- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 4-27-02, 4-27-03, 4-27-04, 4-27-05, 4-27-06,
- 2 4-27-07, 4-27-08, and 4-27-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota
- 3 dairy promotion commission; to repeal sections 4-27-01, 4-27-09, and 4-27-11 of the North
- 4 Dakota Century Code, relating to the titling of the chapter, the payment of expenses, and the
- 5 submission of a biennial report; to provide a penalty; and to provide an appropriation.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-27-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **4-27-02. Purposes.** The purposes of this chapter are:
- 10 To promote the sale and disposal of North Dakota dairy products through 11 coordinated research, education, public relations, advertising, and other means.
  - 2. To help assure the future operation of processing plants located in our cities and towns employing thousands of people.
    - 3. To maintain dairy markets, particularly for the family-type farms, thus enabling more families to live on our farms.
    - To provide for a referendum vote among dairy farmers to determine whether they favor the assessment provided for in section 4-27-06.
  - To provide for the keeping of records, inspection thereof of records, and penalties for violation of this chapter.

**NOTE:** Sections articulating the purpose of a chapter amount to testimony and have an appropriate place in the legislative record. They do not need to be a part of the statute. In this case, most of what is set forth as a "purpose" is provided for in other sections of the chapter. However, this is not the case with respect to subsection 4. The committee is asked to determine whether a referendum vote is to be an option, in light of federal legislation, and whether its parameters and consequences should be statutorily articulated.

1	<b>SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.</b> Section 4-27-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	4-27-03. Definitions. As used in this chapter:
4	<ol> <li>"Commission" means the North Dakota dairy promotion commission.</li> </ol>
5	2. The term "dealer" "Dealer" means and includes any person who handles, ships,
6	buys, or sells dairy products, or who acts as sales or purchasing agent, broker, or
7	factor of dairy products.
	<b>NOTE:</b> The use of the word "means" in a definition indicates exclusivity. The use of the word "includes" in a definition indicates no exclusivity. Which word is to be used in this subsection?
8	3. The term "gross receipts" "Gross receipts" means that the amount paid to a
9	producer for milk or some product therefrom sold by such producer.
	NOTE: Is this definition necessary?
10	4. The terms "handle" or "handler" mean or indicate any person who purchases milk
11	or cream for processing, manufacturing, sale, or distribution, whether as owner,
12	agent, employee, or otherwise.
	<b>NOTE:</b> Neither the term "handle" nor the term "handler" are used in this chapter and therefore do not need to be defined.
13	5. The term "person" includes individuals, corporations, limited liability companies,
14	partnerships, trusts, associations, cooperatives, and any and all other business
15	units, devices, and arrangements.
	<b>NOTE:</b> NDCC Section 1-01-49 already defines a person as a human being, foreign or domestic association, business trust, corporation, enterprise, estate, joint venture, limited liability company, limited liability partnership, limited partnership, partnership, trust, any legal or commercial entity, government, political subdivision, or government agency or instrumentality. For this reason, it is not necessary to include the definition in this chapter.

- The commission shall do all things necessary and proper to enforce and administer
   and enforce the provisions of this chapter and has and may exercise any and all of
   the powers conferred upon it herein.
  - <u>2.</u> A majority of the <u>voting</u> members of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business <del>and the carrying out of the duties of the commission</del>.

**NOTE:** NDCC Section 1-01-10 provides that a "majority of any board or commission" constitutes a quorum. However, if nonvoting members are on the board or commission, it is necessary to clarify that they are not part of the quorum requirement.

2. 3. The commission <u>annually</u> shall elect <u>its officers</u>, <u>including</u> a chairman, vice chairman, <u>and a secretary-treasurer</u>, <del>and such other officers as may be deemed advisable</del> and adopt <del>such</del> rules, <u>regulations</u>, <u>recommendations</u>, <u>and orders</u> for the exercise of its powers and performance of its duties <del>as is deemed advisable</del>.

