#### House Bill No. 1065

We are supporting amending §29-07-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code to clarify that not only must a city pay for indigent defense for city cases in city or municipal court, and cases from city court that get transferred to district court, but also for appeals or post conviction matters resulting from a violation of a municipal ordinance.

This bill merely clarifies that the city, in a city court matter, is responsible for indigent defense costs in city court cases from beginning to end; the end being a possible appeal or post conviction matter. Right now the statute is silent on the post trial proceedings, and this amendment will speak clearly on the issue of the financial responsibility.

## Testimony by Commission on Legal Counsel for Indigents Senate Judiciary Committee, February 16, 2011

The Commission on Legal Counsel for Indigents supports amending §29-07-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code to clarify that not only must a city pay for indigent defense for city cases in city or municipal court, and cases from city court that get transferred to district court for a jury trial, but also for cases transferred to district court pursuant to 40-18-06.2, and for any appeals or post conviction matters resulting from a violation of a municipal ordinance.

This bill merely clarifies that the city, in a prosecution for violation of a municipal ordinance, is responsible for indigent defense costs from beginning to end; the end being any possible appeal or post conviction matter.
