The information and data provided with this summary represents an overview regarding delivery of educational services to Indian students. A summary of each handout is provided here.

School Districts and Reservations

This map shows, in blue, the four major Indian Reservations including: 1) Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians, 2) Standing Rock Sioux Nation, 3) Three Affiliated Tribes and 4) Spirit Lake Nation. The Sisseton-Wahpeton Of the Lake Traverse Reservation, located in the south-east part of the state is also shown. School districts are outlined in gray. A detail map of each reservation shows public schools and districts that lie within or near reservation boundaries.

Schools With American Indian Student Enrollment

The 2008-2009 student enrollment numbers of schools that have Indian students enrolled are provided. Public, nonpublic and tribal schools are included. The name of the school, city total enrollment and individual student counts for Indian, white and other race categories are provided. There are approximately 93,900 students enrolled in 330 schools, with approximately 10,650 Indian students, 78,100 white students and about 5,000 students of other race. Schools with Indian students have enrollment numbers as small as one and as large as 679 in the Turtle Mountain Community Elementary School. Indian students

comprise about 10,650 or 11% of the total students enrolled in schools that have Indian students. White students make up about 83% of the total.

Students Served by Special Education Units – Child Count

The December 2008 child count is provided and represents the number of students receiving special education services by special education units. Of approximately 13,278 students served by 31 special education units, about 1,530 or 11.5% are Indian students. The handout also includes information about each special education unit and the schools served by each unit.

Career and Technical Education

This data represents students enrolled in Career and Technical Education course-work and is provided by ND Department of Career and Technical Education. The data counts for program year 2007-2008 are provided for students described as “student concentrators” - those students that have completed a minimum of two sequenced courses.

Graduation Rates - A total of 3,152 senior students are identified as student concentrators of which 139 are American Indian or Alaskan Native. Eighty-eight (88) or about 63% of Indian students graduate as compared to white students, about 93%.

Attainment of Academic Skills – Reading Language Arts - This report shows the percent of student concentrators who achieved at the proficient level for reading/language arts. Of all concentrators, about 64% scored in the proficient category. Of 212 Indian students, 95 students were proficient, about 44%.

Attainment of Academic Skills – Mathematics – This report shows the percent of student concentrators who achieved at the proficient level for mathematics. Of concentrators tested

about 48% scored at the proficient level. Of Indian students tested, 54 students, about 25% were at the proficient level.

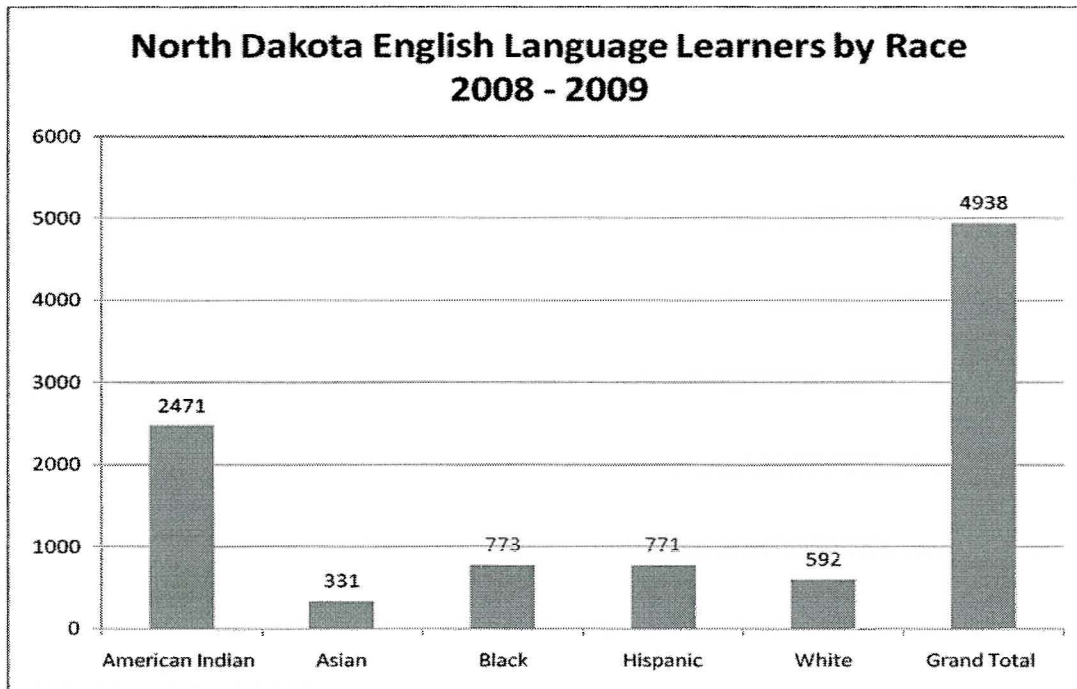
Program Enrollment – This report describes the number of American Indian students enrolled in various program areas by school for the 2008-2009 school year. (N/A means the number enrolled is less than 10 and is reported in this way to protect the individual identity of students.) The top line of the table reveals the total number of students enrolled in each program area: 1) Agriculture Education – 196; 2) Marketing Education – 67; 3) Health Careers – 48; 4) Family & Consumer Science - 785, 5) Technology Education – 136; 6) Business & Office Technology – 475; 7) Trade, Industry & Technical Education – 433; 8) Diversified Occupations – 24; and 9) Information Technology - 61.

