- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 50-01.2-03.2 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the funding of economic assistance programs in counties with
- 3 federally recognized Indian reservation land.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 50-01.2-03.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the department shall reimburse county social service boards for expenses of locally administered economic assistance programs in counties in which more than twenty percent of the caseload for these programs consists of people who reside on a that contain federally recognized Indian reservation or property tax-exempt tribal trust lands. The reimbursement must be such that:
 - a. An affected county's expenses actual direct costs and indirect costs allocated based on a percentage of each county's direct economic assistance and social services for locally administered economic assistance programs in excess of the statewide average of such costs, expressed in mills, for all other counties will be reimbursed at one hundred percent the percentage of that county's average total food stamp caseload for the previous quarter which reside on federally recognized Indian reservation land;
 - b. Each calendar year the affected counties will receive quarterly allocations based on the actual county expenses direct and indirect costs, as provided in subdivision a, for the state fiscal year ending the previous June thirtieth and the most recent taxable valuations published pursuant to section 57-13-07 available on that date quarter; and

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1	C.	The reimbursement will be calculated for each county and reported made to
2		the county social service board prior to August first of the year preceding the
3		allocation within six weeks after the quarter for which the reimbursement is
4		<u>due</u> .
