

Explanation or reason for introduction of bill/resolution:

This bill is to raise the damage disclosure threshold to account for the increasing value of motor vehicles and the escalating costs of repair.

Chairman Senator G. Lee opened the hearing on SB 2328 relating to body damage disclosure on titles to motor vehicles.

Senator Larson, District 3, introduced SB 2328. He said that the bill had been resurrected from last session. It deals with the section on motor vehicle damage disclosures. Currently, if you receive eight thousand dollars damage on a vehicle, your title on your vehicle is tagged to have a damaged title. When the vehicle is resold the price is reduced because of the damage tag. As a result of inflation, eight thousand dollars damage isn't very much. This bill is to raise the damage disclosure threshold to account for the increasing value of motor vehicles and the escalating costs of repair. Also, there was a change to go from "forty" percent to "fifty" percent. After visiting with some different groups he is amending it back to "forty" because forty percent is in sequence with the twelve thousand dollar inflationary steps. Amendment #11.0774.01001

Jay Lundeen, Jerome's Body Shop INC., Minot, ND testified in support of SB 2328. He stated, "This bill does not affect me." "It affects the consumer." "I fix a car, whether it has a damage title or not." "I get my money either way." He believes that the way the law is presently written; it hurts the honest people and rewards the dishonest. The honest person checks the box if they have sustained damage over the eight thousand or 40%. The dishonest person doesn't check the box that they have had that damage. He passed out a copy of Minnesota Statutes and explained it. Attachment #1. He also gave examples of actual car damage estimate to show how little damage it takes to get to eight thousand dollars. He thinks it should be at 70 percent; the same as in Minnesota but at least the fifty percent and the twelve thousand dollars.

Senator Nodland asked that if we increase this, will that increase the price of repair.

Mr. Lundeen replied that it would not make any difference.

Discussion/Action

Chairman Senator G. Lee opened the discussion on SB 2328 relating to body damage disclosure on titles to motor vehicles.

Senator Oehlke said that he isn't so sure that he disagrees with the way the laws are written now at eight thousand dollars damage and forty percent of pre-damaged retail value.

Senator Lee commented that an amendment has been offered to SB 2328 to bring it back to the forty percent.

Senator Sitte said that we might offer a compromise of ten thousand dollars and keep the forty percent.

Senator Nodland said that he would like to leave the law the way it is.

Senator Mathern was wondering if anyone could comment on the possibility of going to one variable like Minnesota does. What would the consequence of that be?

Senator Nething said that his insight on that is when he looks at the state of Minnesota and what they do; he doesn't know how much he really wants to mimic them. He clarified that this was just a comment.

Senator Oehlke said that he understood the theory behind it but personally, if there is eight thousand dollar damage to a vehicle that he wants to buy, he would like to know about it.

Senator Lee gave the history of when it started and when changes were made. The last time it changed was in 1999. He also said that he would like to know if he was buying a damaged vehicle.

Senator Nodland handed out a chart from Matthew Larsgaard and he showed what will happen if we increase that percentage. He believes this is wrong for consumers. He said

that with the value of vehicles today, maybe that percentage should be down to twenty or thirty percent.

Senator Mathern said that he was not promoting seventy percent he was wondering if there was any value in just using the one variable. He was not suggesting we go any higher.

Senator Oehlke moved a **Do Not Pass**.

Senator Nodland seconded the motion.

Roll call vote: 6-0-0. **Motion passed.**

Senator Oehlke is the carrier.

2010 Minnesota Statutes

325F.6641 DISCLOSURE OF MOTOR VEHICLE DAMAGE.

Subdivision 1. **Damage.** (a) If a motor vehicle has sustained damage by collision or other occurrence which exceeds 70 percent of its actual cash value immediately prior to sustaining damage, the seller must disclose that fact to the buyer, if the seller has actual knowledge of the damage. The amount of damage is determined by the retail cost of repairing the vehicle based on a complete written retail repair estimate or invoice, exclusive of the actual cost incurred to repair, replace, or reinstall inflatable safety restraints and other vehicle components that must be replaced due to the deployment of the inflatable safety restraints.

(b) The disclosure required under this subdivision must be made in writing on the application for title and registration or other transfer document, in a manner prescribed by the registrar of motor vehicles. The registrar shall revise the certificate of title form, including the assignment by seller (transferor) and reassignment by licensed dealer sections of the form, the separate application for title forms, and other transfer documents to accommodate this disclosure. If the seller is a motor vehicle dealer licensed pursuant to section 168.27, the disclosure required by this section must be made orally by the dealer to the prospective buyer in the course of the sales presentation.

(c) Upon transfer and application for title to a vehicle covered by this subdivision, the registrar shall record the term "rebuilt" on the first Minnesota certificate of title and all subsequent Minnesota certificates of title used for that vehicle.

Subd. 2. **Form of disclosure.** The disclosure required in this section must be made in substantially the following form: "To the best of my knowledge, this vehicle has has not sustained damage, exclusive of any costs to repair, replace, or reinstall air bags and other components that were replaced due to deployment of air bags, in excess of 70 percent actual cash value."

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. My name is Matthew Larsgaard and I am appearing in support of the proposed amendments to Senate Bill 2328 on behalf of the Automobile Dealers Association of North Dakota which consists of our state's franchised new car dealers. We would be opposed to the bill as it currently exists. However, Senator Larsen was very willing to address our concerns through the proposed amendment and we would like to extend our sincere appreciation to him.

Body damage disclosure was added to Section 39-05 by the legislative assembly in 1991. It was the result of over two years of discussions among representatives of the various motor vehicle related industries and government regulators. Prior to the 1989 legislative session, the Motor Vehicle Department established an informal "Motor Vehicle Advisory Committee". This committee consisted of the new car dealers, used car dealers, lenders, insurance companies, rebuilders, dismantlers, body shops, Tax Department, Consumer Fraud Division of the Attorney General's Office, Highway Patrol, and the Department of Transportation.

Early meetings of the committee established the fact that problems related to the sale and distribution of damaged vehicles was the most important concern to members of the committee. The genesis of the body damage disclosure law is a result of this committee's work.

During the 1991 legislative session the Director of the Attorney General's Consumer Fraud Section submitted testimony that the Attorney General believed that there is a need for a damage disclosure rule. That, from their perspective, both the consumer and the motor vehicle dealer have a right to know whether or not the vehicle being bought or traded in had been in an accident.

Since 1991 there have been several changes made to Section 39-05-17.2. In almost every case, initiatives were taken to raise the damage disclosure threshold to account for the increasing value of motor vehicles and the escalating costs of repair. In 1991 the threshold was set at \$3,000; in 1997 it was raised to the greater of \$5,000 or 40% of the predamage retail value; in 1999 it was raised to \$8,000 with the 40% language remaining unchanged.

As a result of inflationary trends, we agree that it is once again reasonable to raise the static dollar threshold from \$8,000 to \$12,000. However, the existing 40% threshold automatically adjusts for inflation and any attempts to raise this rate would effectively weaken the damage disclosure law.

Members of the committee, damage disclosure is a **consumer protection issue**. It allows consumers and dealers to have the information they need to make informed decisions about the safety and fair market value of used cars.
