Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

Relating to the disposition of property used for county fairs and to the filing of agricultural fair exhibition dates.

Minutes:

Vice Chairman Kingsbury, Co-Sponsor: This is a clean-up bill from the Dept of Ag. Section 1 changes one word "may" on line 13 and puts it on line 14. I don't think it changes the intent of the bill.

Section 2 is repealed. It relates to the filing of agricultural fair exhibition dates, making it unnecessary to notify the Agricultural Commissioner on fair dates any more.

Representative Mueller: The repealer is about having county fairs file their dates of the county fair with the Ag. Dept.?

Vice Chairman Kingsbury: Yes.

Representative Mueller: And we've been doing that?

Vice Chairman Kingsbury: It has fallen off. Thus, the clean up.

Representative Mueller: We're going to codify what we have been doing already.

Vice Chairman Kingsbury: The rest of the bill talks about what you would do if the county fair failed to hold a fair two years in a row. If you don't hold a fair two years in a row, then you need to dispose of your property. It should go back to the discretion of the Board of County Commissioners.

Chuck Fleming, Business Development Director, ND Dept. of Agriculture: Let me read the language that you are repealing in Section 2. Current language says: The secretary or other executive officer of every county or district fair association, or other exhibition at which the resources or products of the state are displayed, shall file with the agriculture commissioner, on or before May first of each year, the dates on which such fair or exhibition will be held, together with the name of the place where the same will be held

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and the name of the president and secretary of such association. Failure to comply with this section shall be an infraction.

That is the section you are eliminating. The first part of the bill is simply saying that since you are removing 4-02-06, you have to renumber the lines accordingly. Anita Thomas also says "may" is in the wrong place.

Fairs that did file with my office then sat on my desk. Currently the ND Association of Fairs has a website www.nd.fairs.org. Those fair dates are on their website. We have a link to that site on our Dept. of Ag. website. I think it is too much to ask fairs associations to send in their dates to us.

Chairman Johnson: The intent of the original law was so there would be a statewide acknowledment of fair dates around the state?

Chuck Fleming: The Governor of ND has declared 2011 the year of the fair. Our dept. is going to make a special effort to promote fairs because that is the show place of agriculture.

Vice Chairman Kingsbury: The fair to go to is the oldest fair in Pembina County.

Chuck Fleming: That will be the 119th continuous fair this summer.

Representative Boe: Section 4-02-06. Was there anything in there that required approval of that date or was it just to file it?

Chuck Fleming: Just to file it. There is no approval required.

Representative Mueller: Who owns the fairgrounds now?

Chuck Fleming: The Fair Association which a nonprofit organization owns the grounds in some counties. It is a wide variety of ownership.

Representative Trottier: How many county fairs are there in ND?

Chuck Fleming: There are 33 are listed. There are about 30 some.

Representative Boe: Moved Do Pass

Vice Chairman Kingsbury: Seconded the motion

Chairman Cook opened the hearing on HB 1341.

Representative Kingsbury – I'm bringing this bill forward for the Ag Department. HB 1341 relates to the disposition of property used for county fairs. It changes one word, "may" without changing the intent. When a county fair fails to hold a fair within the county for 2 successive years, any property on hand may be sold and the proceeds of such a sale may be transferred to the county general fund. Also there is a provision making it unnecessary to notify the Ag Commissioner of fair dates, previously they would have to notify the Ag Department of the dates of the upcoming fair. It's just a cleanup and makes those 2 little changes.

Chairman Cook - There is no problem we are trying to solve?

Representative Kingsbury - It's just a matter of clarification.

Chuck Fleming, North Dakota Department of Agriculture – I am here to testify in favor of the bill.

He went on to read section 2.

Chuck Fleming, North Dakota Department of Agriculture – Like Representative Kingsbury said, this is just to clean up the language. This is old language that is no longer needed.
