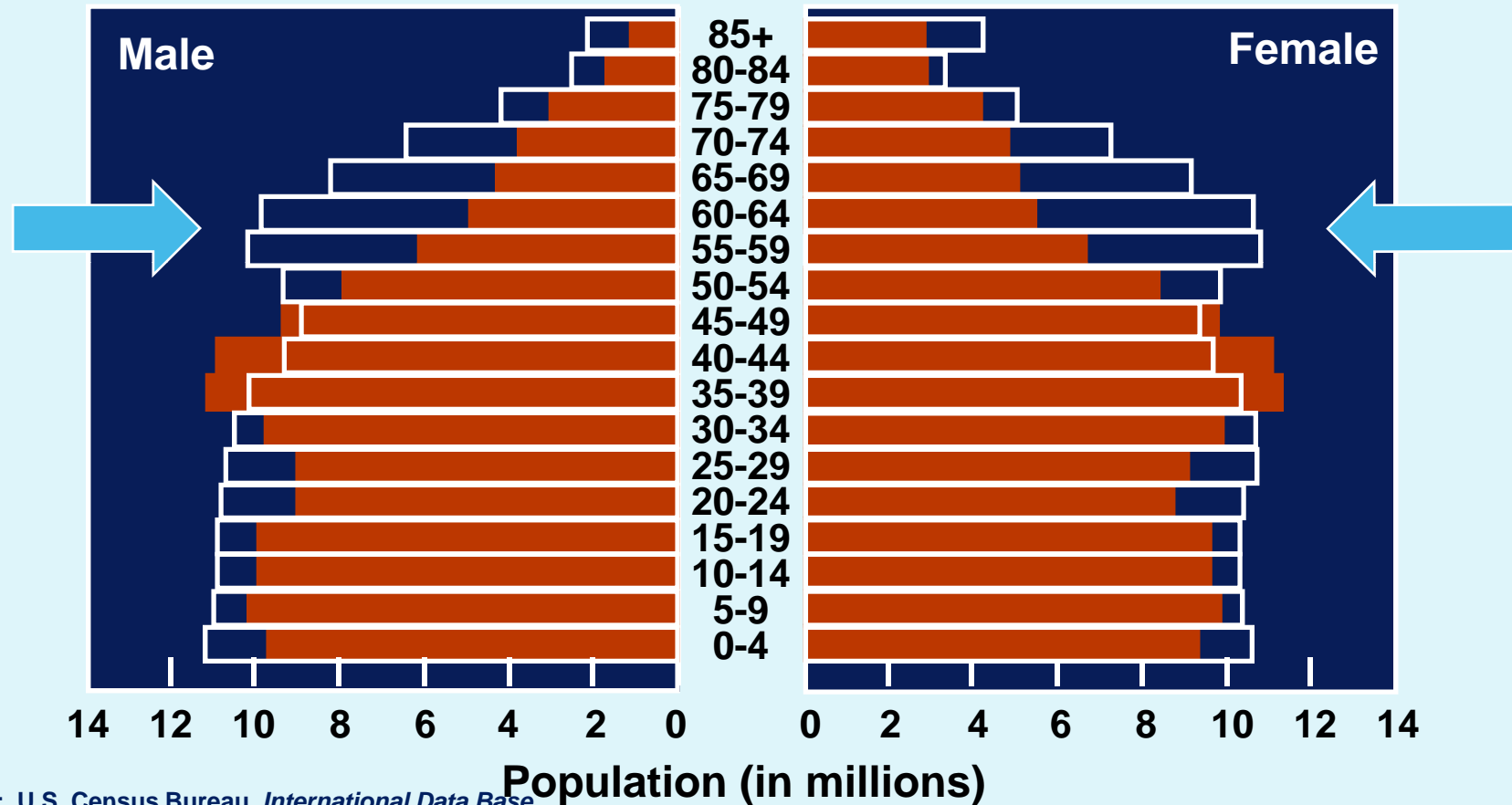
A Maturing Age Distribution, 2000

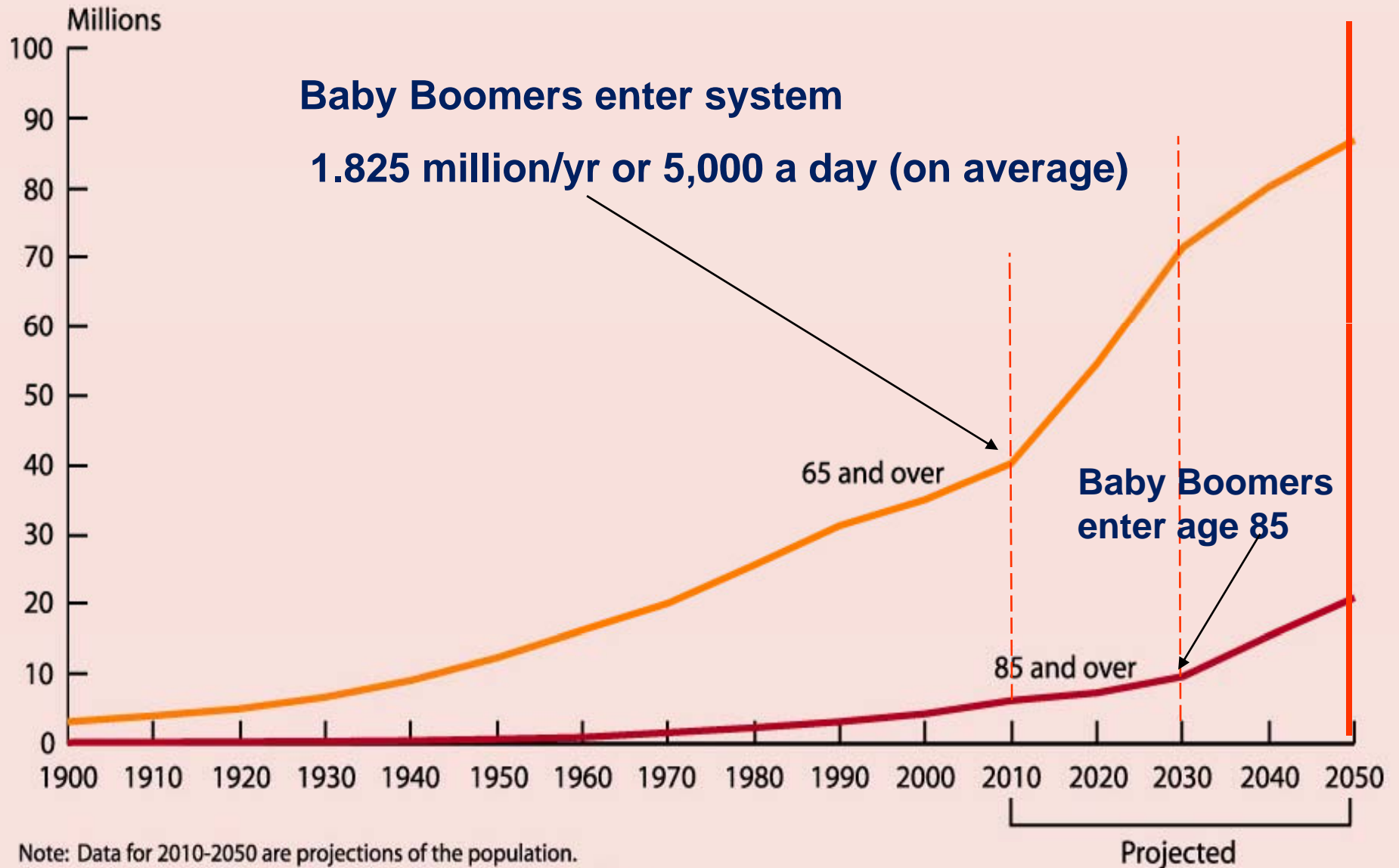

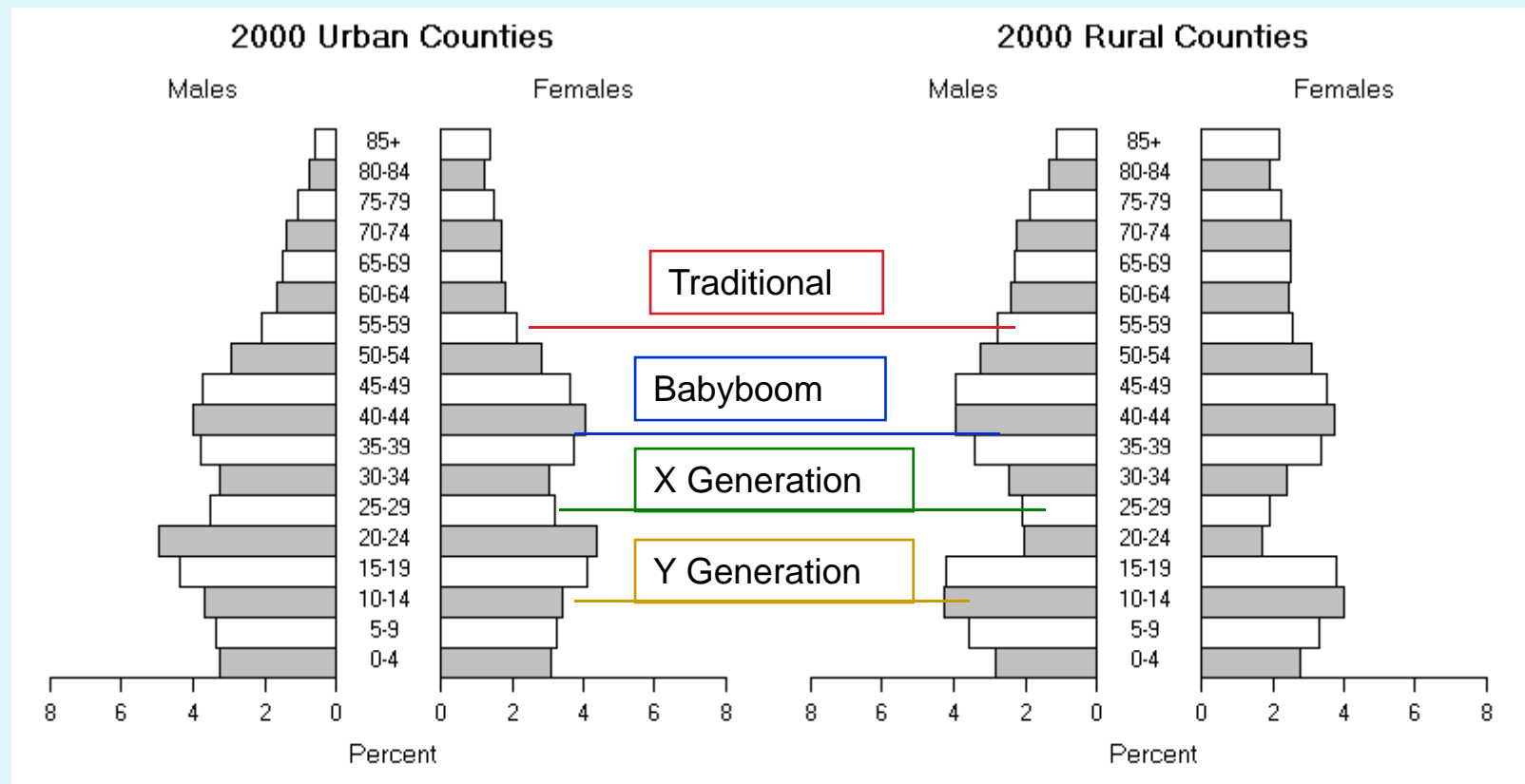
Number of people age 65 and over, by