^{\3} The 2011 Legislative Assembly appropriated \$25.5 million (\$22.0 million in SB2369 and \$3.5 million in SB2016) from the state disaster relief fund for flood-related costs, road grade raising projects, matching grants to political subdivisions, and expenses associated with presidential-declared disasters. Of this amount, \$3.2 million is available for funding specific city flood mitigation projects. As of June 2011, the agency estimates 2011-13 expenses of \$17.5 million for flood disasters, \$3.2 million for the mitigation project, and \$4.8 million for road grade raising and matching grants to political subdivisions.
