**ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2212**

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-38-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,  
2 relating to English language learners; and to provide for grant applications.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-38-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **15.1-38-02. Program establishment.** The superintendent of public instruction shall:

- 7 1. Appoint a state advisory committee to assist with the establishment and  
8 administration of English language learner programs and the state English  
9 language proficiency assessment;
- 10 2. Establish standards for English language learner programs;
- 11 3. Establish student caseload criteria for English language learner teachers, deviation  
12 from which may not affect the accreditation or funding level of a school district;
- 13 4. Ensure that the English language learner programs use effective research-based  
14 methods to teach the students;
- 15 ~~4.~~ 5. Assist school districts with the development and administration of English  
16 language learner programs and services;
- 17 ~~5.~~ 6. Employ a program administrator and other necessary personnel; and
- 18 ~~6.~~ 7. Coordinate federal, state, and local funding to maximize the services available to  
19 students.

20 **SECTION 2. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION GRANTS.** Each regional  
21 education association in this state may apply to the superintendent for grants to purchase or  
22 otherwise acquire instructional materials for the enhancement of English language learner  
23 services to students in the association's participating districts and to provide professional

- 2 beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.