age group, selected years 1900-2000 and projected 2010-2050

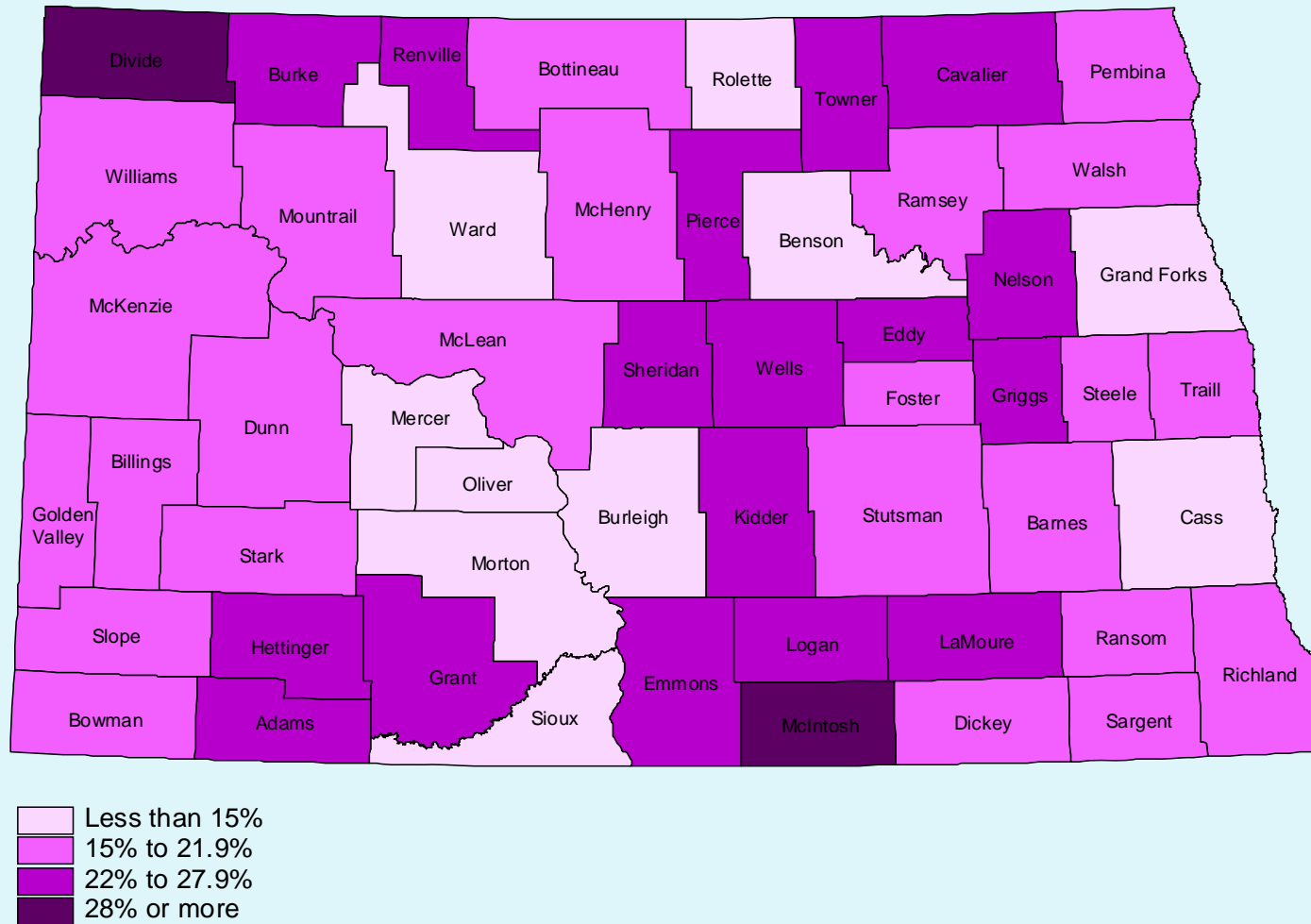

Persons Ages 65 and Older as a Percent of the Total Population in North Dakota by County: 2000

