POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE R. KELSCH

MR. SPEAKER: I am honored today to recognize and introduce Coach Randall Herbst and the University of Mary Men's Basketball team. I have had the pleasure of watching seniors Eric Erdman from Fargo, Jordan Wilhelm from Bismarck, Mark Bakkum from Steele, and Justin Belohlavek from Mandan for the past four years and seniors Anthony Moody and Cameron Lee for the past two years. I have watched these players develop into a team, built through hard work and dedication, a sticky defense mixed with a sharpshooter offense, all components that have escalated them to become a success at the NCAA Division II level.

The University of Mary men's basketball team is enjoying a historic season, certainly its most successful year since joining the NCAA just 5 years ago in 2006.

The Marauders will make their first regional tournament appearance this weekend, playing Metro State on Saturday night at 8:30 at the Taylor Center in Mankato. With a current record

of 23-5, the Marauders have posted their most wins in a season since 1986-87. A 16-game win streak this year was the longest since posting 19 in 1981-82.

U-Mary hosted and won a Northern Sun tournament game for the first on Saturday, February 26th, before a near capacity crowd. The Marauders cracked the NABC Division II Coaches Poll for the first time and jumped as high as 14th in the nation.

In the NCAA regional rankings, the Marauders climbed up to third on their way to qualifying for the team's first national tournament appearance since 1981-82.

In addition to the team's success, the Marauders have attained individual recognition. Anthony Moody was named the Northern Sun's Player of the Year after leading the conference in scoring. Today, Moody was also named regional player of the year. This is a very prestigious award that is given to 8 players per year.

Moody and Fargo, ND, native Eric Erdmann both were named to the All-NSIC first team. Erdmann is U-Mary's fourth all-time leading scorer, Moody and Jordan Wilhelm of Bismarck, ND, all scored over 1,000 points in their Marauders career.

And importantly, as a team they average a 3.1 GPA, adding additional balance to the team.

Head coach Randall Herbst was named the Division II Bulletin Coach of the Month for February after the Marauders went undefeated for the month.

The year prior to Herbst taking over the Marauders program, U-Mary won seven games. His first year the Marauders won 15 games in 2009-10 before winning 23 already this season with more games to play.

On behalf of the ND Legislature and the State of ND, I want to wish Coach Herbst and the Marauders the best of luck in the NCAA Division II Tournament. Please join me in congratulating the team and we know that you will represent this state well!
