During the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the payment of extraordinary medical expenses of inmates in correctional facilities, including payment of those expenses through the department of corrections and rehabilitation or other state entity and other cost-management techniques. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly."