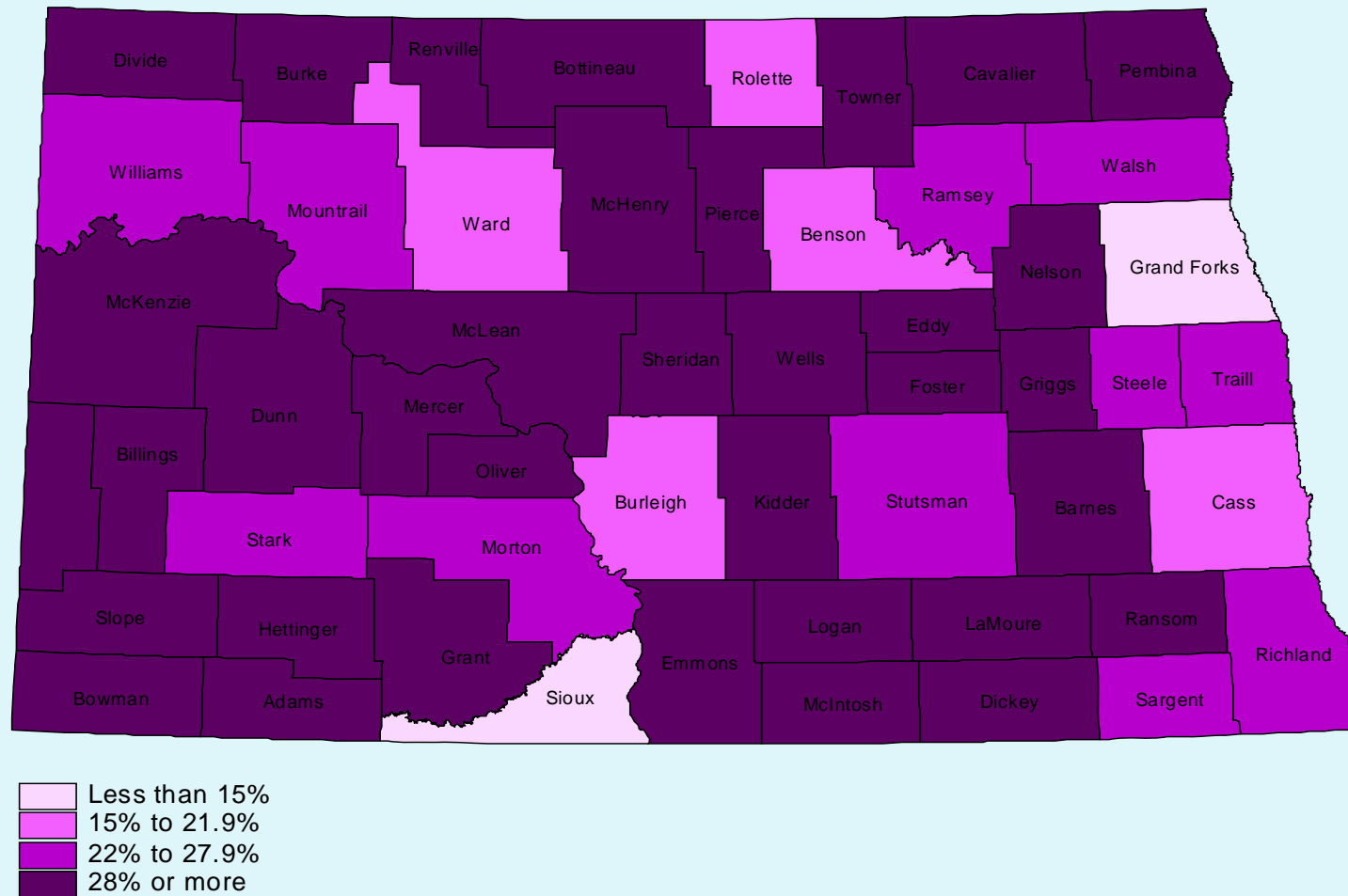

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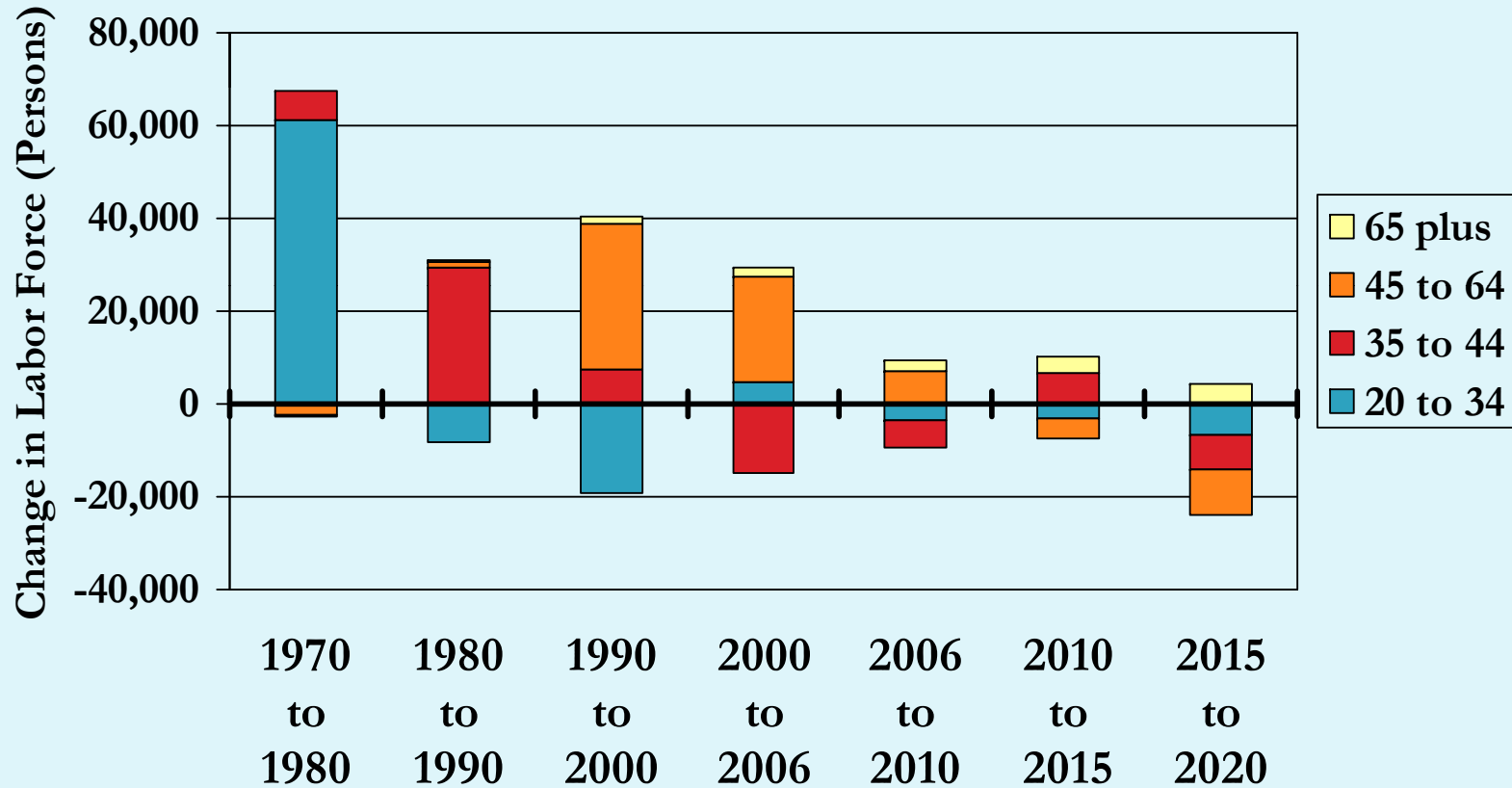

