## Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

To provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the Council on the Arts

## Minutes:

**Chairman Pollert** opened hearing on HB 1010. **Jan Webb, Executive Director for the ND Council on the Arts (NDCA)**, provided written testimony in support of HB 1010 as referenced as attachment **ONE**. During testimony, passed around book for committee members to view, titled *Sundogs and Sunflowers: Folklore and Folk Art of the Northern Great Plains*, by Dr. Timothy J. Kloberdanz and Troyd A. Geist (NDCA folklorist) and published by NDCA.

**Chairman Pollert:** Can you explain culture pulse to me?

**Jan Webb:** Culture pulse.org is an online program based on a program out of artsopolis in California. Grand Forks initiated it about 5 years ago. The purpose is to market and promote arts organizations and artists. It's now statewide with the funding we received last time. Referenced website, culturepulse.org, stating that members can visit website, and click on regions in ND on the map on the site and get abreast with activities going on in that region including activities beyond the arts as well like family activities by nonprofits i.e. run funs. It also has a listing of artists in that region.

**Chairman Pollert:** We had discussion about the Plain Arts Museum last time. Isn't it a rolling arts on wheels?

**Jan Webb:** At one point they had a rolling arts gallery that was on wheels. That trailer had severe damage thus not able to repair or replace due to cost factor, so funding was requested for rural initiatives and outreach with the extra funding that was allocated to them last time as a onetime funding to replace what they were doing with the Rolling Plains.

**Chairman Pollert:** is the Rolling Plains Gallery still up and running?

**Jan Webb:** No, it's not

**Chairman Pollert:** that's why on the green sheet it removes the onetime funding for the Plain Arts of \$57,000?

**Jan Webb:** Right. With the funding that you gave them last time, they built several arts crates and they've been sending those out to schools as well as developing a website for resources for teachers and activities that they can do in their schools.

**Representative Kaldor:** How does an organization in ND get placed on culture pulse site?

**Jan Webb:** it's a self placement. There's a small video on the site you can access which gives directions on how to get on this site. It is monitored by the Regional Arts Organization. You can self enter the information and once it's approved it's automatically on the site.

**Representative Nelson:** How do we get a copy of the book?

**Jan Webb:** Through me. It's \$34.95.

**Chairman Pollert** requested that **Jan Webb** go over the Operating Expenses and Proposed Grants and Program Expenditures Budget as located in attachment **ONE**. **Jan Webb** went through an overview of the sheets.

**Representative Nelson:** We are starting to see federal cutbacks. What's the status of your federal funding?

**Jan Webb:** we haven't received what our allocation will be for this fiscal year. It is likely our funding will remain pretty leveled for this fiscal year. In going forward in the second year of the biennium, I can't answer that. It may come down at that point.

**Representative Nelson:** How would you handle federal cutbacks?

**Jan Webb:** the first step is that we would have to examine the 8 projects that are listed in our testimony, and that is what would likely have to be cut back; if not eliminated.

**Chairman Pollert:** you actually have those on this green sheet (attachment **ONE**, Proposed Grants and Program Expenditures Budget) as those are federally funded programs?

**Jan Webb:** yes

**Representative Nelson:** By the way, I was able to take part in the Keith Bear presentation while on Amtrak. He always does such a nice job.

**Jan Webb:** we've had remarkable feedback on that program from outside the state.

**Representative Nelson:** I am not familiar at all with the state park program. Do you have identity in each of the state parks at different times? Or do you choose one a week or how does that work and is it local in nature? Like in Devils Lake, there is a tie in with the lake there?

**Jan Webb:** in the first year of the partnership, we selected 2 artists and 1 was up in Turtle River State Park and the other was up in the Bottineau/Metigoshe Park, doing 1 week each. This last time we did it, the parks division did the selection process and they selected in partnership with us, each of whom did 1 week residency in three different parks to include Lewis and Clark Park, Icelandic State Park, and Cross Ranch.

**Representative Nelson:** There is a man from my district, Dean Haugen. He is a blacksmith and I noticed he was listed here. I see he had a dollar figure that he received from the Council on the Arts. How does the funding follow the artist?

**Jan Webb:** I am guessing he is in the artist apprenticeship program and he is probably the master teaching an apprentice the art of blacksmithing. So that's teaching one student. **Jan Webb** referenced attachment **ONE** in explaining this.

**Representative Wieland:** As an aside, I believe a former director passed away this fall in Detroit Lakes. I believe you knew her; Donna Evanson.

**Jan Webb:** Yes. She was very effective in developing the programs and council.

**Representative Wieland:** You mentioned that you provided artwork for the Governor's office and the Attorney General. What about the other state officials such as Secretary of State? Do you provide any artwork to them?

**Jan Webb:** This program was initiated by Bill Getz after the first inaugural ball for Governor Hoeven. He asked us to supply artwork by ND artists in the Governor's reception area and the first lady's office. About a year and a half ago, the attorney general's office approached us and asked if we would be willing to put some artwork in their offices. We haven't had any requests from anyone else.

**Representative Wieland:** are these like an on loan type art from ND artists, like the tribes or somebody that does it and you put it in there temporarily?

**Jan Webb:** Yes, we do it on a rotating, quarterly basis and the artist is willing to put their work on loan for 3 months. We try to cover all the different regions. It has to be hanging, visual art so it limits who we can have.

**Chairman Pollert:** Regarding the green sheet (Proposed Grants and Program Expenditures Budget, attachment **ONE**), I am trying to reconcile those numbers versus your budget. Is that a possibility?

**Jan Webb:** This is for one fiscal year. I did not bring last years.

**Chairman Pollert:** Is this from July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2012?

**Jan Webb:** No, it's from July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011.

**Chairman Pollert** confirmed that there were no more questions from the committee members and at this time; they did not request for **Jan Webb** to go through the grants further on attachment **ONE**.

**Chairman Pollert:** We will be asking you back at some point. Thank you.

**Gail Benson**, Fargo educator, submitted testimony in support of HB 1010, as attachment **TWO**. I want to share how successful the programming is from NDCA in providing students the tools they need for successful careers. Our rural schools have a greater need these programs versus the schools in the larger areas.

**Chairman Pollert** closed hearing on HB 1010.



## Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

To provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the Council on the Arts

## Minutes:

**Chairman Pollert** opened meeting. Clerk took role and quorum declared. Chairman Pollert opened hearing on HB 1010.

**Jan Webb** provided a spend down report, labeled as attachment **ONE**, and allowed committee members to look at attachment and asked questions. She also provided operating expenses through Dec 31, 2010 (attachment **THREE**), salary budget (attachment **TWO**), operating budget detail (attachment **FIVE**), and grants summary (attachment **SIX**).

**Representative Wieland:** temp salaries, what is that for?

**Jan Webb:** We have one part time temporary staff, who is with accounting primarily along with other types of administrative duties.

**Chairman Pollert:** do you have any other accounting staff?

**Jan Webb:** One administrative person that's full time. She has multiple duties such as data entry for people soft, receptionist, accounting, grants manager, etc.

**Chairman Pollert:** where is she located?

**Jan Webb:** It would be the last of our FTEs on the salary budget form (attachment **TWO**)

**Chairman Pollert:** how long have you had the temp for?

**Jan Webb:** Two years and we are using federal dollars for the part time temp.

**Chairman Pollert:** institutional support, is that federal funding?

**Jan Webb:** Primarily federal. it should all be under the basic state partnership thus it was keyed in wrong.

**Representative Nelson:** that should be just like the last budget (09-11)

**Jan Webb:** Yes

**Representative Wieland:** this ITD data processing hasn't increased at all which is unlike the other budgets we have detailed.

