Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

A bill to provide an appropriation to the parks and recreation department for recreational leadership and facilities grants.

**Co-Chairman Grindberg** called the committee hearing to order on SB 2239. Roll call was taken. Sheila M. Sandness - Legislative Council; Joe Morrissette - OMB.

Dana Scharr, Executive Director, ND Recreation and Parks Association
Said that Ron Merritt was originally going to testify, but was still on the road and conditions are not good, so she introduced Cole Higlin with the Mandan Park District

Cole Higlin (filling in for Ron Merritt, Legislative Chair, ND Recreation & Parks Association - NDRPA)

Testimony attached - # 2 - ND Outdoor Recreation Facility Community Grant Program 2009-11

Reading from testimony -

**Senator Bowman** said your request was for \$750,000, and you received \$400,000 in the last biennium? What is the huge increase?

**Cole Higlin** said they've had more requests than money was available. A playground equipment package 25 years ago could've been purchased for around \$20-25,000. Today the playgrounds at most schools are about \$75-100,000 materials alone.

Senator Wardner asked what other projects would this money have been spent on.

Cole Higlin referred to attached testimony # 2 which gave a breakdown of all the projects that were awarded in 2009-10. They've had a lot of funding requests with total project costs of \$3.5 M.

Senator Bowman asked what a dog park was and Cole Higlin said it's a park that allows residents to let their dog off the leash and run within a park.

### Senator David Oehlke, District 15

**Senator Oehlke** sponsored the bill and said it was brought to him by their local park district. A similar bill was brought before the legislature last session and was allowed \$400,000 as a matching grant for projects. It was left out of the Governor's Executive Budget this year, so this bill is requesting that it be put back in. He asked the committees favorable support.

Senator Kilzer: In the Governor's Executive Budget and any other sources, the sum is \$0?

**Senator Oehlke**: Yes. There was no number figured about where the money should come from.

**Ron Merritt** (entering room), Legislative Chair, NDRPA Testified in favor of SB 2239.

Ron Merritt's testimony had been read but he wanted to ask the committee for their favorable support. the Minot Park District was a recipient of a recreational grant and they were able to use the money as well as local dollars to complete the \$200,000 project with a \$75,000 grant. It would be a great help to put this in the budget.

**Senator Bowman** asked if this bill was passed, would they then need a maintenance budget. How are they planning to take care of it?

Ron Merritt said they are able to keep up at this point, but being a city in the west, they are seeing extreme growth. They wouldn't be able to build a playground like that on their own, and the help was definitely appreciated.

Senator Grindberg closed the hearing on SB 2239.

**Senator Krebsbach** said when the bill came in there was a request for \$750,000 and we are now looking at \$400,000. This is a program that has been ongoing a few years and was not included in the Governor's Executive Budget. This is a program that is on a matching basis to Parks throughout the state. It has gone to a number of different areas — even schools have used it in playground areas that has become community playground areas. It is that little extra boost for smaller communities to get projects done within their area.

Senator Krebsbach listed several communities who received grants.

A Roll Call vote was taken. Yea: 13 Nay: 0 Absent: 0 Motion carried.

Vote 2 Senator Krebsbach moved Do Pass as Amended on SB 2239. Senator O'Connell seconded.

A Roll Call vote was taken. Yea: 6 Nay: 7 Absent: 0 Motion failed.

Senator Grindberg will carry the bill.



Testimony of Ron Merritt, Legislative Chair for the North Dakota Recreation & Park Association
To Senate Appropriations Committee
In Support of SB 2239, Recreational Leadership and Facilities Grant


Chairman Holmberg and Members of the Committee, my name is Ron Merritt, and I am legislative chair for the North Dakota Recreation & Park Association (NDRPA) and director of the Minot Park District. NDRPA represents more than 500 members across the state, including park board members and park district staff, and works to advance parks and recreation for quality of life in North Dakota. I am here on behalf of NDRPA in support of Senate Bill 2239.

This community grant program is modeled after a federal program, the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF), which has provided funding for the acquisition and development of public land for outdoor recreation and open space since 1964. The fund provides 50/50 matching grants-in-aid to states and their political subdivisions.

This state grant program is essential because federal funding from Land and Water has been drastically reduced, from a high of \$369 million in 1979 to less than \$38 million in 2010. This means North Dakota's funding has been reduced from a high of \$3 million to about \$225,000 last year. The parks community grant program would fund new development of and enhancements to North Dakota parks and recreation facilities that are valuable community infrastructure, including playgrounds, pools, multi-purpose fields and trails. Further, the state's return-on-investment is high with these projects, as local communities often invest more funds than the required 50/50 match.

NDRPA asks for continuing support for the recreational leadership and facilities matching grant program, which received \$400,000 in the last biennium. Although not included in this year's executive budget, the program leverages state and local funds to increase much needed outdoor recreation opportunities in both rural and urban communities across the state.

With the state's strong economy, now is the time to support investment in public parks and recreation in North Dakota with a DO PASS recommendation on SB 2239. North Dakota needs to keep being proactive in expanding public parks and recreation programs and facilities that enhance quality of life and help attract and keep families to our state. Thank you.



The matching grant program received 50 applications for the 2009-2011 biennium, requesting \$1,702,852 in grant funding with total project costs (or recreational need) of \$3,545,673. With the \$400,000 in state funding, 11 projects were funded, a few of which were not fully funded the 50 percent match they requested.