Change in North Dakota's Labor Force by Age: 1970 to 2020

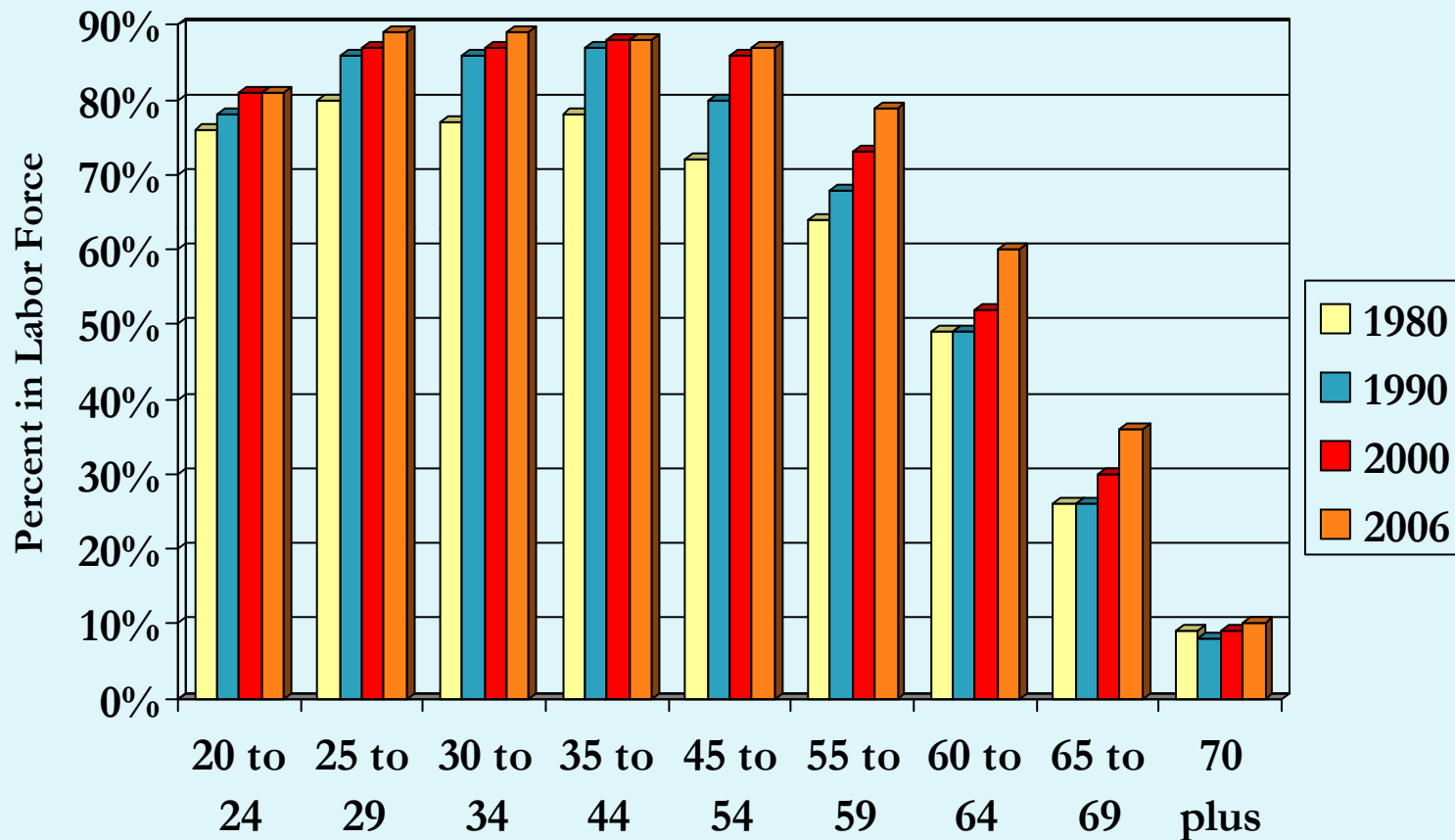

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North Dakota's Labor Force Participation Rates by Age: 1980 to 2006