**Chairman Pollert:** Office of Management and Budget, why is that?

**Office of Management and Budget:** it depends on the mix of services. For instance, DSL connections at satellite locations through DOCR have been increase, while other types of services have decreased.

**Jan Webb:** ITD changed the way they billed and due to being small, we benefited  
**Representative Wieland:** you may have had no increase in services, but because ITD changed the billing methodology you had a reduction as it was a small amount?

**Jan Webb:** ITD charges a connection fee for each of the computers and there's a base fee. We didn't go over the base so we got a reduction

**Representative Wieland:** the reduction doesn't show though

**Jan Webb:** It would have shown on the last biennium due to this happening 2 years ago

**Chairman Pollert:** IT equipment under 5000?

**Jan Webb:** Under our ITD plan we replaced 3 computers

**Office of Management and Budget:** I have a document that shows mix of services and what ITD charges and the rates; essentially the detail of their rate structure.

**Representative Wieland:** I am not interested in seeing it when the rates go down.

**Chairman Pollert:** the tobacco group, didn't they have some kind of computer program that is with the DOH and would those rates be included in the document you have?

**Office of Management and Budget:** this is just for the rates that ITD bills for standard services, but this doesn't include project development.

**Representative Kaldor:** that was under IT contractual services where tobacco group and DOH were contracting with the same entity that was dealing with grant awards

**Office of Management and Budget:** I would not have information on that

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** on the travel line item, your expenditures are only 30% of what was budgeted?

**Office of Management and Budget:** I'm not sure exactly when your budgeted was completed but at the time, agencies start with a March, April (sometimes a May if they are late) download from peoplesoft so it has those actual expenditures. To get to that first year expenditures number, it estimates for the remaining couple of months or three months of the biennium, so if there is \$75,000 spent in the first 9 months, it'll be estimated there's going to be \$100,000 and that's what it plugs in for the first year so there's cases where what it says in the I Bars report for first year expenditures, that maybe doesn't tie exactly now that we are past that point to what the actual first year expenditures were because it was somewhat of an estimate at the time. That might be the case here.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** we've had reports through Nov 2010 and one that went through Jan. Is that possible to get that?

**Office of Management and Budget:** Yes, Jan has provided that (**attachment THREE**)

**Chairman Pollert:** how much was expended in travel in 07-09? The FTE account hasn't changed.

**Jan Webb:** Our major panel meeting is held in May and is not reflected in here. Our national association did not have a national meeting that particular year and we had expected to go to that. During the course of the year we have changed some of our travel line item

**Chairman Pollert:** Office of Management and Budget or Legislative Council, would you have what travel was for 07-09?

**Office of Management and Budget:** I could print this. (attachment FOUR)

**Jan Webb:** On attachment Three, you will see that we reduced our travel budget.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** can you explain culturepulse?

**Jan Webb:** It's an online program that was implemented about 5-6 years ago in Grand Forks. It was developed out of San Diego, called Artsopolis. It's a method of marketing and promotion. Online (culturepulse.org) you can pull up an image of the state map that with four regional dots on it and if you click on one of those programs, the events and activities that are occurring in that region will pop up as well as all of the artists, dancers, musicians. The marketing plan is to coordinate a marketing plan for the entire state with these four regions: Grand Forks, Bismarck, Fargo, and Minot.

**Representative Nelson:** what did you do with the stimulus money?

**Jan Webb:** the \$285,000 plus went out to our constituency for preservation of jobs.

**Representative Nelson:** That was provided to them in grants?

**Jan Webb:** Yes. We just a little bit for operating.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** you have an increase in the Arts for Life program for \$20,000?

**Jan Webb:** This program is about incorporating arts into programming for seniors at assisted living centers and nursing homes and we would like to expand it to at least 2-3 more communities. Last biennium, we expanded it by 2. We have asked for commitments from the current communities. The first three communities that we started about four years ago and they have started putting money into program and will take care of the program eventually.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** there's a \$10,000 continuation for Poet Laureate (attachment FIVE); explain that to me.

**Jan Webb:** the Poet Laureate is appointed by the governor and has never been funded. He's been expected to travel and to attend different activities and never had a budget for that. In the last biennium, the community (Jamestown) requested that it be put into our budget and it wasn't something that we initiated, but had some support in the House and Senate and was included in our budget. What we have required of him is that he does workshops in High Schools.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** this is basically travel and not a salary?

**Jan Webb:** There's some honorary mixed into it.

**Representative Wieland:** as I was looking at this programs grants and expenditures budget, it shows \$5000 for state funds, but in the general budget, it says \$10,000?

**Jan Webb:** It's just for one fiscal year

**Representative Nelson:** what's the name of the program that the artist is involved in the Amtrak programs?

**Jan Webb:** Amtrak. It's part of Institutional Support on this. On the back of attachment FIVE there is a breakdown of program costs.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** we will be contacting you when we do amendments

**Jan Webb:** I will be out of state on the week of the Feb 18

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** if no one is here to represent NDCA, we may have to do it anyway due to deadlines.

**Jan Webb:** If there are specific questions, I can prepare a staff and she can be here.

**Vice Chairman Bellew (as Chairman Pollert as not present due to presenting a bill in another committee)** adjourned hearing on HB 1010.



### Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

To provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the Council on the Arts

### Minutes:

**Chairman Pollert** opened hearing on HB 1010. Chairman Pollert asked committee if anyone would be bringing forward amendments.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** I'd like to bring three amendments forward. The first proposed amendment (01001), labeled on attachment **ONE**, has the purpose of removing the funding (\$15,000 of general funds on the green sheet) for the culture pulse web marketing initiative. I don't believe it is a needed function of the Council on the Arts. I am moving the amendment for discussion purposes.

**Chairman Pollert:** there is a motion for amendment 01001. Is there a second?

**Representative Wieland:** second

**Chairman Pollert:** second from Representative Wieland. Discussion?

**Representative Kaldor:** the culturepulse web marketing initiative promotes the website that contains information about the arts in ND and gives all of us, and basically everyone in the world, access to what is being done in ND. In many senses, this is not only a value to the artists here in ND, but also to the state in terms of putting us on the map in the arts world. I support the governor's budget and would oppose the amendment.

**Chairman Pollert:** confirmed there was no other discussion on amendment .01001. Clerk called for votes and amendment passed with 5 yes, 1 no and 1 absent.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** moved for amendment .01002, labeled as attachment **TWO**.

**Representative Kreidt:** second

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** This amendment takes away the funding for the Poet Laureate (\$10,000). I don't the reason for the Poet Laureate.

**Chairman Pollert:** discussion?

**Representative Kaldor:** I think poetry is great and in fact, today at 12 pm, Representative Glassheim will be reading poetry from his travels to China. This is about ND's image and we have a number of great poets in ND. It's a fine thing for us to recognize and promote and to

help these poet laureates travel across the state. Every opportunity that someone who puts himself forward like that, takes courage and it's the most personal thing a person can do in terms as writing and there are a lot of critics. I think it's absolutely important for our children and schools and everyone else to recognize the value of this literary form. We should be proud of it. I would hope that we would resist this amendment.

**Representative Wieland:** Representative Kaldor states it's important for our children and with all the texting they do, they are not going to be able to know what poetry is.

**Representative Kaldor:** all the more reason we need to do this!

**Chairman Pollert** confirmed there was no other discussion. Vote taken on amendment .01002 and it passed with 4 yes, 2 no, and 1 absent.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** I'd like to make a verbal amendment for a third proposed amendment. Legislative Council has not typed this up yet, but it will be ready by the time full committee meets this afternoon. The amendment is to reduce the operating expense line item (the travel amount by \$20,000). In looking at the first year expenditures and they are only about a third of what was budgeted last time and I just don't see them expending all of the money we budgeted last time. The \$20,000 should not hurt them. I believe, they still have the authority to move within budget line items, correct?

