Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

Establishes provisions for recovery of medical assistance paid after an individual is determined to be permanently institutionalized or reaches age 55.

Minutes:

Chairman Weisz: Opened the hearing on HB 2074.

**Curtis Volesky:** Director of Medicaid Eligibility testified in support of the bill. (See Testimony #1.)

**Chairman Weisz:** Say you were in the institution for 3 or 4 months, but haven't been determined to be permanently institutionalized, under current law it would only start when the determination was made; where this would start when they go into the institution. Is that correct?

**Curtis:** Somebody has to be in the facility for six months before we can determine if they are permanently institutionalized.

Chairman Weisz: So they have a minimum of 6 months to start with.

Curtis: Correct.

Chairman Weisz: At the minimum it could be even longer or is that when you make that determination?

**Curtis:** We would make the determination at 6 months. And if they leave, it would go away.

Chairman Weisz: So this will cover those 6 months?

Curt: Correct.

**Rep. Holman:** Last session we had a bill that bumped the amount of money that could be set aside for funeral expenses to \$6,000. This one says \$3,000 and I was wondering if that is an inconsistency or if there is a reason for that.

Curt: I'll have Jonathan answer that one.

**Jonathan Alm:** Attorney for DHS. The last session the law that was changed was ND Century Code 50-24.1-02.3 and that did increase the set aside for preneed burial contract up to \$6,000. This in 50-24.1-07 remained the same. It was \$3,000. Medicaid recipients that did not put any money aside; the state can spend up to \$3,000 only.

## Testimony Senate Bill 2074 - Department of Human Services Senate Human Services Committee Senator Judy Lee, Chairman January 11, 2011

Chairman Lee, members of the Human Services Committee, I am Curtis Volesky, Director of Medicaid Eligibility for the Department of Human Services. I am here in support of Senate Bill 2074.

This bill provides for a correction to subsection 1 of N.D.C.C. 50-24.1-07, based on information received from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

This statute establishes provisions for recovery of medical assistance paid after an individual is determined to be permanently institutionalized or reaches age 55. For permanently institutionalized individuals, the statute only provides for recovery of benefits paid after the date the individual has been determined to be permanently institutionalized.

The relevant federal statute, 42 U.S.C. § 1396p(b)(1)(A), makes no distinction between assistance provided before or after the determination of permanent institutionalization. CMS confirmed that the date on which an individual is determined to be permanently institutionalized does not affect which expenditures must be recovered from the individual's estate; estate recovery must include assistance furnished prior to the time the individual was determined to be permanently institutionalized.

The amendment is requested to eliminate the disparity between the state and federal statutes and to support what is required by CMS in our Medicaid State Plan.