Native American English Language Learners in North Dakota (This document is provided by Mari Rasmussen.)

English Language Learners (ELL) in North Dakota are increasing. English Language Learner is a term used for students who come from a different language background and are limited in English language proficiency. Federal legislation uses the term “Limited English Proficient” (LEP).

Native American ELL Numbers

The following chart provides a breakdown of ELL/LEP students in North Dakota by racial background. American Indian students comprise the largest number of ELLs in the state.



These students come from a variety of language backgrounds, including Ojibwa, Michif, Dakota, Lakota, Nakota, Hidatsa, Arikara and Mandan. Ojibwa is a language spoken among the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians. The community members also speak Michif, which is a combination of Indian and European languages. The second largest Native American language group in North Dakota is a language which has several dialects; Dakota, Lakota and Nakota. Dakota and Lakota are spoken on both Spirit Lake and Standing Rock Reservations. Since Lakota is the primary Native American language in South Dakota and Dakota is also spoken in Montana, Minnesota and Canada, this language group continues to have many speakers. Three languages are spoken on the Fort Berthold Reservation; Hidatsa, Arikara and Mandan. Many students come from a mixed background and their language background is listed as American Indian.

Specific Issues Related to Native American ELLs

There are many factors that contribute to the status of ELL/LEP that address the issue of Native American ELL/LEP students. Several of the factors are provided below.

- The differences between languages impact the students' learning.
- Choice influences language learning.
- Community isolation influences language learner.
- Children with a rich, intact first language learn a second language more successfully.

It is also important to note that not all Native American students are ELL/LEP. Many students come to school with proficient English language skills. Others come into school with limited English, but when provided the appropriate support and instruction, develop the English skills they need to succeed in school.

2008-09 Participation Survey

This table shows the total number of all students who participated in the various activities sponsored by the North Dakota High School Activities Association for the 2008 – 2009 school year. The data is presented by grade level and male/female. The NDHSAA does not collect data by race. A list of 2009 – 2010 member schools is provided.

Districts With American Indian Student Enrollment

This data represents 2007 – 2008 Financial Data for public school districts that have American Indian students enrolled. The table shows totals for local, county and state revenue, and federal restricted and unrestricted revenue as well as the average daily membership and total cost per pupil.

Local revenue includes dollars generated by various local property tax levies as well as other revenue sources such as food service, student activities, interest earned, etc.

County Revenue might include revenue from Oil & Gas Production, Coal Production and Coal Conversion.

State revenue includes state funds distributed to school districts as per pupil payments, transportation and other services provided.

Restricted federal revenue that passes through the state to school districts includes funds for typical title programs such as Title I Program Aid, Title II Professional Development Programs, Title IV School and Community Programs, Carl Perkins funding, etc.

Public school districts may also receive direct federal revenue related to educating Indian students that attend their schools. Among others, these federal programs include Title VIII Impact Aid, PL 81-815 Aid, Indian Education Program Aid

Reservation Schools

This table lists the public, nonpublic and tribal schools operating on North Dakota reservations. Data describes the reservation name, type of primary funding, and grade level provided.

Public schools are of course funded with typical funding sources, including state funds.

Nonpublic schools do not receive state funding.

Tribal schools are funded by various federal sources of revenue distributed directly to the schools from the Department of Education or the Bureau of Indian Education.

Title VIII Impact Aid Elementary and Secondary Act. Title VIII fulfills the federal responsibility to assist with the provision of educational services to federally connected children including activities with respect to Indian tribes. Impact Aid and Construction Aid PL 81-815 are now part of Title VIII.

Formerly known as the Office of Indian Education Programs, the Bureau of Indian Education (BIE) was renamed and established on August 29, 2006, to reflect the parallel purpose and organizational structure BIE has in relation to other programs within the Office of the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs. The BIE is headed by a Director, who is responsible for the line direction and management of all education functions, including the formation of policies and procedures, the supervision of all program activities and the approval of the expenditure of funds appropriated for education functions.

There have been three major legislative actions that restructured the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) with regard to educating American Indians since the Snyder Act of 1921. First, the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934 introduced the teaching of Indian history and culture in BIA schools (until then it had been Federal policy to acculturate and assimilate Indian people by eradicating their tribal cultures through a boarding school system). Second, the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act of 1975 (P.L. 93-638) gave authority to federally recognized tribes to contract with the BIA for the operation of Bureau-funded schools and to determine education programs suitable for their children. The Education Amendments Act of 1978 (P.L. 95-561) and further technical amendments (P.L. 98-511, 99-99, and 100-

297) provided funds directly to tribally operated schools, empowered Indian school boards, permitted local hiring of teachers and staff, and established a direct line of authority between the Education Director and the AS-IA. The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (P.L. 107-110) brought additional requirements to the schools by holding them accountable for improving their students' academic performance with the U.S. Department of Education supplemental program funds they receive through the Bureau.

As stated in Title 25 CFR Part 32.3, BIE's mission is to provide quality education opportunities from early childhood through life in accordance with a tribe's needs for cultural and economic well-being, in keeping with the wide diversity of Indian tribes and Alaska Native villages as distinct cultural and governmental entities. Further, the BIE is to manifest consideration of the whole person by taking into account the spiritual, mental, physical, and cultural aspects of the individual within his or her family and tribal or village context. The BIE school system employs thousands of teachers, administrators and support personnel, while many more work in tribal school systems.