**Legislative Council:** that is correct

**Chairman Pollert:** we would just reduce operating expense by \$20,000

**Legislative Council:** yes, that's correct

**Representative Kaldor:** in looking at pg 1, that would be in line 12 is where the difference would be made? It would be a \$20,000 reduction? So it would be \$275,575?

**Chairman Pollert** clarified this for Representative Kaldor.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** my request is for general fund reduction, not just the total funds reduction.

**Chairman Pollert:** we asked for the amendment and it didn't get done in time. I had discussed with Representative Metcalf that the three amendments were going to come forward.

**Representative Kaldor:** I don't have a problem with you making a verbal amendment. It's easily understood, but I am against it.

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** I will move for a reduction in \$20,000 in the operating expense line item, general funds.

**Representative Nelson:** I'll second the motion.

**Chairman Pollert:** discussion?

**Representative Kaldor:** I will resist the amendment as one of the concerns I have is the Council of the Arts brings artists to rural communities. It would constraint their ability to reimburse artists for travel expenses. It's not in the grants so it wouldn't compensate for that.

**Chairman Pollert** confirmed no further discussion

**Chairman Pollert:** any other amendments from the committee?

**Vice Chairman Bellew:** I'll move the Council on the Arts HB 1010 as amended

**Representative Kreidt:** second

**Chairman Pollert** confirmed no discussion. Vote occurred, resulting in 5 yes, 1 no, and 1 absent. HB 1010 was recommended for do pass as amended. Vice Chairman Bellew will bring bill to full committee. Chairman Pollert informed Vice Chairman Bellew and the committee that this bill would end up in conference due to the amendments proposed.

**Chairman Pollert** closed hearing on HB 1010.

### Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the council on the arts

### Minutes:

**Chairman Delzer** opened hearing on HB 1010, Council of the Arts, from House Appropriations Human Resources Division. Vice Chairman Bellew is the carrier.

**Representative Bellew:** I move to adopt amendment .01003 (see attachment **ONE**) on HB 1010

**Representative Pollert:** Second

**Representative Bellew:** I'll explain the amendment. We did all general fund removals. There was \$10,000 in general fund funding for a statewide Poet Laureate. We removed that. We also removed culture pulse web marketing as well as \$20,000 reduction for travel. The total reduction was about \$45,000 in general funds.

**Chairman Delzer:** You're lowering the \$295,000 operating down to \$275,000 and lowering the grants line by \$25,000.

**Representative Bellew:** Correct.

**Chairman Delzer:** Questions by the committee?

**Representative Metcalf:** I feel the lowering of the funds for the poet laureate was a poor choice. I make a substitute motion that we amend the amendment .01003 to leave in funding for the poet laureate as this is something very beneficial for our state.

**Representative Kaldor:** Second.

**Chairman Delzer:** is there anything that would keep the council within their grants even if we removed the \$10,000 from doing that?

**Representative Bellew:** they still could hire a poet laureate and pay his/her expenses.

**Representative Kaldor:** this amendment cuts the travel which is necessary for the poet laureate. Since we are cutting the laureate and the travel, we are making it difficult for the council to find the dollars within their budget to fund it. I feel the poet laureate is a great program and should be retained.

**Representative Bellew:** the \$10,000 for the poet laureate included his travel and there was a stipend in that amount as well.

**Representative Kaldor:** He is correct. If we restore the poet laureate, we'll cover his or her travel. The rest of the amendment cuts travel so that has an effect on the rest of the program. If they were trying to pull money from other places, we are reducing those funds so it's very difficult to do so.

**Representative Pollert:** The travel isn't part of this motion.

**Chairman Delzer:** it's a substitute motion to amend with the exception of the \$10,000, so the \$20,000 is still part of the motion.

**Representative Pollert:** During the detailing, we asked them about their travel expenses for biennium to date, and I felt there was a drastic difference. That's why I thought the motion was warranted.

**Representative Glassheim:** I hope you leave the poet laureate in. I want at least a shot at it.

**Chairman Delzer:** Further discussion?

**Representative Monson:** Have we ever had a poet laureate in ND?

**Representative Bellew:** The current one is from Jamestown College. It was funded last biennium and I'm not sure if it was funded previous bienniums.

**Chairman Delzer:** Further discussion?

Voice vote failed on the substitute motion. Committee requested roll call. Roll call resulted in 8 yes, 13 no, and 0 absent, thus motion failed.

Voice vote carried for the original motion to remain intact.

**Representative Bellew:** I move HB 1010 Do Pass as Amended

**Representative Pollert:** second

Roll call vote resulted in 17 yes, 4 no, and 0 absent, thus motion carried. **Representative Bellew** assigned as carrier for the bill. Hearing on HB 1010 closed.



### Reading from testimony.

**Chairman Holmberg** said he took his granddaughter to Chicago and heard two programs on Trails and Rails.

**Chairman Holmberg** asks and is curious about the travel budget?

**Janine Webb**, The conference was cancelled so no travel for that. Also, another conference is coming up. If we don't use our operating budget, it goes back into the general fund. She is requesting that the Appropriations Committee remove the amendments that the House placed on the bill which included withholding funding for the Poet Laureate position; removed \$20,000 from operating budget (travel) and removed \$15,000 for marketing plan for CulturePulse.org.

**Senator Grindberg** asks for Janine to refresh committee's memory on the \$57,450 legislative appropriation given to Plains Art Museum? Have you been involved with that with that particular museum, with any advice counsel or discussions, on their financial challenges?

**Janine Webb** states that they are very concerned about their financing going forward. Unfortunately, we had conversations, that were too late to get funding to them, for this legislative session.

**Senator Grindberg** asks about the origin of the appropriation last session?

**Janine Webb** states she has a few handouts and will pass them out. They primarily used it for web-based design. They also put together, educational trunks, that have been sent out to schools. They did send a list of those schools. They also received some funding from a private foundation, so they could go to Minnesota, with this.

**Senator Grindberg** states that he doesn't remember the committee doing this.

**Discussion** takes place and it is determined that the committee did.

**Senator Holmberg** states it was a bill put in and promoted by a representative from Fargo, who had a representative from Casselton, put the bill in for her. The bill was killed in the House and then it was then, some of the ideas behind it were resurrected in this committee.

**Senator Grindberg** asks if Janine could take your list of grants awarded and recalculate that in your spreadsheet to provide the committee and break the information into 4 regions. I am interested if you have talked with anyone about "Challenge Grants". Would it be a discussion to have, that whatever this breaks out by region, your organization could go to towns in a particular region and say we are going award this region, this biennium, and we are going to challenge you to match what the state has put in, by being a little more focused, on local support.

**Janine Webb** states she doesn't believe that has ever happened. If I understand correctly, it would be easy for us to break that out, into the four regions. Would this be, in place of, our grant program funding, that we currently have or just taking that funding and challenging them?

**Senator Grindberg** states that it would consist of "challenging the arts", public or private support.

**Janine Webb** states she suspects it has not because they are tied to our grants programs. We have never had the funding to make it a "challenge grant" but possibly there be some methodology we could use, where we could utilize that type of support.

**Gail Benson, Fargo, M.Ed. on behalf of NDCA (ND Council on the Arts)**







January 10, 2011

Mr. Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Members of the Human Services Appropriations Committee, my name is Jan Webb and I am the Executive Director for the North Dakota Council on the Arts. Thank you for the opportunity today to present the proposed 2011-13 budget for our agency and to answer any questions you might have regarding House Bill 1010.

