MR. PRESIDENT: Over the weekend, the North Dakota High School Activities Association crowned a new Class B State Girls Basketball Champion. I rise today to offer congratulations to the Carrington Cardinals Girls Basketball team. The Lady Cardinals earned their first ever state basketball title this weekend with their hard-fought win over the Central Cass Squirrels, beating the formidable rival 54 to 46.

Coming into the Girls State B as the sixth ranked team, the Carrington Cardinals worked hard throughout the tournament, defeating Washburn 42-28 in their first game of the tournament and the #2-rated Kenmare Honkers in the semi-final game with an impressive score of 62 to 27.

The Cardinals were led by offensively by Becca Scherr, who scored 13 points in the final quarter alone and 19 points overall. Also demonstrating individual prowess and earning the title of Co-MVP's of the tournament were Emily Thompson and Sierra Rosenau. A district court shall order an individual who refuses to submit a sample of blood or other body fluids for registration purposes to show cause at a specified time and place why the individual should not be required to submit the sample required under this subsection. Within three days after registration, the registering law enforcement agency shall forward the statement, fingerprints, and photograph to the attorney general and shall submit the sample of the individual's blood and body fluids to the state crime laboratory. If an individual required to register under this section has a change in vehicle or computer online identity, the individual shall inform in writing, within three days after the change, the law enforcement agency with which that individual last registered of the individual's new vehicle or computer online identity. If an individual required to register pursuant to this section has a change in name, school, or residence or employment address, that individual shall inform in writing, at least ten days before the change, the law enforcement agency with whom that individual last registered of the individual's new name, school, residence address, or employment address. A change in school or employment address includes the termination of school or employment for which an individual required to register under this section shall inform in writing within five days of the termination the law enforcement agency with whom the individual last registered. The law enforcement agency, within three days after receipt of the information, shall forward it to the attorney general. The attorney general shall forward the appropriate registration data to the law enforcement agency having local jurisdiction of the new place of residence, school, or employment. Upon a change of address, the individual required to register shall also register within three days at the law enforcement agency having local jurisdiction of the new place of residence, school, or employment. The individual registering under this section shall periodically confirm the information required under this subsection in a manner and at an interval determined by the attorney general. A law enforcement agency that has previously registered an

offender may omit the fingerprint portion of the registration if that agency has a set of fingerprints on file for that individual and is personally familiar with and can visually identify the offender. These provisions also apply in any other state that requires registration."