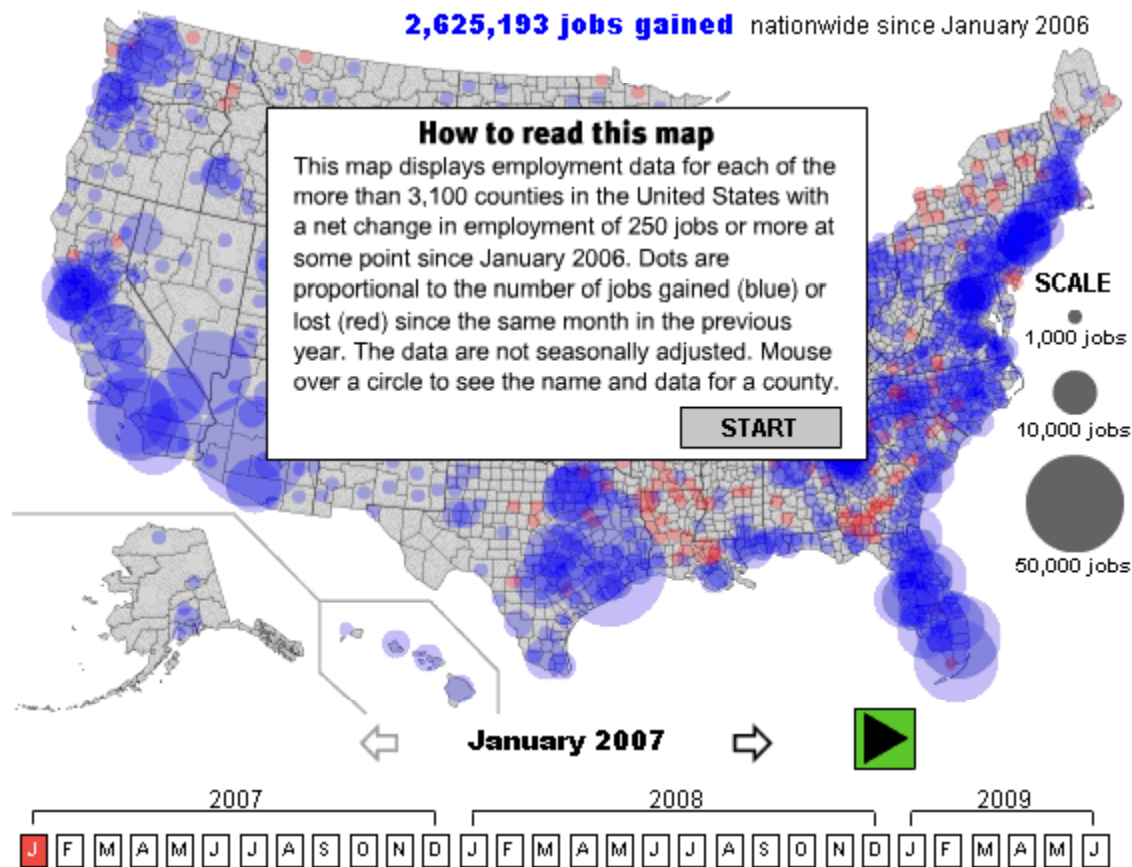

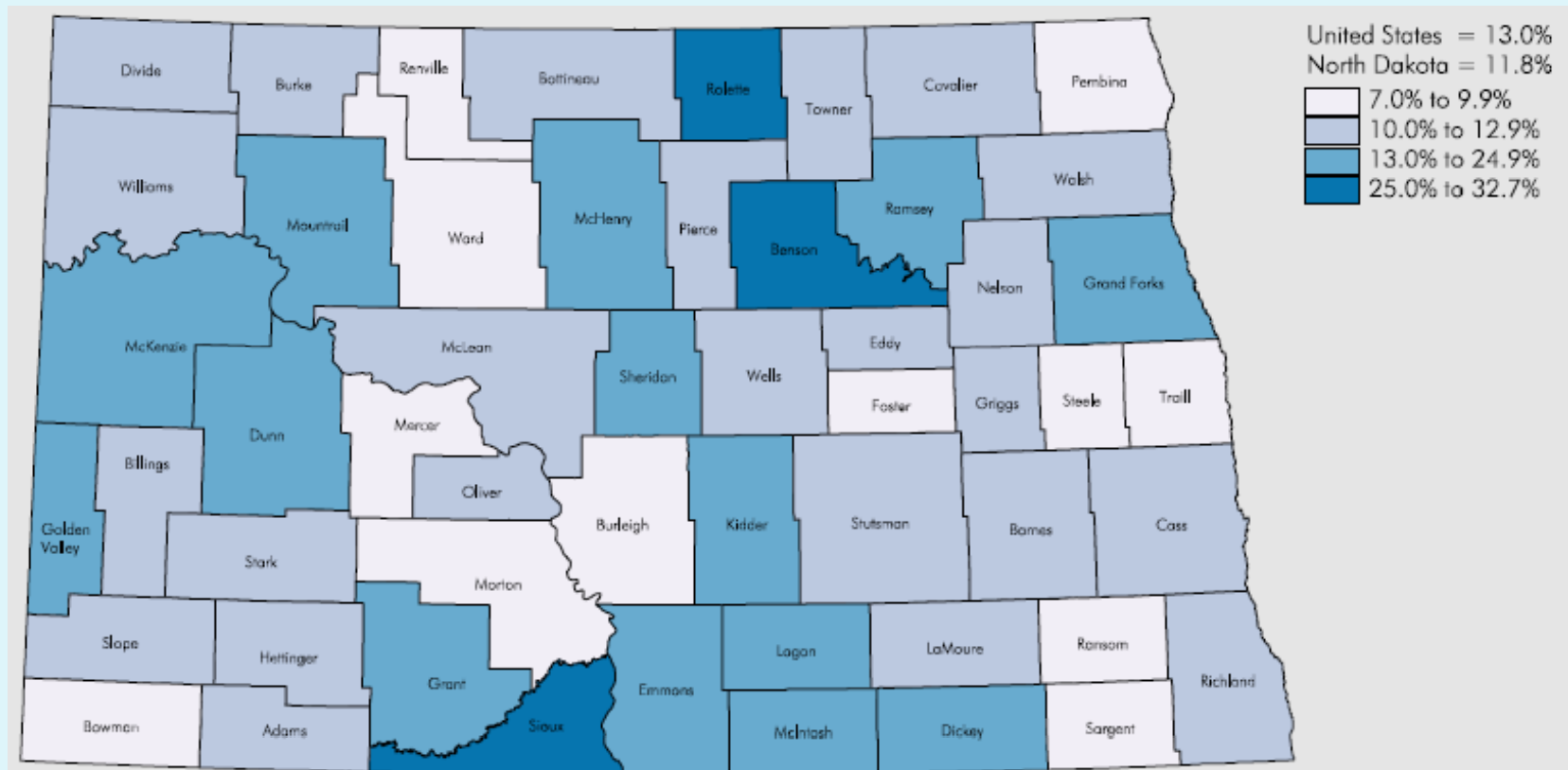

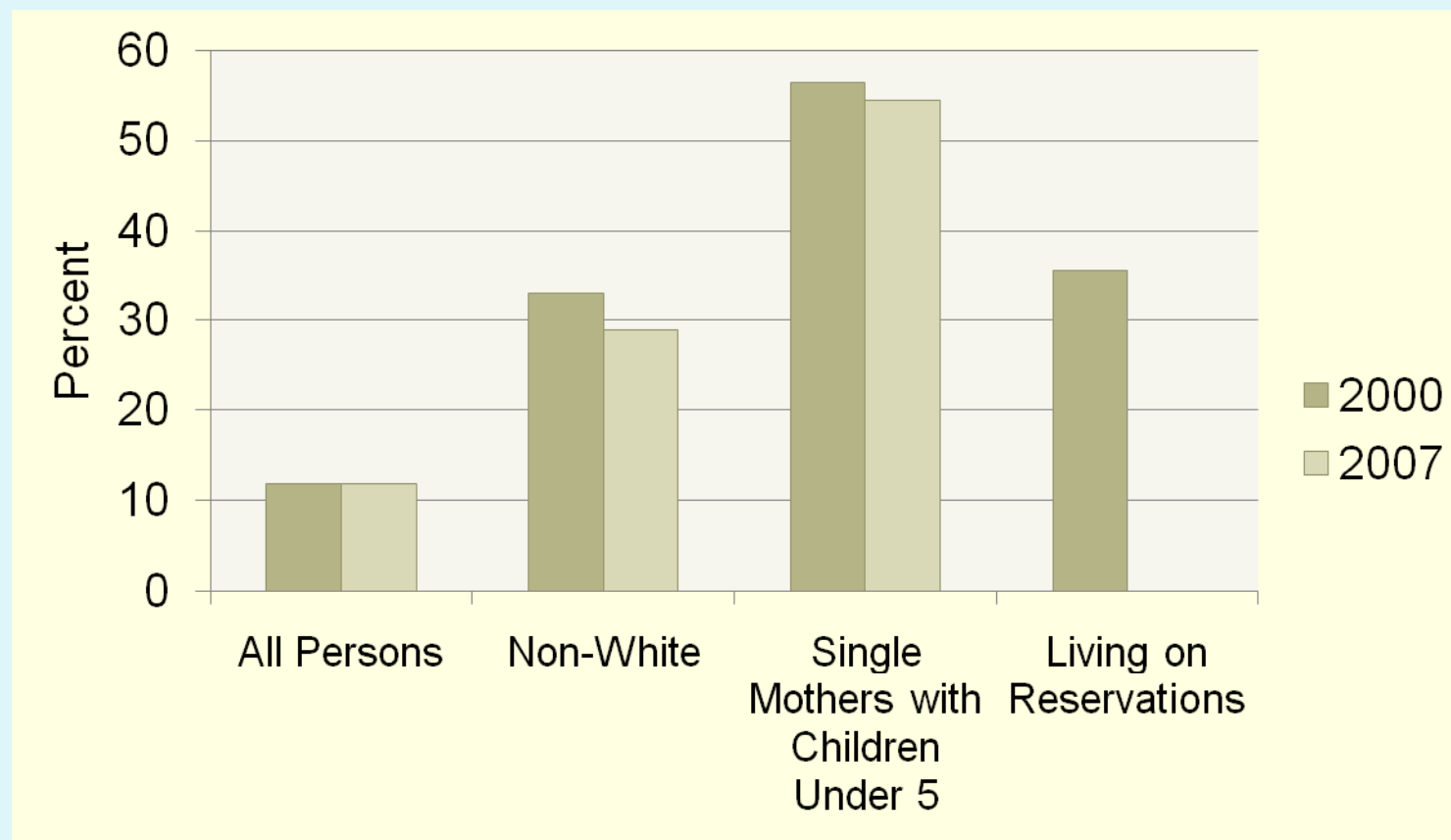
Percent of Persons Living in Poverty in North Dakota Counties, 2007