In School Year 2007-2008, the 184 Bureau-funded elementary and secondary schools, located on 64 reservations in 23 states, served approximately 48,000 Indian students. Of these, 59 are BIE-operated and 125 are tribally operated under BIE contracts or grants. The Bureau also funds or operates off-reservation boarding

schools and peripheral dormitories near reservations for students attending public schools. The BIE also serves American Indian and Alaska Native post secondary students through higher education scholarships and support funding for tribal colleges and universities. The fiscal year 2009 funding is provided to 26 tribal colleges and universities.

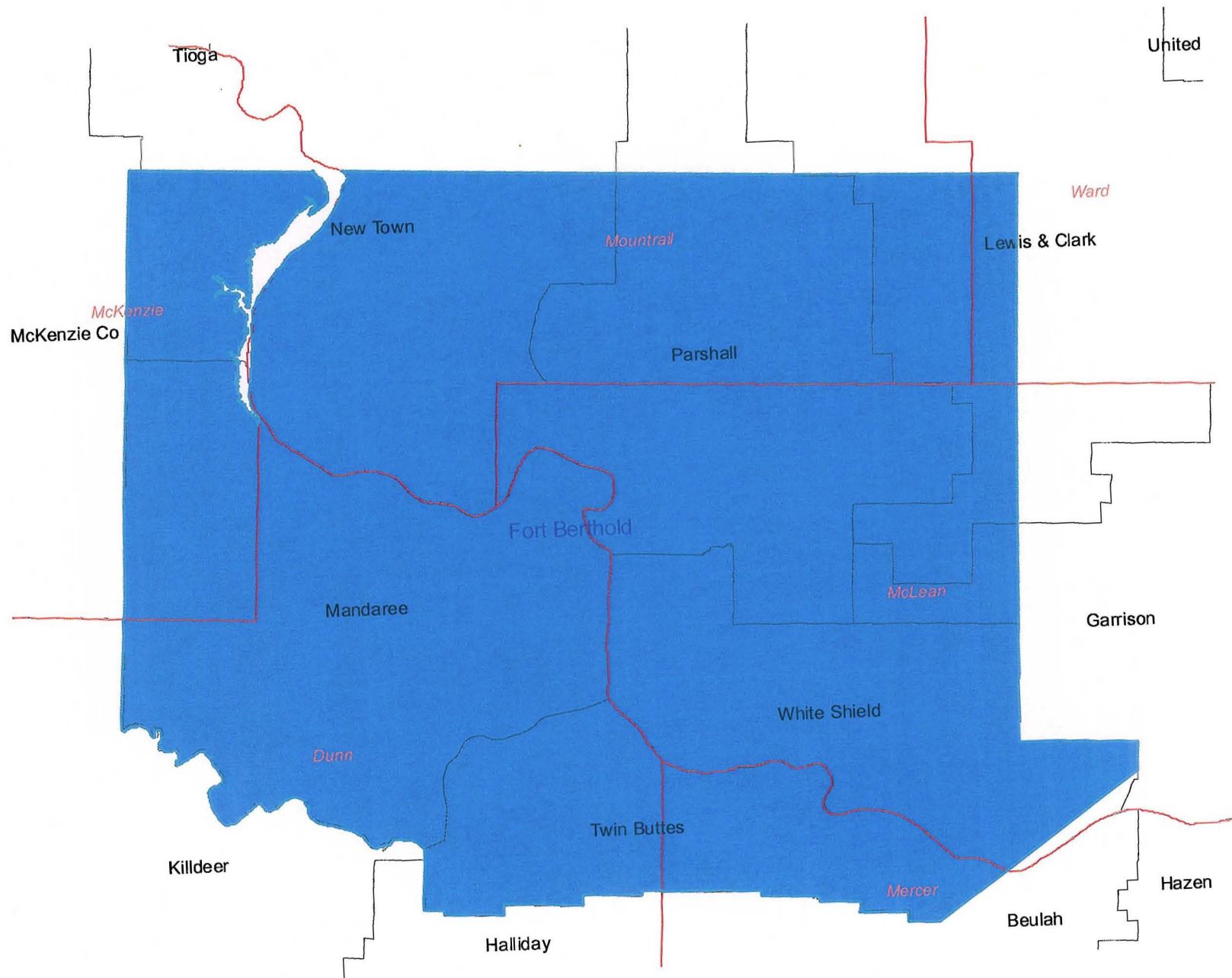
Standing Rock Community Schools are operated solely by the tribe. Fort Yates Public and the Standing Rock Community Schools, through a joint powers agreement, provide educational services to students at the Fort Yates Middle School.

