I am here today to provide you information regarding the availability of mental health and substance abuse beds in the state including mental health and substance abuse beds contracted by the Division.

Nancy McKenzie, DHS, provided you information on beds contracted or provided through the human service centers at your August 5, 2010 meeting. I have redistributed that document for reference in **Attachment**A. The Division contracts for 40 residential treatment substance abuse beds with Share House through their Robinson Recovery Center for the amount of \$1,481,573 in the 09-11 biennium. The Division has no contract for mental health beds.