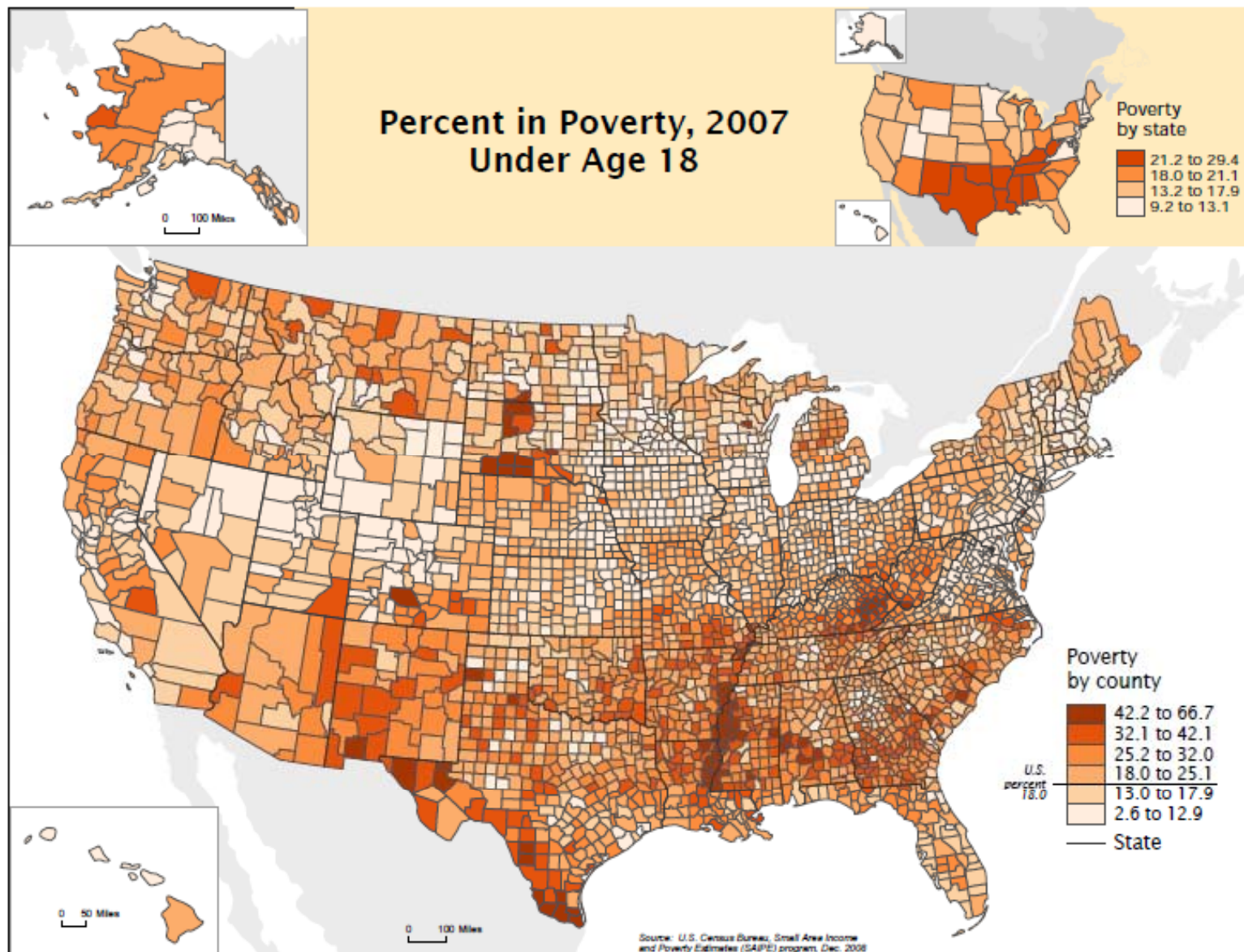

North Dakota Poverty Rates by Characteristic: 2000 and 2007

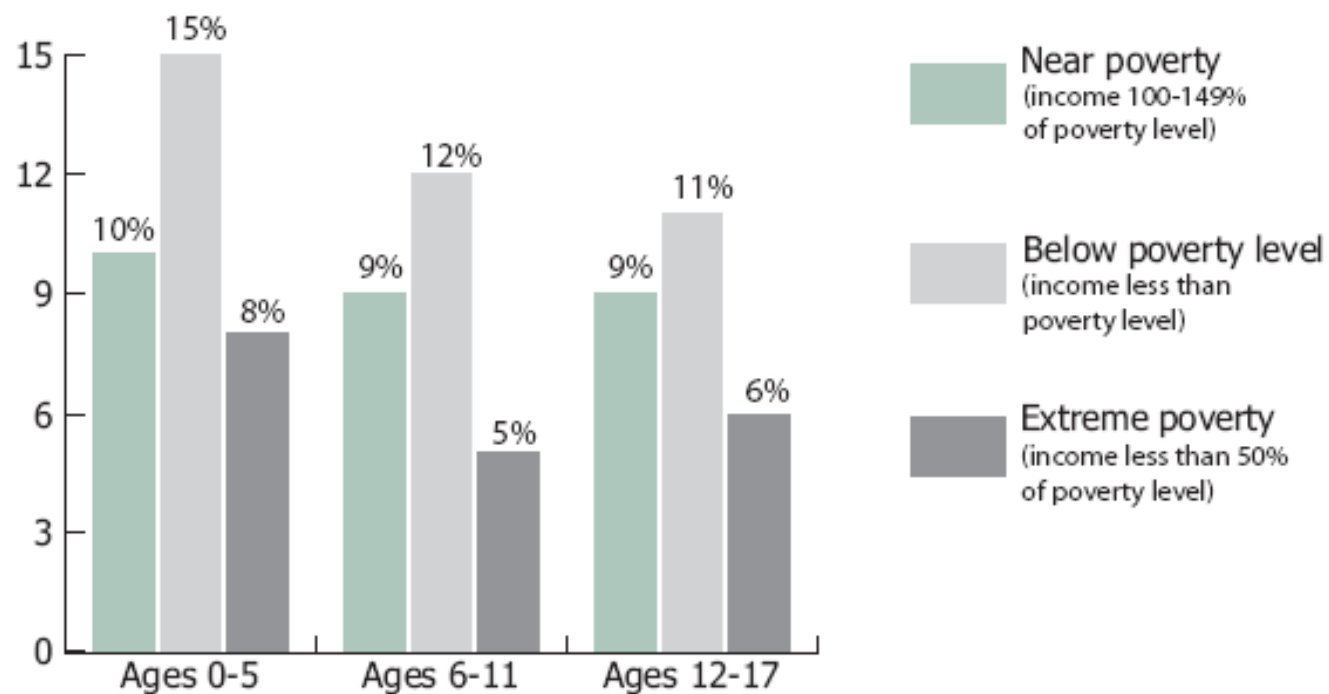

Figure 18. Poverty Status in North Dakota by Age of Child, 2006

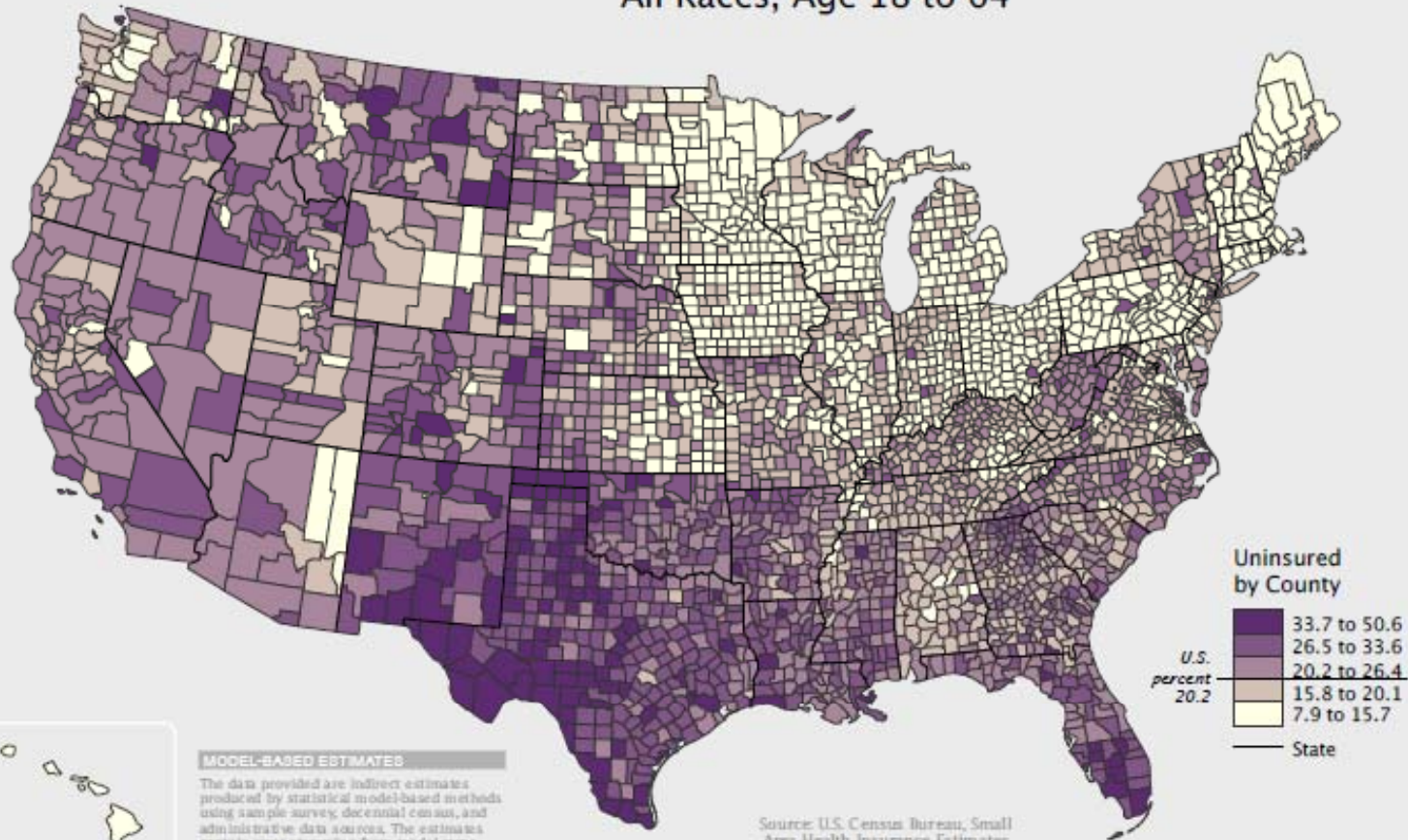


HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE ESTIMATES