Our agency will celebrate its 45<sup>th</sup> year in the next biennium. In 1965 the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) was created and with it, a requirement that each state establish an agency capable of accepting NEA federal arts funding and dispersing those funds throughout the state. The initial funding in 1967 included a federal planning grant for \$25,000 to survey the arts in North Dakota. In 1972 the agency received its first state appropriation. Our agency currently has five (5) FTE's and one (1) Part-time temporary staff person. Agency policies and procedures are governed by a nine-member board of directors appointed by the Governor for five year terms. The board members represent the eight regions of the state, with one additional member-at-large. The agency's mission is "to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the arts in North Dakota."

We have been asked to first review with you any findings included in the most recent financial audit of our department and the actions taken to address them. The agency's most recent audit had one recommendation: "We recommend the North Dakota Council on the Arts have someone independent of requesting federal draws reconcile the amount received to the amount deposited on PeopleSoft." The agency

response to the finding is to have administrative staff print out a copy of the federally prepared "request activity" and the Executive Director will compare those amounts to the actual amounts posted on PeopleSoft.

We expect to expend nearly all of the 2009-11 legislative appropriation before the end of the current fiscal year. Approximately 70% of the agency total budget is redirected to North Dakota communities, schools, non-profit organizations and individuals through its grant programs and partnership projects. A copy of the NDCA biennial operating budget is included with our testimony, as is a copy of the most recent fiscal year grant budget. The grant budgets are determined at the start of each fiscal year upon receipt of information regarding funding levels from the National Endowment for the Arts.

In this biennium the NDCA updated its three-year strategic plan. Methodology included an online constituent survey, four regional community meetings, individual interviews, and planning sessions with the board and staff. An arts planning consultant, Dreeszen and Associates, assisted the Council and conducted all of the interviews. An invitation to participate in the online survey went to all 800 names on our constituent e-mail list and included artists, leaders of nonprofit cultural organizations, patrons, and educators. Survey invitations were also posted in newsletters and on the NDCA website. Over half of individuals receiving the invitation responded, with 429 responses representing a remarkable 54% return. Nearly 90% of respondents felt the top three priorities included (1) arts education opportunities, 2) support for community arts organizations, and 3) project funding support. The new strategic plan, also included in your information, incorporates all three of these priorities. Primary goals of the plan are

1) developing strong leadership, 2) developing greater grass-roots awareness and advocacy, 3) advancing the arts in Pre K-12 education and providing lifelong learning in the arts, and 4) building stronger North Dakota communities through the arts.

In the field of arts education, the Council has focused on continued improvement and expansion of a professional development program for teaching artists. *Artist to Artist* is a program developed in partnership with the Perpich Center for Arts Education in Minnesota and the Minnesota State Arts Board. This is a professional development program using the power of collaborative inquiry to examine the work that artists do in order to develop deeper understandings of artists' planning, instruction, and reflection strategies. Experienced facilitators guide *Artist to Artist* participants in ways that allow them to share teaching and learning practices with each other, to discover mentoring and partnering opportunities with other teaching artists, and to build bridges to arts organizations and schools. The *Artist to Artist* program has been incredibly successful and has the potential to change the future of arts in ND classrooms. ND has been training its own peer coaches through regular sessions with Perpich Center peer coaches, the Perpich Center Arts Education Partnership Coordinator, and the Education Director from our agency. We now have a cadre of peer coaches within the state that are ready to train additional teaching artists and arts educators in using the *Artist to Artist* methodology. Tennessee was recently awarded an Arts in Education dissemination model grant that will employ the Artist to Artist model over the next four years.

In efforts to develop an early childhood program that involves the arts, in 2008 the NDCA Education Director met with members of the state Human Services and the North Dakota Child Care Resources and Referral (CCR&R) to develop a plan for

integrating the arts into preschool programs. This partnership has resulted in annual workshops presented by the Wolf Trap Institute, the most recent being held in May 2010. In a second effort to reach out to early education programs, the NDCA worked with the Department of Human Services to establish arts programming in the Head Start program. Those efforts have led to a Bismarck Head Start SALT (Schools and Artists as Learning Teams) grant. This is a grant program that supports and strengthens partnerships between schools, community arts organizations and artists. Through this collaboration, teachers and artists create opportunities for success so that all students achieve to high standards.

Another partnership is currently being developed with Prairie Public Television and the National Young Audiences Network to supplement a literacy program into pre-K classrooms through collaboration with the PBS series "Between the Lions." This effort includes sequential classroom sessions with teaching artists to help students become better readers through structured arts-based learning activities.

Funding this biennium for CulturePulse.org, an online program for arts promotions, has made it available to all regions of the state. Our partners include four regional arts councils and represent the four quadrants of the state. This is an excellent method for building arts awareness and for promoting North Dakota arts organizations, artists, and helping state tourism. It allows organizations and artists to feature their cultural events within each region and to promote their work to a broader audience. Our budget request for 2011-13 includes funding to do statewide marketing for the program, increasing the public's knowledge of the online program and increasing its use. The Grand Forks region is currently able to pay nearly all expenses of the program through advertising, we expect that to be the case in all other regions of the state once the

program is well promoted. This program will provide visitors and residents alike with potential activities during their visits within North Dakota.

Specific partnerships have been developed and partially funded through our agency. Those include the following:

- **Read ND** – <http://www.readnd.org> - This partnership between the State Historical Society of ND, ND Humanities Council, State Library Association, NDCA, and Prairie Public Broadcasting has a mission of celebrating and promoting literature created in and about North Dakota. Each year in the next biennium ReadND will select ten newly published books by North Dakota authors (or books relating to ND.) Two authors will make public presentations on either his/her book or on their writing style, accompanied by classroom presentations, public workshops, and/or lectures.
- **Art for Life** – In this program, NDCA has partnered with local arts groups and their community assisted living center or nursing home. Artists bring hands-on learning projects to the centers over a period of several months. The program has been very successful in changing the outlook of senior residents by reducing boredom, feelings of helplessness, and loneliness. This biennium our agency conducted the program in five communities (Jamestown, Langdon, New Rockford, New Town and Pekin.) The \$15,000 in increased funding this biennium allowed for the addition of both New Rockford and New Town. The success of the program is indicated by the ND Long Term Care Association recognition of a Best Practices Award to the Art for Life program in New Town. As the program produces positive results, the Council does see more monetary commitment from the care facilities; the program is designed to allow each program to eventually become self-sufficient, which will allow for expansion of the program.
- **Arts ND** - For the past two years the NDCA has brought together arts leaders from throughout the state to discuss statewide priorities, especially the need for more public awareness and advocacy for local arts projects. As a result of those meetings, Arts North Dakota (AND) was formed. This fledgling membership organization also serves as the umbrella for ND Arts Alliance and CulturePulse.org. Arts ND will partner with the NDCA in presenting the next statewide arts conference and the Governor's Awards for the Arts.
- **Prairie Public Broadcasting** – This strategic partnership has allowed NDCA to promote Council programs, promote ND artists, and produce numerous documentaries. This past year six ND artists were featured in documentaries. Four were produced in partnership with The Bush Foundation on each of four Bush Fellowship recipients. Another of documentaries on photographer Wayne Gudmundson has received a Midwest regional Emmy award for 2010. Two documentaries featured immigrants to the state, one from Armenia and the other a group from the Sudan.

