Testimony Department of Human Services Government Services Committee Representative Ken Svedjan, Chairman August 17, 2010

Chairman Svedjan, members of the Government Services Committee, I am Maggie Anderson, Director of Medical Services Division for the Department of Human Services. I am here today to provide information about the possibility of Medicaid paying for eligible veterans' prescription drug costs not paid by the federal Department of Veterans' Affairs (VA).

Medicaid, which provides prescription coverage, is available to veterans who qualify under one of the various Medicaid categories, which includes veterans who are disabled, pregnant, a caretaker relative of a deprived child, or age 65 or older. A veteran who does not qualify for Medicaid coverage is not eligible for Medicaid coverage of prescriptions.

Following is a chart that demonstrates how payments are made for prescriptions for individuals who are eligible for benefits under the VA as well as Medicaid.