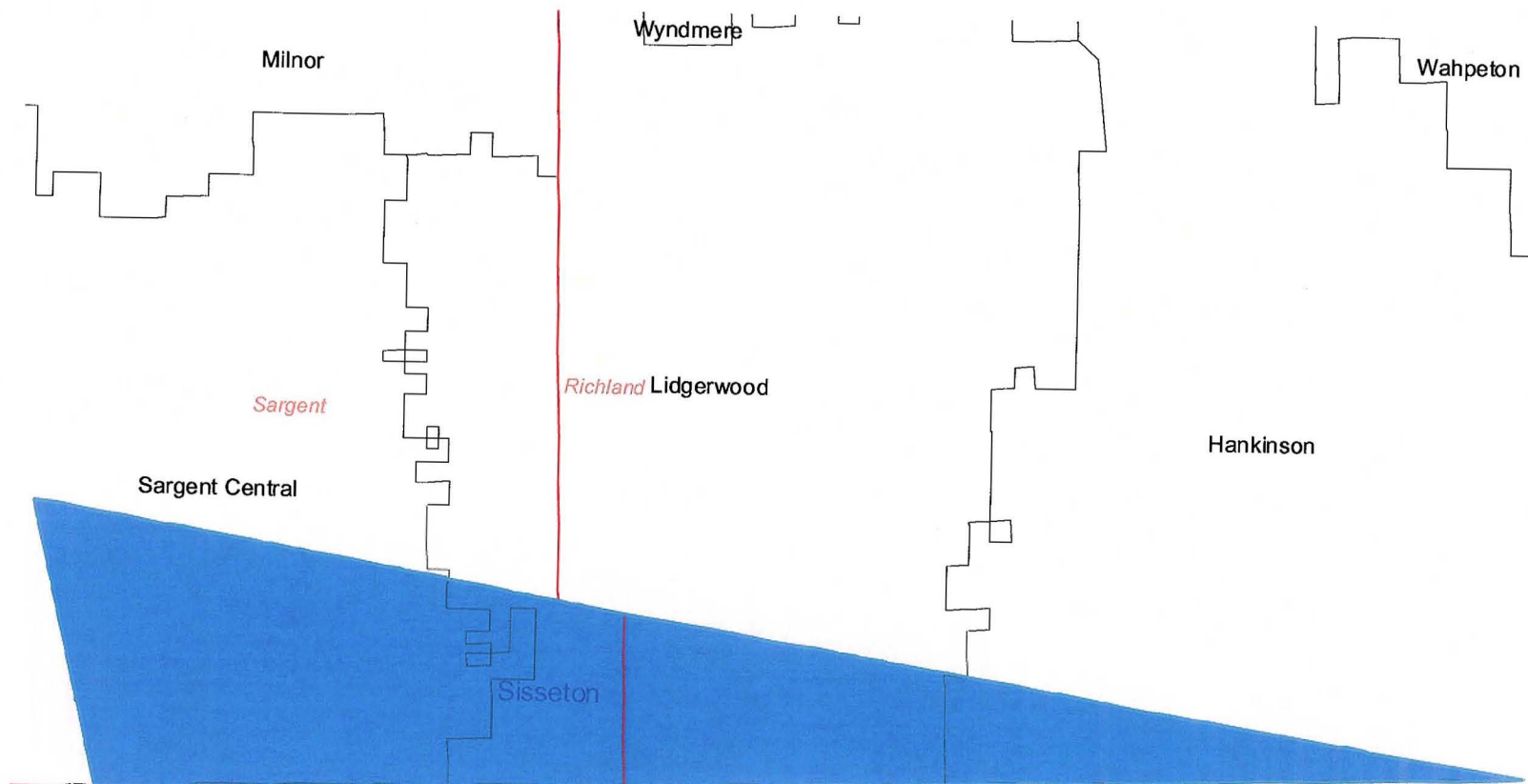
The Belcourt Public School District Board of Education maintains management and operational control of the Turtle Mountain Community Schools and works cooperatively with the Tribal Board through an operations plan in the provision of educational services to students attending those schools.

