PRESENTATION OF PROCLAMATION BY MAJORITY LEADER CARLSON NDEA's Read Across America Day

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE GRANDE

MR. SPEAKER: The First World War was a major war centered on Europe that began in the summer of 1914. The fighting ended in November 1918. More than 4,700,000 Americans served in the military during World War I. About 53,000 died of combat-related causes, while another 63,000 deaths were listed as non-combat.

Over crossover we lost a living link to an important era in our nation's history. Frank Woodruff Buckles died on February 27, 2011, at the age of 110. Frank Buckles lied about his age to enlist in the Army in 1917, was imprisoned in a Japanese prisoner of war camp for 3 1/2 years during World War II and was the last known U.S. veteran of World War I. Burial with full military honors will be held at Arlington National Cemetery.

So they are all gone now, including the thousands of doughboys who came home to North Dakota after what was called the Great War, the war to make the world safer for democracy, the war to end all wars.

God Bless our Veterans - Past, Present and Future.