- **ND Dance Tour** – The NDCA partners with local arts organizations to plan an annual professional dance tour. Each tour is comprised of both an evening performance and a week of residency work in local public schools/colleges and where possible, local dance groups. Surrounding rural communities are always included and asked to participate in the residency program.
- **Summer Institutes for Educators** are held in partnership with the State Historical Society of ND, North Dakota State University K-20 Technology, North Dakota Forest Service, North Dakota Geographic Alliance, and Knife River Indian Villages National Historic Site. NDCA collaborates with these organizations to provide standards based curriculum resources and professional development for teachers. Programs have included national storyteller and author Michael Caduto; traditional artist, Keith Bear; visual artist Michael Haynes; and Kennedy Center teaching artist Karen Erickson. NDCA has also partnered with these organizations to provide educators technology training. The 2010 Summer Institute provided training in the use of a flip camera and how to create a podcast for classroom use.
- **Amtrak and The National Park Service** – NDCA has partnered with these national agencies to put ND folk artists on Amtrak between Minot, ND, and Shelby, MT. This is a part of the NPS Trails and Rails program and has been successfully run since 2002. Troyd Geist, our agency Folklorist, made a presentation to the annual NPS Trails and Rails conference in 2009. NPS would like to replicate this successful program on other lines within the United States.
- **ND Parks and Recreation** – For the past two years we have partnered with the state parks department to put artists in the state parks for a one-week residency. The first year included two visual artists and in 2010 artists included an author, a photographer, and a printmaker.

In addition to these projects, the Council has funded eleven (11) grant programs:

Institutional Support, operating support for major arts organizations; Teacher Incentive, Artist-in-Residence, and Schools and Artists as Learning Teams (SALT), all arts-in-education grants; Community Arts Access, for communities of less than 6,000 in population or organizations with special constituencies; Special Project, utilized by not-for-profits, schools, and communities; Individual Artist Fellowship; Professional Development; Folk Arts Apprenticeship; Technical Support; and Presenter Support, for arts projects in communities larger than 6,000 in population. All grant applications are funded through a panel review process. So far in this biennium eighty (80) North Dakota communities have received funding support in excess of \$2,000,000.00 through agency

grant programs. Individual grantee reports show a range of 1 participant (professional development) to 100,000 participants (Fargo Theatre.) In the information before you is a listing of grant fund recipients, their grant amounts and the number of participants in their programs. Two of our grants have rolling deadlines so there will be additional grantees before the biennium ends.

Excluding the federal stimulus funds, general funds accounted for 45% of the total agency budget. The stimulus funds were expended within the first year of the biennium with \$285,000.00 given to arts organizations for job preservation and \$5000.00 retained by the agency for operating support.

The Council produces a tri-annual newsletter that is supplemented by nine e-news updates. The website contains state, regional and national information and links to state and national arts related organizations and agencies. Information on our agency, its grant programs, publications and recordings, strategic plan, previous newsletters, and more is also on our site.

On April 5-6, 2011 the Council will partner with Arts North Dakota in providing professional development and networking opportunities through a statewide arts conference. This partnership will host the 19<sup>th</sup> biennial Governors Awards for the Arts on April 6<sup>th</sup>, recognizing arts leadership in our state. This is our chance to celebrate 4 to 5 organizations, businesses and individuals that make a difference in our communities through the arts! Other Council sponsored activities include the annual tree lighting ceremony, placement of ND artwork in the Capitol building, cultural booth participation at the ND Tourism conference and support of Marketplace art programs. This year the

Council has also published the book *Sundogs and Sunflowers: Folklore and Folk Art of the Northern Great Plains*. This book represents a concerted effort to remedy the lack of attention on the folk traditions of North Dakota and the Northern Great Plains. All fifty-three counties in North Dakota are represented in this book. Traditions from the prairies of South Dakota, western Minnesota, eastern Montana, northeastern Wyoming, and the Canadian provinces of Alberta, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan also are included. Made available to the public on December 9<sup>th</sup>, the agency has already sold nearly 800 copies. The book has been submitted to Choice Magazine and the Library Journal for critical public review.

The Icelandic Exchange has now completed eight (8) years of school residencies alternating between Hella, Iceland and Cavalier, ND. This biennium the exchange also included two exhibitions. The first, *Into the Tussock: Contemporary Icelandic Art*, featuring five Icelandic artists was held at the ND Museum of Art and is currently touring the state. The second, *A Considered View*, the photography of North Dakota artist Wayne Gudmundson is currently on exhibit at the Reykjavik Museum of Photography in Iceland.

The Council operating budget request for 2011-13 is much the same as this biennium with a difference of only \$3,530, of which \$1,261 is a rent increase. The remaining increase is due to the replacement of three computers recommended in our IT plan. In the grants line, the agency is requesting general funds of an additional \$20,000 for two - three new Art for Life programs and a one-time appropriation of \$15,000 to fund a marketing plan and its implementation for the four regional CulturePulse sites.

Council staff continue to participate at regional and national levels by serving as panelists for other states and the NEA and as presenters, sharing our innovative programs with other states. The director serves as a board member for Arts Midwest, a nine-state regional arts organization; the Arts Education Director serves on the National Assembly of State Arts Agency's (NASAA) arts education advisory group, our Folklorist and Executive Director serve on the NASAA folk arts advisory board, and staff members presented program information to their various peer groups at the NASAA annual conference held last October in Austin, Texas.

In November, the Governor's Institute invited our agency to attend a regional informational meeting in Denver with federal representatives of HUD, EPA, DOT, and NPS outlining their grant programs. Each state team was asked to prepare a project based on the information gleaned at the meeting. The ND team will be researching each of the federal agencies for a planning grant to develop statewide opportunities for community economic development through the arts. A model program from Paducah, KY (pop. 25,000) was presented at the meeting, outlining how the arts have transformed a great portion of the community. Over 50 artists from throughout the country have moved to Paducah through a massive advertising campaign. They have renovated decaying buildings and rejuvenated the tax rolls, demonstrating the positive power the arts can have on local economies. ND is now recognized for its quality of life, safe cities, employment opportunities, and reasonable cost of living. It's a great time to attract new residents and the arts can be a part of that.

No major changes in our agency are anticipated in the next biennium with the exception of the Arts Education director, a crucial staff member, retiring after 23 years of service to the state. Finding and retaining future leadership, as baby boomers retire, will be crucial for organizations across the state and this is especially true in the non-profit sector, which is almost always behind the for-profit sector in terms of benefits and salary.

Our agency will be focusing attention on professional development for statewide leadership and working in greater partnership with other state agencies and state organizations in an effort to assure dynamic and productive arts non-profits will assist in providing future development of North Dakota communities.

Finally, I have also given you information regarding the final report for the one-time funding for the Plains Art Museum this biennium. That information includes the projects completed, the schools involved to date, and the budget.

Thank you for the opportunity to share with you a few of our agency activities and future plans. Thank you also for your past support of the arts and this agency. The total budget request and executive recommendation for our agency includes:

The state of North Dakota has a deep sense of pride in the cultural and artistic heritage of the state. We believe in supporting the artistic endeavors of our citizens and in preserving the heritage of our past. In many cases, those endeavors are one and the same. This report addresses the strengths and challenges faced by the arts in our state.

**Arts Education:** As we know, there is a solid base of research that proves that learning in and through the arts not only enhances student learning, but also prepares them for the career opportunities of the present and future. While the arts have been proven to be a primary conduit to successful careers, they are inconsistently provided in the educational systems statewide. Students in larger school districts have a greater opportunity to learn through the arts, however our rural communities struggle to support an arts program of any kind.

