Vice Chairman Sorvaag opened the public hearing on SB 2118.

Connie Sprynczynatyk: North Dakota League of Cities. I'm only rising to support the concept of this bill. My understanding of the bill is that we are trying to accomplish situations like the Northwood tornado and other sudden need for volunteer situations there can be a bit of a gap in coverage of those volunteers and I believe that is what this bill attempted to do. When Bismarck/Mandan flood threat in 2009 that was the first time that the river had threaten since 1953 when the Dam closed. We had tremendous number of volunteers at sandbag central at the Civic Center. Because we registered those volunteers for WSI coverage under that volunteer program. In the immediate aftermath of the Northwood tornado the City Auditor and everyone else had their hands more than full.

Senator Cook: Did your husband speak of any ideas to have this bill pulled?

Connie Sprynczynatyk: That is what I heard and that is why I am simply bookmarking the concept. The North Dakota League of Cities since 2003 when homeland security funds came to each state. Every state was given money to implement the Citizen Core Programs and the most active program is community emergency response training. Those people are trained in basic first aid and rescue. They are then hooked into the emergency response system so if something happen in a neighborhood there are people there prior to the first responders. In the case of the Northwood tornado some people came from various surrounding communities.
