## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-27-07.2 of the North Dakota Century Code 6 is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 15.1-27-07.2. Baseline funding - Determination - Minimum and maximum allowable increases.

- a. The Except as provided in subdivision b, the superintendent of public instruction shall determine each school district's baseline funding per weighted student unit by:
  - a. (1) Adding together all state aid received by the district during the 2006-07 school year;
  - b. (2) Subtracting the amount received by the district during the 2006-07 school year for transportation aid, special education excess cost reimbursements, special education contracts, prior year funding adjustments, and per student payments for participation in educational associations governed by joint powers agreements; and
  - e. (3) Dividing the amount determined under subdivision b paragraph 2 by the district's 2007-08 weighted student units.
  - b. If in carrying out subdivision a the superintendent of public instruction
    determines that the amount of federal impact aid received by a school district
    during the 2006-07 school year results in that district losing state aid under

2	district's share of any increased state aid for that year. Payments received by
3	districts for the provision of full-day kindergarten do not constitute increases in
4	state aid for purposes of this subdivision.
5	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