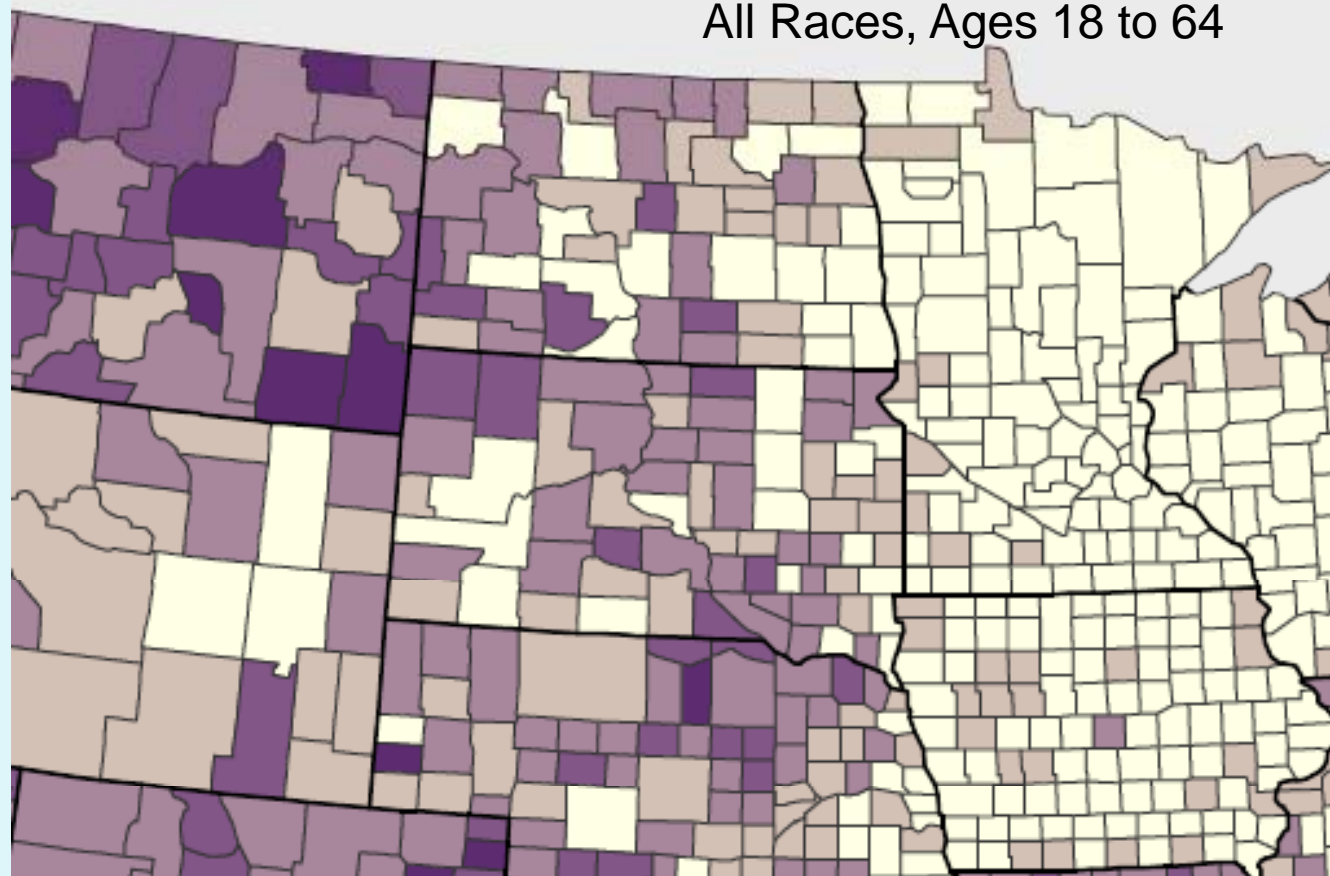

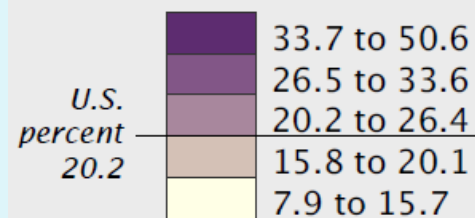

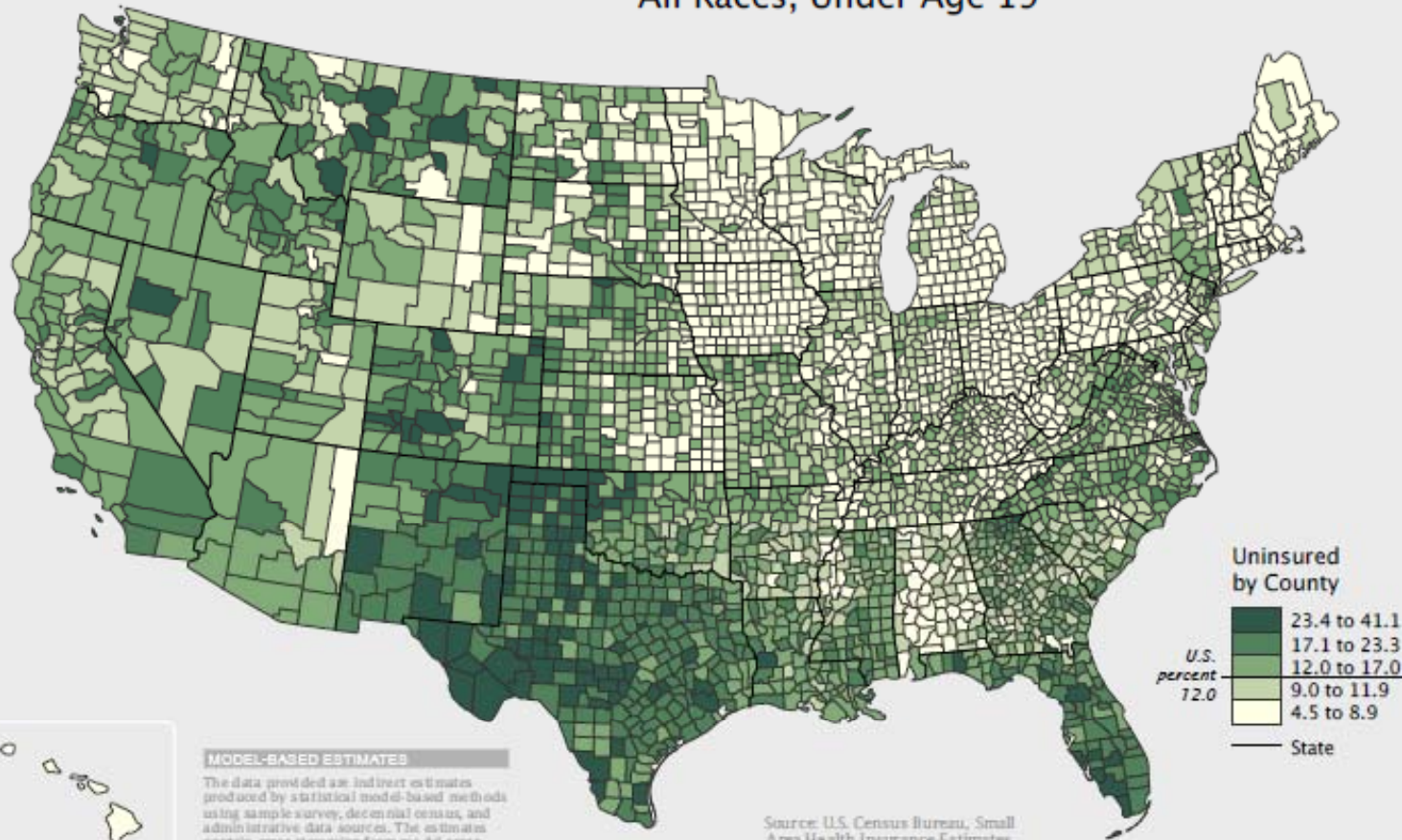

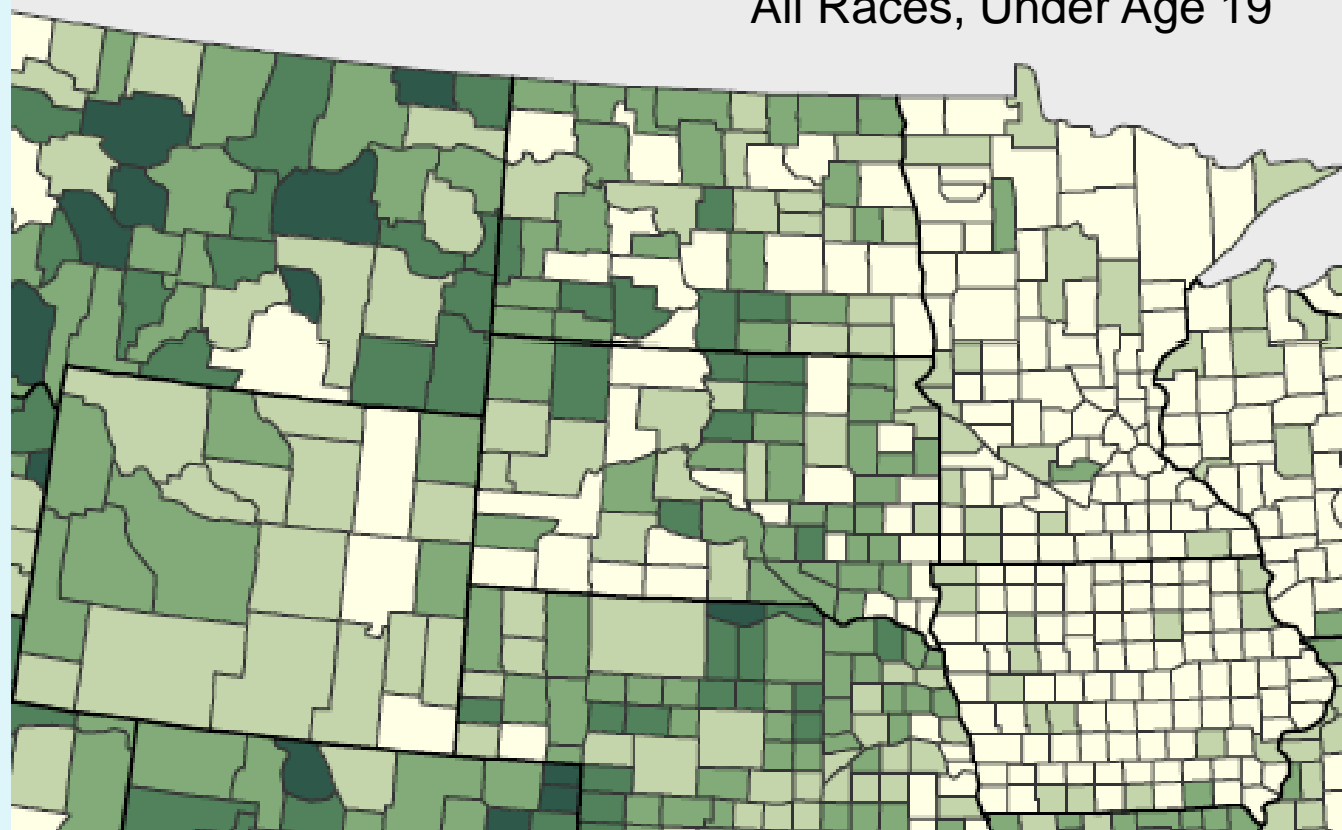

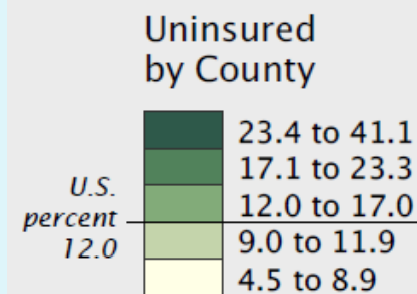
Insurance Coverage Estimates

All Races, Under Age 19