The NDCA grants programs offer a variety of ways for schools to offer the arts in our schools. Grants support artists in residence who teach specific artistic methods, as well as funds to help classroom teachers integrate the arts into their curriculum, making learning more efficient and effective in all subject areas. The NDCA grants programs also offer teachers and professionals support to attend professional development opportunities focused on their art form, and/or teaching through the arts.

These programs are essential to the health of the public schools and the success of the students of our state – especially in the rural areas. The opportunities for students to work with an artist, or learn through an arts infused curriculum, allows students to experience learning at a deeper level and broadens the spectrum of career options open to students – careers of today and tomorrow that depend on the ability to solve problems from a variety of perspectives, to work as a team with co-workers, and to focus fully and implement a plan for completion of a project.

**Artist to Artist:** NDCA has been a part of creating a statewide network of professionals who can assist arts organizations, teachers, and artists, evaluate a project, assess techniques, gather information from other professionals, and teach students how to evaluate their own work. The Artist to Artist program is an unprecedented partnership between two state agencies, ND and MN arts organizations, and numerous professionals that has benefited countless artists, arts administrators, arts educators and classroom teachers across our region. ND organizations have and will continue to benefit from the work of professional facilitators who have been trained to identify areas of concern, guide discussion using the reflective protocols, and help participants make decisions concerning their work. More importantly, Artist to Artist is a non-threatening, positive approach to student evaluation that gives students a model to follow for problem solving in their lives that is non-judgmental, productive, and leads to a stronger project outcome.

**Partnerships:** The NDCA has been an integral and essential partner in bringing national partnerships to our state. With matching funding and project grants, students and citizens of ND can participate in national projects that are occurring across the country. Currently, NDCA is partnering with the ND



Alliance for Arts Education to implement a grant from the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. The grant is focused on a “town hall” approach to assessing the successes and needs of arts education in four communities across our state. The grant focuses on cities, rural communities, tribal schools, and consolidated schools, hosting regional conversations with leaders in education, the arts, business, and local government. Results will be shared with each community and the communities are encouraged to act on the action plans prepared during the discussions.

The NDCA created a task force of statewide leaders to discuss the need for a statewide support organization that focuses on advancing the arts in ND, as well as serving as an umbrella organization for other arts related statewide organizations. Arts North Dakota was the recommendation of the two year task force. Arts ND is in the process of becoming a 501c3 organization with the mission of advancing the arts in ND. Arts ND will partner with NDCA in projects such as the annual conference; regional networking opportunities; professional development opportunities for artists, arts administrators and educators; the development of statewide partnerships; and CulturePulse, the statewide network of electronic websites promoting the arts.

**Final Report Narrative**  
**12/30/2010**

This narrative accompanies our Outreach Finance Report for 7/1/2009 – 12/31/2010. We successfully launched our Outreach Program on American Art this fall thanks to the \$57,450 granted to us by the North Dakota State Legislature. The following outlines our accomplishments:

**Audience Research**

We contracted with Insight to Action, LLC to conduct an audience survey of North Dakota and Minnesota educators. The survey was completed in May 2010, and we have used the findings to shape the development of our outreach program. This part of the project was funded by another grant source.

**Plains Art Cases**

The artwork, hands-on objects, and educational media for the Plains Art Cases have all been purchased. Our former Curator of Outreach contracted with David Bradley to produce three original works of art for the cases. She also traveled to several Pow-Wows to obtain authentic Native American objects and artwork for the cases. The Art Case program was promoted to North Dakota and Minnesota schools in April 2010. The accompanying Art Case Schedule spreadsheet shows the North Dakota schools that booked Art Cases for the 2010-2011 school year.

**Learning Posters**

Two Learning Poster reproductions of artwork by David P. Bradley were printed, and we have already received teacher requests for them from all over the U.S. The reproductions are of the paintings *Chippewa Family* and *Guilty of Being Indian (Mankato)*. Five copies of these two posters, along with Bradley's *Pow-Wow Princess in the Process of Acculturation*, are sent with the associated Art Cases for classrooms to keep.

**Interactive Education Website**

Interpretive/curricular material is available in the Art Cases and on our new interactive website. There have been some technical difficulties in getting the site functional and linked to the Museum's website, but it can be accessed at [www.plainsart.org/learnonline](http://www.plainsart.org/learnonline). We are working with Sandbox Studios to further enhance the interactive site with videos and images from our permanent collection and the Minnesota Historical Society. A "contribute" section allows teachers and students to share artwork and lesson plans.

**Evaluation**

We send out evaluation forms with the Art Cases and will compile written and oral evaluative input from teachers, students, and museum staff throughout the year. Modifications will be implemented in summer 2011.

Agency 709 – House Bill 1010  
Senate Testimony of Janine Webb  
March 2, 2011

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Senate Appropriations Committee, my name is Janine Webb and I am the Executive Director for the North Dakota Council on the Arts. Thank you for the opportunity today to present the proposed 2011-13 budget for our agency and to answer any questions you might have regarding House Bill 1010.

Our agency will celebrate its 45<sup>th</sup> year in the next biennium. In 1965 the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) was created and with it, a requirement that each state establish an agency capable of accepting NEA federal arts funding and dispersing those funds throughout the state. The initial funding in 1967 included a federal planning grant for \$25,000 to survey the arts in North Dakota. In 1972 the agency received its first state appropriation. Our agency currently has five (5) FTE's and one (1) Part-time temporary staff person. Agency policies and procedures are governed by a nine-member board of directors appointed by the Governor for five year terms. The board members represent the eight regions of the state, with one additional member-at-large. The agency's mission is "to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the arts in North Dakota."

Approximately 70% of the agency total budget is redirected to North Dakota communities, schools, non-profit organizations and individuals through its grant programs and partnership projects. A copy of the NDCA biennial operating budget is included with our testimony, as is a copy of the most recent fiscal year grant budget. The grant budgets are determined at the start of each fiscal year upon receipt of information regarding funding levels from the National Endowment for the Arts.

In this biennium the NDCA updated its three-year strategic plan. Methodology

included an online constituent survey, four regional community meetings, individual interviews, and planning sessions with the board and staff. An arts planning consultant, Dreeszen and Associates, assisted the Council and conducted all of the interviews. An invitation to participate in the online survey went to 800 names on our constituent e-mail list and included artists, leaders of nonprofit cultural organizations, patrons, and educators. Survey invitations were also posted in newsletters and on the NDCA website. Fifty-four percent (54%) of individuals receiving the invitation responded. Nearly 90% of respondents felt the top three priorities included (1) arts education opportunities, 2) support for community arts organizations, and 3) project funding support. The new strategic plan, also included in your information, incorporates all three of these priorities. Primary goals of the plan are 1) developing strong leadership, 2) developing greater grass-roots awareness and advocacy, 3) advancing the arts in Pre K-12 education and providing lifelong learning in the arts, and 4) building stronger North Dakota communities through the arts.

In the field of arts education, the Council has focused on continued improvement and expansion of a professional development program for teaching artists. *Artist to Artist* is a program developed in partnership with the Perpich Center for Arts Education in Minnesota and the Minnesota State Arts Board. This professional development program uses the power of collaborative inquiry to examine the work that artists do in order to develop deeper understandings of artists' planning, instruction, and reflection strategies. Experienced facilitators guide *Artist to Artist* participants in ways that allow them to share teaching and learning practices with each other, to discover mentoring and partnering opportunities with other teaching artists, and to build bridges to arts

organizations and schools. The *Artist to Artist* program has been incredibly successful and we are now training ND peer coaches through regular sessions with Perpich Center peer coaches, the Perpich Center Arts Education Partnership Coordinator, and the Education Director from our agency. We now have a cadre of peer coaches within the state that are ready to train additional teaching artists and arts educators in using the *Artist to Artist* methodology. Tennessee was recently awarded an Arts in Education dissemination model grant employing the Artist to Artist model over the next four years.