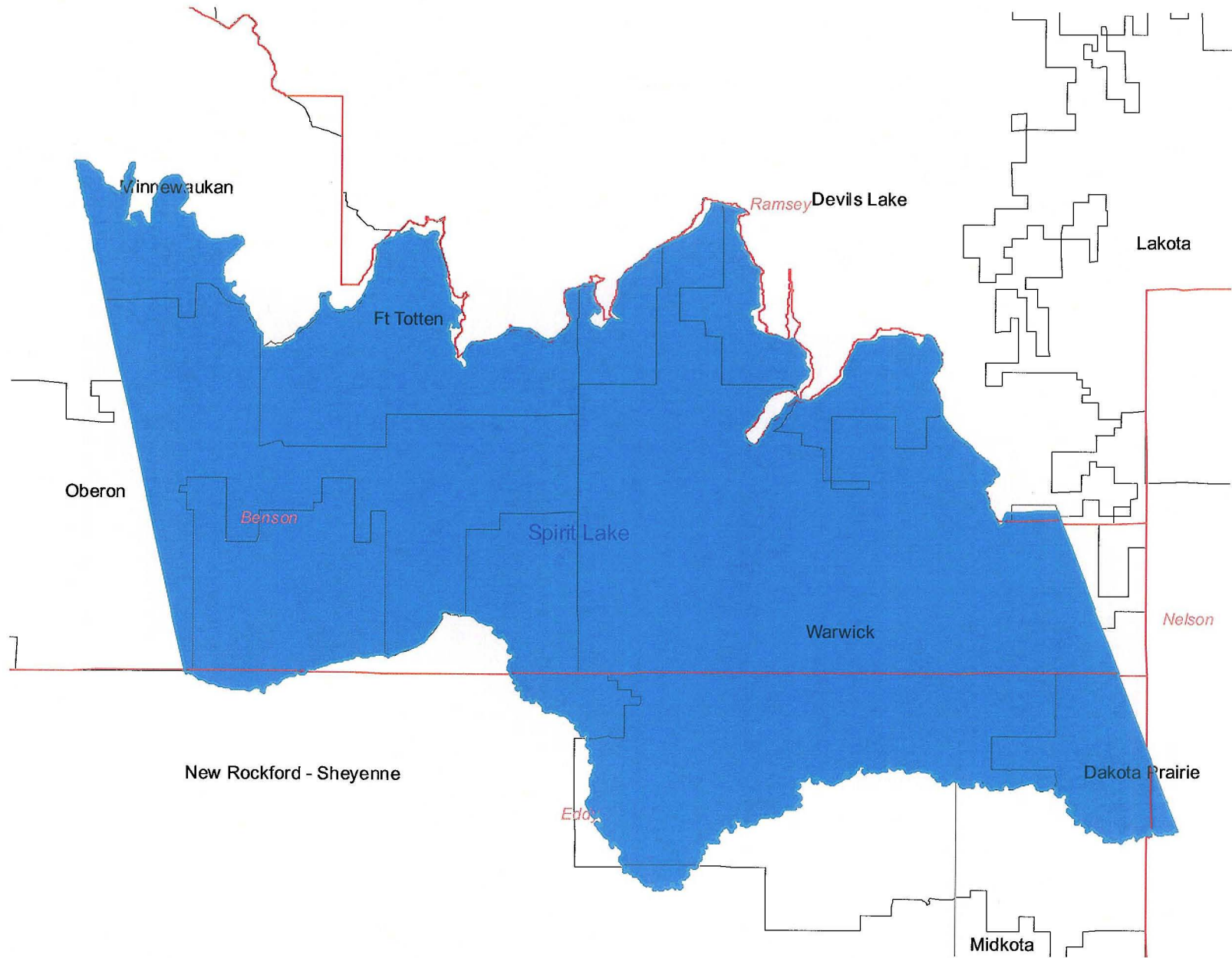
The Dunseith Day Elementary School is considered a federal BIE school and is operated by the Dunseith Public School District. The Ojibwa Indian School has also retroceded to become a federal school and is awaiting approval from the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Education. The Ojibwa Indian School would enter into an agreement to be operated by the Belcourt Public School District. These agreements are permissible according to North Dakota Century Code 15.1-29-10. These students are counted in the district's student count.

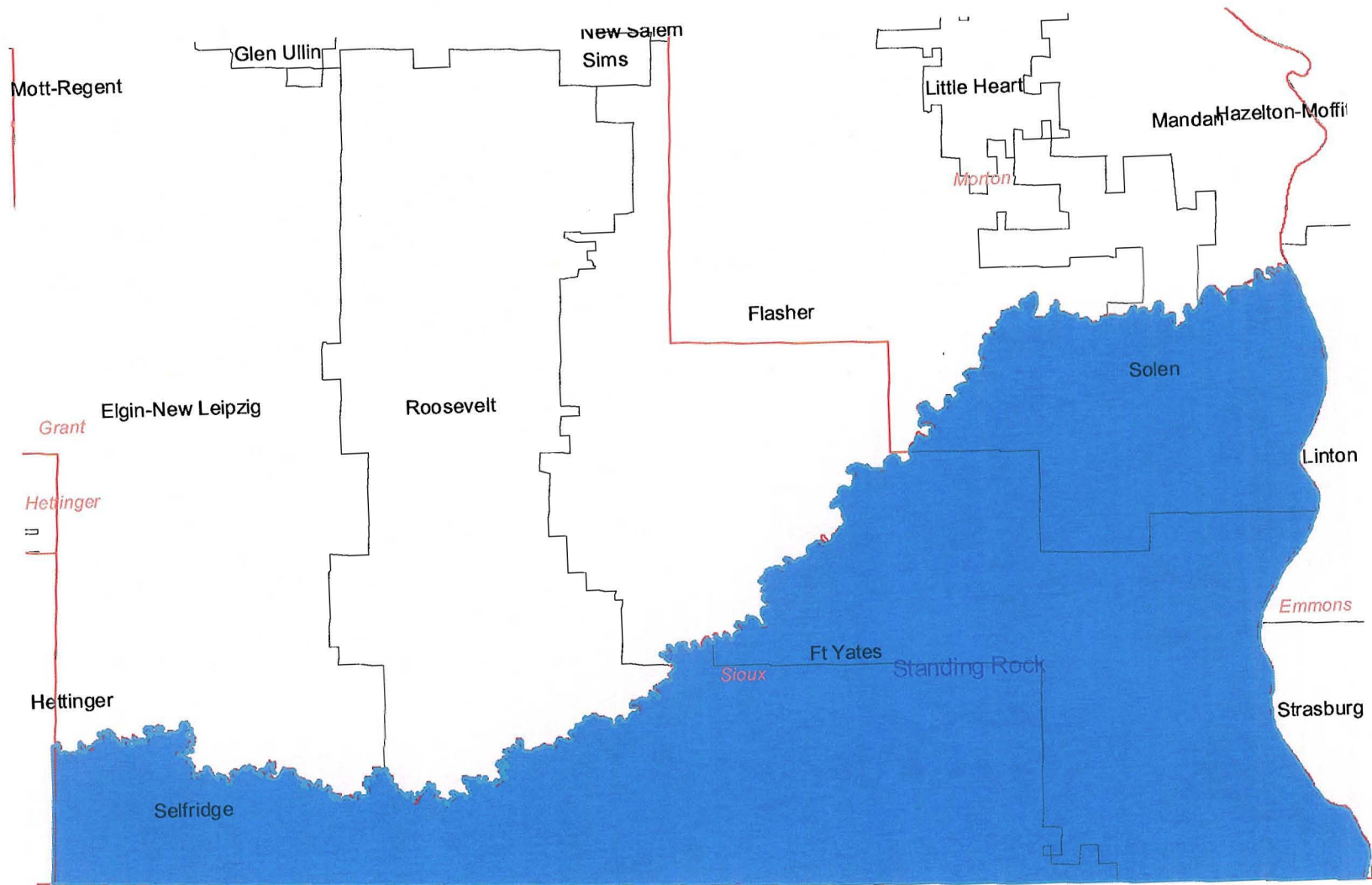
Funding for Indian student education is a large and complex issue complicated by federal, state, and tribal governance issues.