**NOTE:** Is the chairman to have any particular authority? Is the chairman to call meetings of the commission? Is there any need to provide for special meetings? In the absence of any other directive, the rewrite provides that the chairman must be elected annually.

3. 4. The commission shall determine the amount of compensation payable to each member of the commission. The amount payable may not exceed Each member of the council is entitled to receive compensation, in the amount established by the council, but not exceeding seventy-five dollars per day plus reimbursement of for expenses as provided by law for state officers, while if the member is attending meetings or performing duties directed by the commission. The compensation provided for in this section may not be paid to any member of the council who receives a salary or other compensation as an employee or official of this state.

**NOTE:** The rewrite clarifies that members who are state employees or officials may not receive payment by the commission in addition to their regular salaries.

- 4. <u>5.</u> The commission shall select a state manager, whose compensation must be fixed by the commission. The commission is also authorized to employ such additional personnel as are necessary, including an attorney, to fix their compensation and terms of employment, and to incur such expenses as the may employ and compensate necessary personnel.
  - 6. The commission may deem necessary and proper to carry out its duties, to be paid from expend moneys collected as herein provided under this chapter for its administration.

- 4. Any assessment imposed by this chapter and unpaid on by the date on which they are it is due and payable may be increased by is delinquent and the commission may assess a one-time penalty equal to one and one-half percent of the amount of the assessment.

**NOTE:** Representatives of the Midwest Dairy Association indicated that this is a one-time penalty.

3. 5. Any producer desiring a refund of such assessment shall personally make written application to the secretary-treasurer of the commission therefor. Such application must be made to the secretary-treasurer upon forms provided by the commission no later than thirty days from the time of any payment made to a producer. Upon request, refunds must be made by the secretary-treasurer on a monthly basis.

NOTE: Given the provisions in federal law, should there be any reference to a refund?

**NOTE:** This section contains multiple topics which should be placed in separate sections.

**SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-27-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4-27-07. Dealers', processors', and producers' records. All dealers, processors, and producers Any person responsible for the collection and remittance of the assessment imposed by submission of assessments under this chapter shall keep a complete and accurate record of all milk gross receipts subject to the assessment by this chapter. These records must contain such information as the commission prescribes, must be preserved be retained for a period of two years from the date of the transaction, and are subject to inspection by authorized agents or employees of the commission.

**NOTE:** If the records must be retained for two years, the statute should indicate the date on which the calendar begins to run.

	<b>NOTE:</b> Although not delineated in current law, a representative of the Midwest Dairy Association indicated that the record or form required by this section should be retained for a period of two years.						
19	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-27-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
20	amended and reenacted as follows:						
21	4-27-12. Penalty. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this chapter is						
22	guilty of a class B misdemeanor.						
23	SECTION 9. REPEAL. Sections 4-27-01, 4-27-09, and 4-27-11 of the North Dakota						
24	Century Code are repealed.						
	NOTE:  NDCC Section 4-27-01 entitles the chapter the "North Dakota Dairy Promotion"						

- NDCC Section 4-27-01 entitles the chapter the "North Dakota Dairy Promotion Commission Act."
- NDCC Section 4-27-09 provides that the commission may not pay its expenses from any source other than the North Dakota Dairy Promotion Commission fund and that the expenses incurred by the commission may not exceed the amount available in the fund. See Section 54-44.1-09.

- Article X, Section 12, of the Constitution of North Dakota. All public moneys  $\dots$  shall be paid out and disbursed only pursuant to appropriation first made by the legislature  $\dots$
- NDCC Section 4-27-11 authorizes the commission to "submit a biennial report to the governor . . . in accordance with section 54-06-04." Section 54-06-04 does not require the dairy commission to submit a separate report. This section therefore appears to authorize a voluntary act and from that perspective is not necessary. The section also requires that the State Auditor perform a biennial audit. This requirement is already set forth in Section 54-10-01 (powers and duties of State Auditor) and does not need to be repeated in this chapter.