In efforts to develop an early childhood program that involves the arts, in 2008 the NDCA Education Director met with members of the state Human Services and the North Dakota Child Care Resources and Referral (CCR&R) to develop a plan for integrating the arts into preschool programs. This partnership has resulted in annual workshops presented by the Wolf Trap Institute. In a second effort to reach out to early education programs, the NDCA worked with the Department of Human Services to establish arts programming in the Head Start program. Those efforts have led to a Bismarck Head Start SALT (Schools and Artists as Learning Teams) grant, a grant program that supports and strengthens partnerships between schools, community arts organizations and artists.

Another partnership currently being developed with Prairie Public Television and the National Young Audiences Network will supplement a literacy program in pre-K classrooms through collaboration with the PBS series "Between the Lions." This effort begins this month at Four Winds School in Ft. Totten and includes sequential classroom sessions with a teaching artist helping students become better readers through structured arts-based learning activities.

Funding this biennium for CulturePulse.org, an online program for arts promotion, has made it available to all regions of the state. Our partners include four regional arts councils and represent the four quadrants of the state. This is an excellent method for building arts awareness and for promoting North Dakota arts organizations, artists, and helping state tourism. The program allows organizations and artists to feature their cultural events within each region and to promote their work to a broader audience. Our budget request for 2011-13 includes funding to do a statewide marketing plan for the program. This is a necessary next step to increase the public's knowledge of the online program and increase its use. The Grand Forks region is currently able to pay nearly all expenses of the program through advertising; we expect that to be the case in all other regions of the state once the program is well established in each region. This program provides visitors and residents alike with potential activities during their visits within North Dakota.

Specific partnerships have been developed and partially funded through our agency. Those include the following:

- **Read ND** – <http://www.readnd.org> - This partnership between the State Historical Society of ND, ND Humanities Council, State Library Association, NDCA, and Prairie Public Broadcasting has a mission of celebrating and promoting literature created in and about North Dakota. Each year in the next biennium ReadND will select ten newly published books by North Dakota authors (or books relating to ND.) Two authors will make public presentations on either his/her book or on their writing style, accompanied by classroom presentations, public workshops, and/or lectures.
- **Art for Life** – In this program, NDCA has partnered with local arts groups and their community assisted living center or nursing home. Artists bring hands-on learning projects to the centers over a period of several months. The program has been very successful in changing the outlook of senior residents by reducing boredom, feelings of helplessness, and loneliness. This biennium our agency conducted the program in five communities (Jamestown, Langdon, New Rockford, New Town and Pekin.) The \$15,000 in increased funding this biennium allowed for the addition of both New Rockford and New Town. The success of the program is indicated by the ND Long Term Care Association

recognition of a Best Practices Award to the Art for Life program in New Town. As the program produces positive results, the Council does see more commitment from the care facilities; the program is designed to allow each program to eventually become self-sufficient, allowing for further expansion of the program.

- **Arts ND** - For the past two years the NDCA has brought together arts leaders from throughout the state to discuss statewide priorities, especially the need for more public awareness and advocacy for local arts projects. As a result of those meetings, Arts North Dakota (AND) was formed. This fledgling membership organization also serves as the umbrella for ND Arts Alliance and CulturePulse.org. Arts ND will partner with the NDCA in presenting the next statewide arts conference and the Governor's Awards for the Arts.
- **Prairie Public Broadcasting** – This strategic partnership has allowed NDCA to promote Council programs, promote ND artists, and produce numerous documentaries. This past year six ND artists were featured in documentaries. Four were produced in partnership with The Bush Foundation on each of four Bush Fellowship recipients. Another of documentaries on photographer Wayne Gudmundson has received a Midwest regional Emmy award for 2010. Two documentaries featured immigrants to the state, one from Armenia and the other a group from the Sudan.
- **ND Dance Tour** – The NDCA partners with local arts organizations to plan an annual professional dance tour. Each tour is comprised of both an evening performance and a week of residency work in local public schools/colleges and where possible, local dance groups. Surrounding rural communities are always included and asked to participate in the residency program.
- **Summer Institutes for Educators** are held in partnership with the State Historical Society of ND, North Dakota State University K-20 Technology, North Dakota Forest Service, North Dakota Geographic Alliance, and Knife River Indian Villages National Historic Site. NDCA collaborates with these organizations to provide standards based curriculum resources and professional development for teachers. NDCA has also partnered with these organizations to provide educators technology training. The 2010 Summer Institute provided training in the use of a flip camera and how to create a podcast for classroom use.
- **Amtrak and The National Park Service** – NDCA has partnered with these national agencies to put ND folk artists on Amtrak between Minot, ND, and Shelby, MT. This is a part of the NPS Trails and Rails program and has been successfully run since 2002. Troyd Geist, our agency Folklorist, made a presentation to the annual NPS Trails and Rails conference in 2009. NPS would like to replicate this successful program on other lines within the United States.
- **ND Parks and Recreation** – For the past two years we have partnered with the state parks department to put artists in the state parks for a one-week residency. The first year included two visual artists and in 2010 artists included an author, a photographer, and a printmaker.

In addition to these projects, the Council has funded eleven (11) grant programs: Institutional Support, operating support for major arts organizations; Teacher Incentive, Artist-in-Residence, and Schools and Artists as Learning Teams (SALT), all arts-in-education grants; Community Arts Access, for communities of less than 6,000 in population or organizations with special constituencies; Special Project, utilized by not-for-profits, schools, and communities; Individual Artist Fellowship; Professional Development; Folk Arts Apprenticeship; Technical Support; and Presenter Support, for arts projects in communities larger than 6,000 in population. All grant applications are funded through a panel review process. So far in this biennium eighty (80) North Dakota communities have received funding support in excess of \$2,000,000.00 through agency grant programs. Individual grantee reports show a range of 1 participant (professional development) to 100,000 participants (Fargo Theatre.) In the information before you is a listing of grant fund recipients, their grant amounts and the number of participants in their programs. Two of our grants have rolling deadlines so there will be additional grantees before the biennium ends.

Excluding the federal stimulus funds, general funds accounted for 45% of the total agency budget. The stimulus funds were expended within the first year of the biennium with \$285,000.00 given to arts organizations for job preservation and \$5000.00 retained by the agency for operating support.

The Council produces a tri-annual newsletter that is supplemented by nine e-news updates. The website contains state, regional and national information and links to state and national arts related organizations and agencies. Information on our agency, its grant

programs, publications and recordings, strategic plan, previous newsletters, and more is also on our site.

On April 5-6, 2011 the Council will partner with Arts North Dakota in providing professional development and networking opportunities through a statewide arts conference. This partnership will host the 19<sup>th</sup> biennial Governors Awards for the Arts on April 6<sup>th</sup>, recognizing arts leadership in our state. This is our chance to celebrate organizations, businesses and individuals that make a difference in our communities through the arts! This year's winners include The Hotel Donaldson, Fargo; Hardy Lieberg, Minot; Northern Lights Arts Council, Langdon; North Valley Arts Council, Grand Forks; and Sleepy Hollow Summer Theatre, Bismarck. Other Council sponsored activities include the annual tree lighting ceremony, placement of ND artwork in the Capitol building, cultural booth participation at the ND Tourism conference and support of Marketplace art programs. This year the Council has also published the book *Sundogs and Sunflowers: Folklore and Folk Art of the Northern Great Plains*. This book represents a concerted effort to remedy the lack of attention on the folk traditions of North Dakota and the Northern Great Plains. All fifty-three counties in North Dakota are represented in this book. Traditions from the prairies of South Dakota, western Minnesota, eastern Montana, northeastern Wyoming, and the Canadian provinces of Alberta, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan also are included. Made available to the public on December 9<sup>th</sup>, the agency has already sold over 1,000 copies. The book has been submitted to Choice Magazine and the Library Journal for critical public review.

