



- Population growing exponentially.
- Pipelines have already been upsized north and south from the City of Williston.
- Rural water hookup requests have far exceeded original projection having grown from 500 to over 6,000.
- Original business plan projected population peak between 42,000 and 48,000. Currently, it is anticipated to serve as many as 75,000 people.
- Bulk industry water sales are projected to pay for approximately 80 percent of WAWSP's original price tag.

2013-2015 FUNDING REQUEST = \$80 MILLION

During the 2013 Legislative Session, WAWSA will be seeking funding for Phases II(A) and III totaling \$80 million, \$40 million loan funds and \$40 million grant funds.