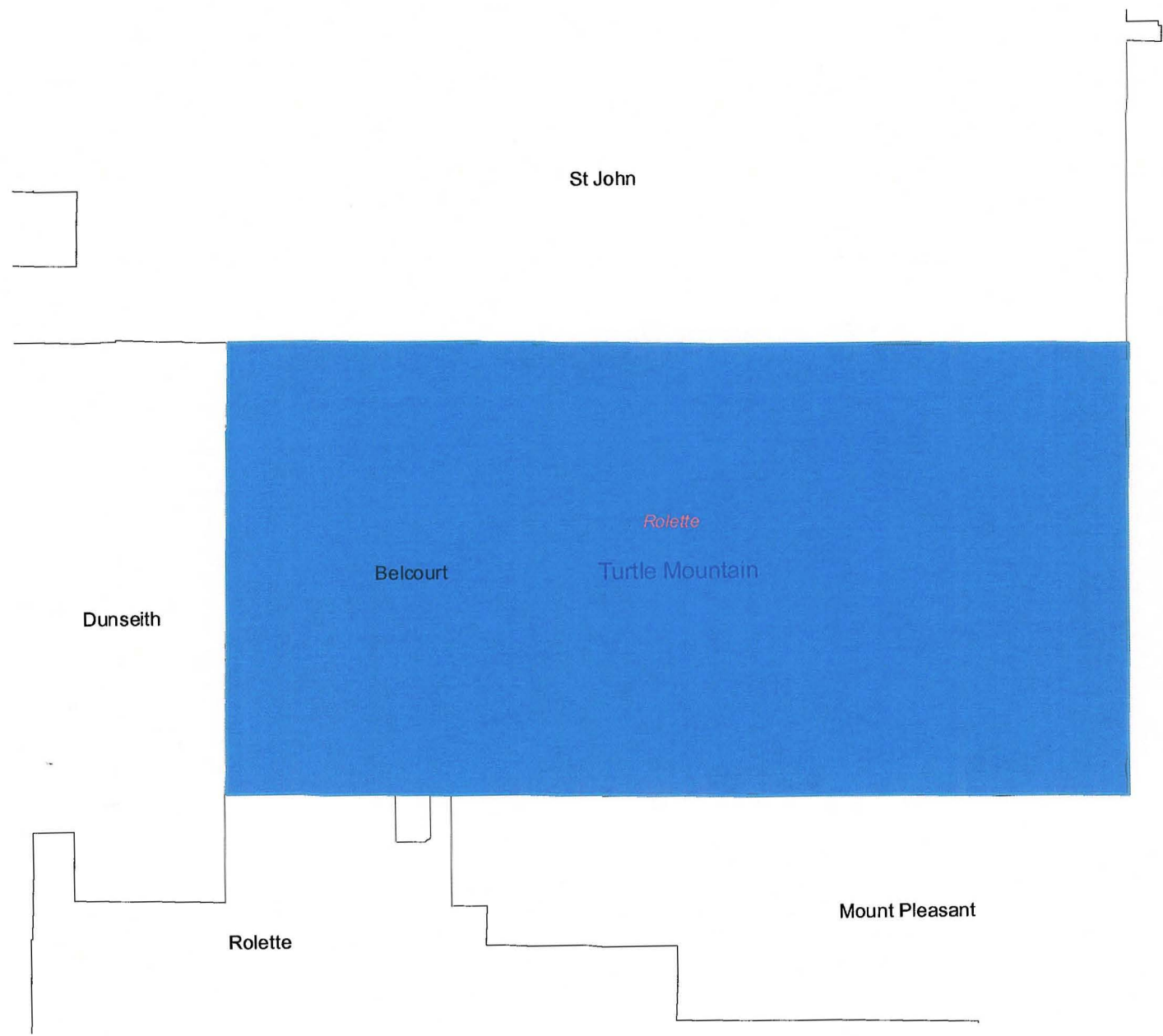

Native American English Language Learners in North Dakota

October 2009

English Language Learners (ELL) in North Dakota are increasing. English Language Learner is a term used for students who come from a different language background and are limited in English language proficiency. Federal legislation uses the term “Limited English Proficient” (LEP). The definition for LEP can be founded in Title IX of the No Child Left Behind Act.