The Icelandic Exchange has now completed eight (8) years of school residencies alternating between Hella, Iceland and Cavalier, ND. This biennium the exchange also included two exhibitions. The first, *Into the Tussock: Contemporary Icelandic Art*, featuring five Icelandic artists was held at the ND Museum of Art and is currently touring the state. The second, *A Considered View*, the photography of North Dakota artist Wayne Gudmundson is currently on exhibit at the Reykjavik Museum of Photography in Iceland.

The Council operating budget request for 2011-13 is much the same as this biennium with a difference of only \$3,530, of which \$1,261 is a rent increase. The remaining increase is due to the replacement of three computers recommended in our IT plan. In the grants line, the agency is requesting general funds of an additional \$20,000 for two - three new Art for Life programs and a one-time appropriation of \$15,000 to fund a marketing plan and its implementation for the four regional CulturePulse sites. The Governor's budget included the NDCA full request and I would ask that the Senate Appropriations Committee do so as well, removing the amendments put in place by the House of Representatives to withhold funding for the Poet Laureate position stating no one reads poetry anymore (1,618 ND high school students participated in Poetry Out Loud this year), remove \$20,000 from the NDCA operating budget (travel is increasingly more expensive and already near impossible in some areas of the state,) and remove \$15,000 for the marketing plan for CulturePulse.org., basically nullifying the results of the current biennial funding.

Council staff continue to participate at regional and national levels by serving as panelists for other states and the NEA and as presenters, sharing our innovative programs with other states. The director serves as a board member for Arts Midwest, a nine-state regional arts organization; the Arts Education Director serves on the National Assembly of State Arts Agency's (NASAA) arts education advisory group, our Folklorist and the Executive Director serve on the NASAA folk arts advisory board, and staff members presented program information to their various peer groups at the NASAA annual conference held last October in Austin, Texas.

In November, the Governor's Institute invited our agency to attend a regional informational meeting in Denver with federal representatives of HUD, EPA, DOT, and NPS outlining their grant programs. Each state team was asked to prepare a project based on the information gleaned at the meeting. The ND team will be developing a planning grant to research statewide opportunities for community economic development through the arts. A model program from Paducah, KY (pop. 25,000) was presented at the meeting, outlining how the arts have transformed a great portion of the community with over 50 artists moving to Paducah through a massive advertising campaign. They have renovated decaying buildings and rejuvenated the tax rolls, demonstrating the positive power the arts can have on local economies. ND is now recognized for its quality of life, safe cities, employment opportunities, and reasonable cost of living. It's a great time to attract new residents and the arts can be a part of that.

No major changes in our agency are anticipated in the next biennium with the exception of the Arts Education director, a crucial staff member, retiring after 23 years of

service to the state. Finding and retaining future leadership, as baby boomers retire, will be crucial for organizations across the state and this is especially true in the non-profit sector, which is almost always behind the for-profit sector in terms of benefits and salary.

Our agency will be focusing attention on professional development for statewide leadership and working in greater partnership with other state agencies and state organizations in an effort to assure dynamic and productive arts non-profits will assist in providing future development of North Dakota communities.

Thank you for the opportunity to share with you a few of our agency activities and future plans. Thank you also for your past support of the arts and this agency. The total budget request and executive recommendation for our agency includes:

The state of North Dakota has a deep sense of pride in the cultural and artistic heritage of the state. We believe in supporting the artistic endeavors of our citizens and in preserving the heritage of our past. In many cases, those endeavors are one and the same. The preservation of our heritage and the advancement of the arts in our communities and schools has been the focus of our state arts agency. The NDCA has offered an array of programs and projects that include traditional arts, community arts, arts education, and lifelong arts for the elderly that have touched the lives of all citizens of our state. This report addresses the strengths and challenges faced by the arts in North Dakota.

**Arts Education:** As we know, there is a solid base of research that proves that learning in and through the arts not only enhances student learning, but also prepares them for the career opportunities of the present and future. While the arts have been proven to be a primary conduit to successful careers, they are inconsistently provided in the educational systems statewide. Students in larger school districts have a greater opportunity to learn through the arts, however, our rural communities struggle to support an arts program of any kind.

The NDCA grants programs offer a variety of ways for schools to offer the arts in our schools. Grants support artists in residence who teach specific artistic methods, as well as funds to help classroom teachers integrate the arts into their curriculum, making learning more efficient and effective in all subject areas. The NDCA grants programs also offer teachers and professionals support to attend professional development opportunities focused on their art form, and/or teaching through the arts.

These programs are essential to the health of the public schools and the success of the students of our state – especially in the rural areas. The opportunities for students to work with an artist, or learn through an arts infused curriculum, allows students to experience learning at a deeper level and broadens the spectrum of career options open to students – careers of today and tomorrow that depend on the ability to solve problems from a variety of perspectives, to work as a team with co-workers, and to focus fully and implement a plan for completion of a project.

**Artist to Artist:** NDCA has been a part of creating a statewide network of professionals who can assist arts organizations, teachers, and artists, evaluate a project, assess techniques, gather information from other professionals, and teach students how to evaluate their own work. The Artist to Artist program is an unprecedented partnership between two state agencies, ND and MN arts organizations, and numerous professionals that has benefited countless artists, arts administrators, arts educators and classroom teachers across our region. ND organizations have and will continue to benefit from the work of professional facilitators who have been trained to identify areas of concern, guide discussion using the reflective protocols, and help participants make decisions concerning their work. More importantly, Artist to Artist is a non-threatening, positive approach to student evaluation that gives students a model to follow for problem solving in their lives that is non-judgmental, productive, and leads to a stronger project outcome.

**Partnerships:** The NDCA has been an integral and essential partner in bringing national partnerships to our state. With matching funding and project grants, students and citizens of ND can participate in national projects that are occurring across the country. Currently, NDCA is partnering with the ND Alliance for Arts Education to implement a grant from the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. The grant is focused on a “town hall” approach to assessing the successes and needs of arts education in four communities across our state. The grant focuses on cities, rural communities, tribal schools, and consolidated schools, hosting regional conversations with leaders in education, the arts, business, and local government. Results will be shared with each community and the communities are encouraged to act on the action plans prepared during the discussions.

The NDCA created a task force of statewide leaders to discuss the need for a statewide support organization that focuses on advancing the arts in ND, as well as serving as an umbrella organization for other arts related statewide organizations. Arts North Dakota was the recommendation of the two year task force. Arts ND is a 501c3 organization with the mission of advancing the arts of ND. Arts ND will partner with NDCA in projects such as the annual conference; regional networking opportunities; professional development opportunities for artists, arts administrators and educators; the development of statewide partnerships; and CulturePulse, the statewide network of electronic websites promoting the arts.

**Conclusion:** The arts of North Dakota not only express and define our heritage, but they express and define our future. The arts contribute to community development, economic development, career development and educational strength. The presence of the arts in ND provides a quality of life that entices corporate expansion and community stability. The inclusion of the arts prepares our students for careers in our creative economy, in all sectors of society including math, science, and other creative fields.

The NDCA is the only agency effectively addressing the arts in education, the arts in communities, and the arts for life. I strongly encourage you, as Senators, and as concerned citizens, to reinstate the NDCA funding to the level sought in the original budget submitted to the House.
