Resident of Grand Forks or Polk (MN) County, minimum of 30-days


Household income within 150% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL); e.g. Family of 4: \$33,525

Percentage of Population in Poverty, 2010



North Dakota Health Care Profile, 2008-09




ND and MN Distribution of Population by Federal Poverty Level, 2008–09




GF Emergency Dept. Rates

Rate of Non-Emergent ED Visits (County), 2010