The term “limited English proficient”, which is defined in section 9101 of Title IX when used with respect to an individual, means an individual -

- (A) who is aged 3 through 21;
- (B) who is enrolled or preparing to enroll in an elementary school or secondary school;
- (C)(i) who was not born in the United States or whose native language is a language other than English;
- (ii)(I) who is a Native American or Alaska Native, or a native resident of the outlying areas; and
- (II) who comes from an environment where a language other than English has had a significant impact on the individual’s level of English language proficiency; or
- (iii) who is migratory, whose native language is a language other than English, and who comes from an environment where a language other than English is dominant; and
- (D) whose difficulties in speaking, reading, writing, or understanding the English language may be sufficient to deny the individual -
- (i) the ability to meet the State’s proficient level of achievement on State assessments described in section 1111(b)(3);
- (ii) the ability to successfully achieve in classrooms where the language of instruction is English; or
- (iii) the opportunity to participate fully in society.

Identifying Native American ELLs

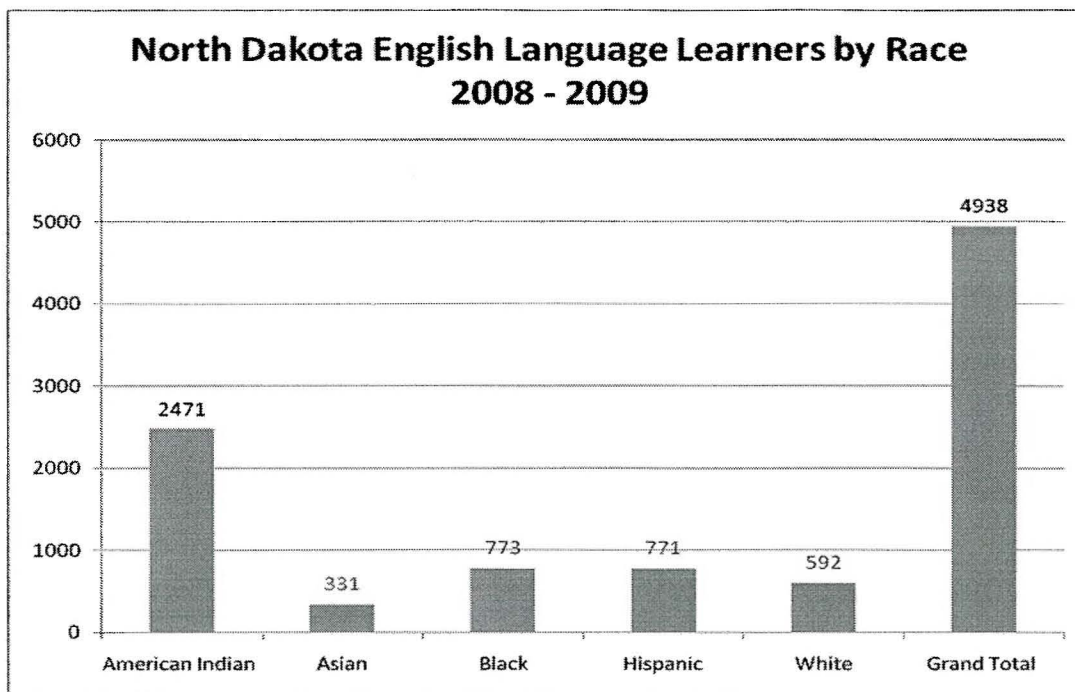
North Dakota follows the federal definition of ELL/LEP. School districts are expected to screen students to determine whether there is a non-English language in the students' background. This non-English background does not necessarily mean that the student speaks the home language fluently. It simply means that the language of the home or the community has influenced the student. Many students, such as the Native American students, have a limited understanding of their heritage language, but are not proficient in English either.

Students who come from different language backgrounds are then assessed for language proficiency. Those students who qualify on the basis of the background information and the assessment are identified as ELL/LEP. School districts are required to provide an initial English language proficiency placement test and administer an annual state English language proficiency assessment.

North Dakota belongs to a consortium of states that have developed English language proficiency assessments that meet federal requirements. The screening instrument used is called the WIDA ACCESS Placement Test (W-APT) and the annual test is called the ACCESS for ELLs test. Students are exited from ELL/LEP status once they meet the exit criteria for attaining proficiency.

Native American ELL Numbers

The following chart provides a breakdown of ELL/LEP students in North Dakota by racial background. American Indian students comprise the largest number of ELLs in the state.