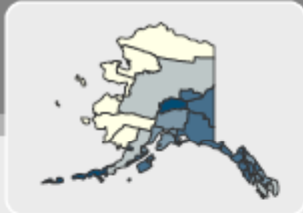

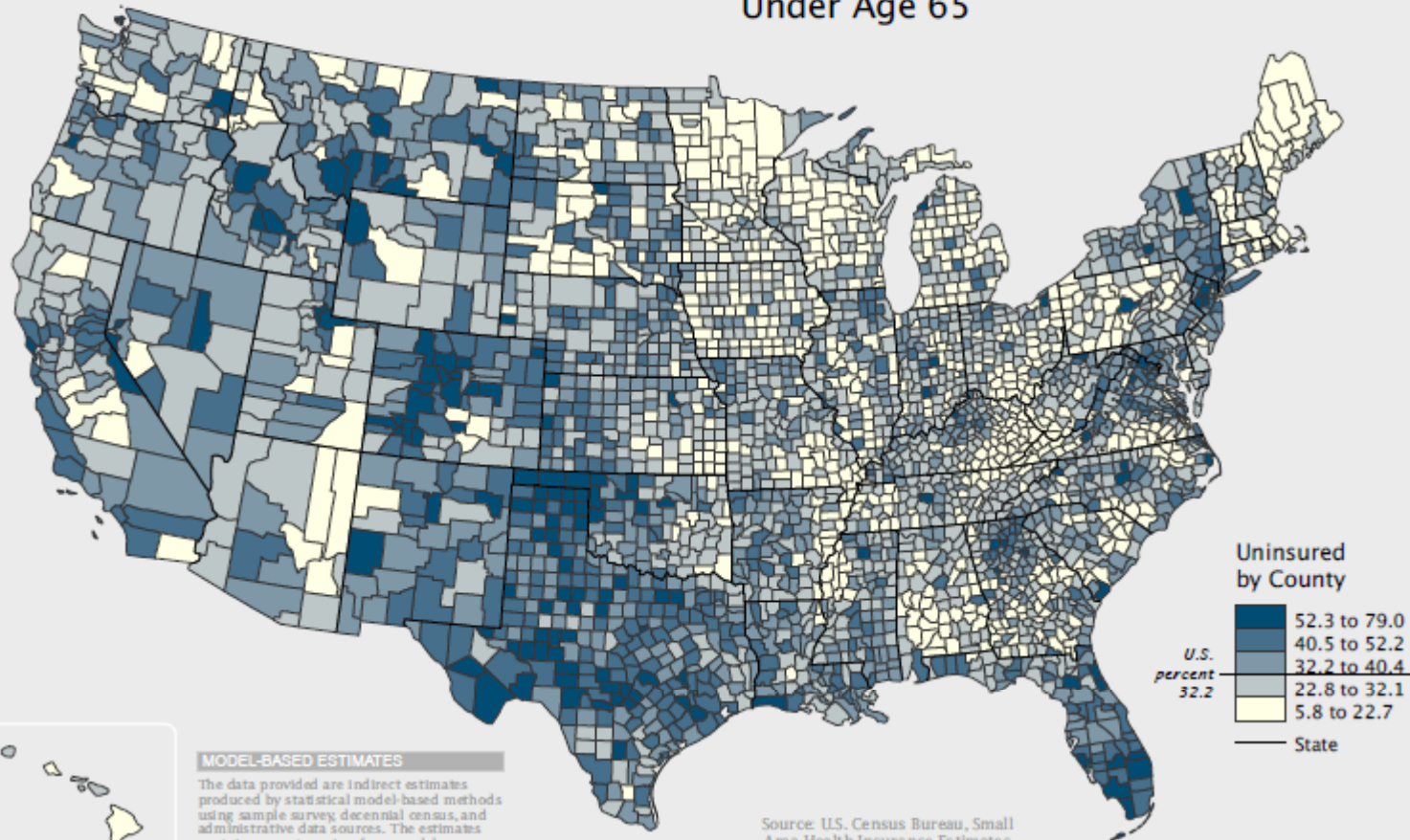
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HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE ESTIMATES

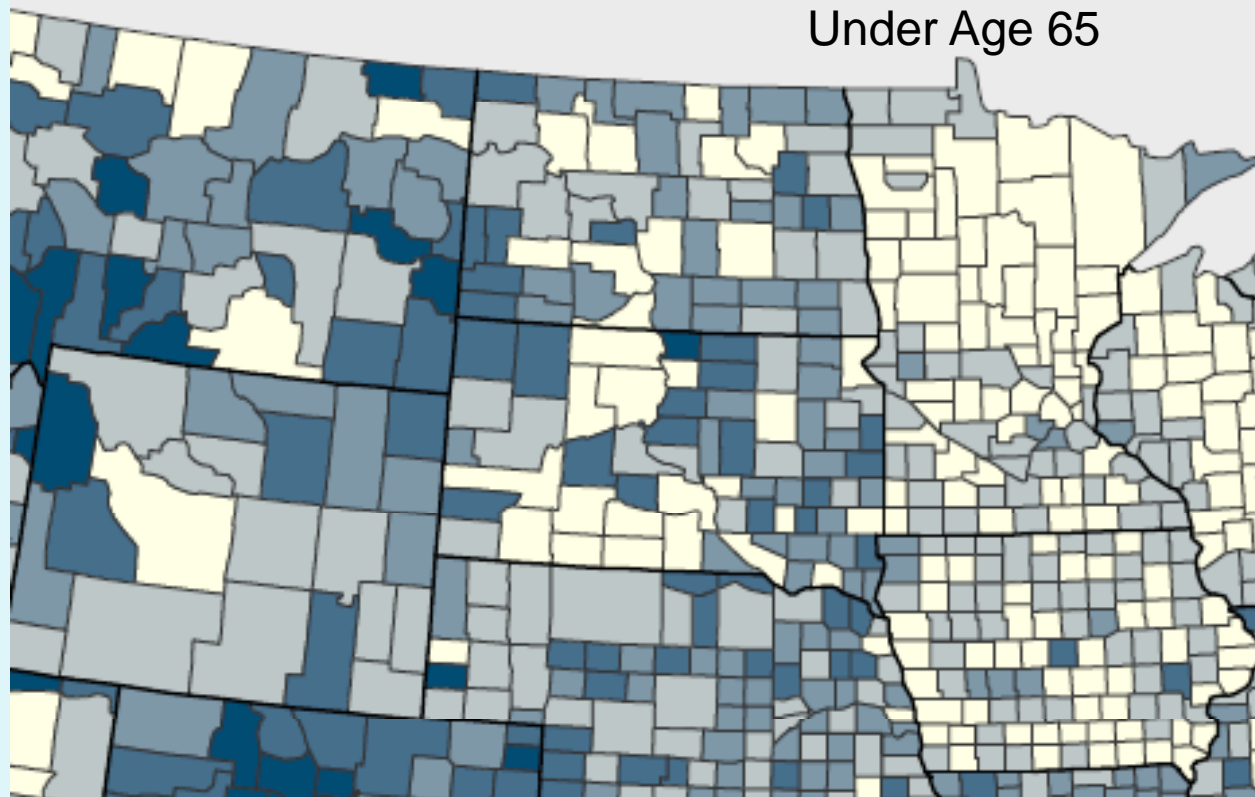

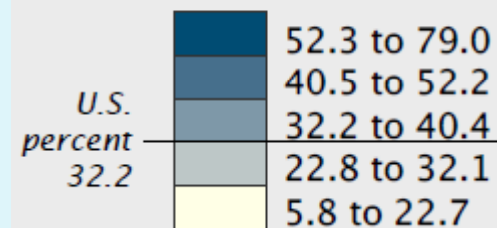
Insurance Coverage Estimates
