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- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the development of a program for services to transition-aged youth at
- 3 risk; to provide for a pilot project; and to provide an appropriation.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## <u>Transition-aged youth at risk program - Definition - Rules.</u>

- 1. The department shall develop and implement or contract for the implementation of a program for services to transition-aged youth at risk. The department shall use a wraparound planning process. The department shall adopt rules to establish eligibility, services, and a distinct statewide interagency advisory council on transition-aged youth at risk, with youth and family representation, and with regional subcommittees. For the purposes of this section, transition-aged youth means children and young adults at risk due to:
  - <u>a.</u> Foster care, deprivation, or activity in the juvenile justice system;
  - <u>b.</u> Serious mental illness or serious disabilities that do not qualify the youth for developmental disabilities case management; or
    - c. Suicidal tendencies.
- 2. Within the limits of appropriations, services under the program must include:
- a. <u>Individualized assessments to determine the needs and appropriate services</u>
   to individual transition-aged youth at risk;
  - <u>b.</u> Single plan of care to coordinate services among available service systems,
     <u>emphasizing existing case management resources;</u>
    - c. Independent living skills, including self-advocacy training;

Enhanced or extended vocational rehabilitation, including transition from 2 education to employment and from secondary education to higher education; 3 In-home support, including mentors, individual and family training, and access <u>e.</u> 4 to respite care; and 5 <u>f.</u> Development of a statewide independent living skills curriculum for youth and 6 families. 7 3. Services to an individual youth must be appropriate to that individual and need not 8 include all services of the program. 9 SECTION 2. TRANSITION-AGED YOUTH AT RISK PILOT PROJECT. During the 2009-11 biennium, the department of human services shall develop and implement on a pilot 10 11 basis a program that provides those services listed in subsection 2 of section 1 of this Act. The 12 pilot program must be conducted at an accessible location in an urban community with a large 13 population of transition-aged youth at risk and must be open for various relevant community 14 service providers that provide those services in that community. 15 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 16 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$700,000, or so much 17 of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of 18 establishing and implementing a pilot program for transition-aged youth at risk as provided in 19 section 2 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.
