Senator G. Lee opened the hearing on SB 2287 relating to emergency lights on response vehicles.

Tom Trenbeath, North Dakota Chief Deputy Attorney General, introduced SB 2287. The office of Attorney General consists of thirteen divisions and the largest is BCI, Bureau of Criminal Investigation. He said that the division has forty special agents. They have a fleet of vehicles that are separate and apart from the state fleet. It would be difficult to do an undercover operation with a state license plate. He said that they are the only law enforcement agency that is not mentioned in statue as allowing emergency lights on the vehicles. It would be nice for BCI to have the ability to use these emergency lights if needed. He said that they are asking the North Dakota Legislature to correct what he thinks would be considered an oversight.

Senator Lee asked if there was money in the budget for this.

Mr. Trenbeath answered yes. He said there are some special funds that have to do with forfeitures of properties from drug arrest. He said that the lights would not be permanent lights but something they could put on as needed.

No Opposing Testimony.

Senator Lee closed the hearing on SB 2287.

Senator Nething moved a Do Pass.

Senator Oehlke seconded the motion.

Roll call vote 6-0-0. Motion passed.

Senator Nething will carry the bill.

Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

SB 2287 is a bill relating to emergency lights on response vehicles.

Minutes:

Tom Trenbeath, Chief Deputy Attorney General for North Dakota introduced SB 2287. He stated that his law enforcement agency is the only one that doesn't have the ability to put red lights on their cars and exceed the speed limit when they have them on. This bill will add The Bureau of Criminal Investigation to the list of Class A authorized vehicles. He feels that they will not be used often, but in an emergency situation it will be nice to have the ability to use lights and sirens.

Chairman Ruby: There may be a situation when someone is doing an investigation, and they may need to follow someone at a high speed. Would they use a portable red light on the dash?

Tom Trenbeath: Yes, exactly. An example might be if an agent needed backup, he would want them to get there is a hurry.

Representative R. Kelsch moved a DO PASS on SB 2287. Vice Chairman Weiler seconded the motion.