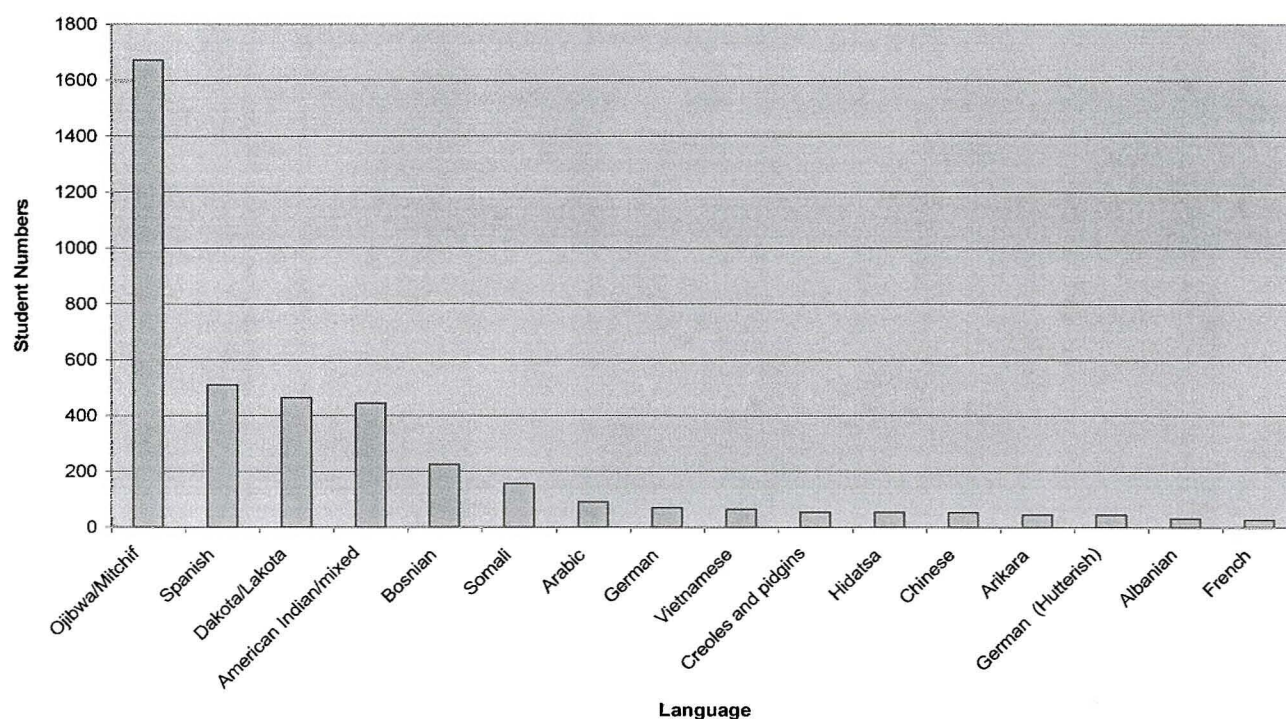


These students come from a variety of language backgrounds, including Ojibwa, Michif, Dakota, Lakota, Nakota, Hidatsa, Arikara and Mandan. Ojibwa is a language spoken among the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians. The community members also speak Michif, which is a combination of Indian and European languages. The second largest Native American language group in North Dakota is a language which has several dialects; Dakota, Lakota and Nakota. Dakota and Lakota is spoken on both Spirit Lake and Standing Rock Reservations. Since Lakota is the primary Native American language in South Dakota and Dakota is also spoken in Montana, Minnesota and Canada, this language group continues to have many speakers. Three languages are spoken on the Fort Berthold Reservation; Hidatsa, Arikara and Mandan. Many students come from a mixed background and their language background is listed as American Indian.

The second largest racial group of ELL/LEP students is Black and consists primarily of the African populations who come to North Dakota as refugees. They speak a variety of languages that include Somalian, Sudanese and many tribal

languages. The Hispanic population is growing in North Dakota. Spanish is increasing at a greater rate than any other language among the ELL population in North Dakota.

Specific Issues Related to Native American ELLs

Many individuals wonder why Native American children are categorized as ELL/LEP when they have been exposed to English for several generations and do not speak their Native language fluently. There are many factors that contribute to the status of ELL/LEP that address the issue of Native American ELL/LEP students. Several of the factors are provided below.

- The differences between languages impact the students' learning.

The northern European culture and English language that the Native American students have been taught is very different from their home language and culture.

- Choice influences language learning.

Many Native Americans were forced to learn English in boarding schools. Elders tell stories of having their mouths washed out with soap for speaking their own language. This method of education has been proven to be ineffective in developing strong language skills. Many Native Americans educated in boarding schools learned very limited English sufficient to get by. This limited, broken English was a poor model for their children.

- Community isolation influences language learner.

Native American communities have remained someone separate from the mainstream culture out of both choice and situation. This isolation does not support the development of successful English skills.

- Children with a rich, intact first language learn a second language more successfully.

Many Native American communities are losing their heritage languages. Unfortunately, many of the parents do not have strong English skills either. The children growing up in these homes, with limited exposure to their home language and poor models of the English language, are at a great disadvantage because they do not have a strong linguistic foundation.

There are many other factors that contribute to language learning and have impacted Native American learners. Poverty, broken homes and other factors can also influence children's growth and language learning.

It is also important to note that not all Native American students are ELL/LEP. Many students come to school with proficient English language skills. Others come into school with limited English, but when provided the appropriate support and instruction, develop the English skills they need to succeed in school.

Instructional Programs for Native American ELLs

All ELL/LEP students benefit from language instructional programs that use research based instructional methods and trained ELL teachers. Many methods, such as sheltered English programs, are successful with Native American ELLs/LEP students as with other students. Since few Native American students are at a beginning level of English, some of the direct intensive language instruction that are used with new immigrant students are not appropriate. Research as shown that instructional programs that incorporate the heritage language and culture of the Native American are particularly effective.
