The largest percentage of NDSCS waivers are institutional waivers:

One, of which 54.5% (625 students) are dual credit students. NDSCS established this waiver in partnership with North Dakota public school districts as a direct benefit for North Dakota high school students and their parents to make college more affordable and more attainable.

The second, 29.5% (337 students) are out-of-state students that are required to live in our residential halls and purchase a meal plan. In 2002 the college was experiencing declining enrollment and a declining number of students living on campus. A new marketing effort was developed and approved by the North Dakota State Board of Higher Education to allow NDSCS to bring out-of-state students to the college at in-state tuition rates providing the student lived in our residential halls and purchased a meal plan. Of these 337 students, 256 or 76% are a resident of boarder states (MN, SD, and MT). This waiver keeps the NDSCS costs in comparison to our out-of-state competitors. (Example: M-State, MN - \$155.40 per credit and Lake Area Technical Institute, SD - \$95.00 per credit, where NDSCS is \$112.05 per credit). Twenty- five percent of NDSCS out-of-state

students remain in North Dakota beyond graduation. This would translate into - NDSCS brought 50 new individuals to North Dakota who are now employed by a business within North Dakota.

This plan accomplished the following established objectives:

- 1. Provided additional entry level technicians for North Dakota Business and Industry.
- 2. Residential Hall occupancy stabilized and increased (2009 862 residents, 2011- 993 residents).
- 3. Additional revenue was generated to assist funding NDSCS's Auxiliary Service buildings
