




## Percent Change in Total Population Estimates for North Dakota by County: July 1, 2007 to July 1, 2008








#### Numeric Change in Population for Counties and Puerto Rico Municipios: April 1, 2000 to July 1, 2008





## A Maturing Age Distribution, 2000











## 2000 Census – Rural and Urban Population Distributions by Age and Gender for North Dakota









#### Persons Ages 65 and Older as a Percent of the Total Population in North Dakota by County: 2020



# Change in North Dakota's Labor Force by Age: 1970 to 2020







#### North Dakota's Labor Force Participation Rates by Age: 1980 to 2006







#### Change in Jobs between January 2007 and June 2009





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#### Percent of Persons Living in Poverty in North Dakota Counties, 2007





North Dakota Poverty Rates by Characteristic: 2000 and 2007













Children ages 0-5 have the highest poverty rates in North Dakota, including the highest rates of **extreme poverty**.

Figure 18. Poverty Status in North Dakota by Age of Child, 2006












## Insurance Coverage Estimates Percent Uninsured, 2006
