1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the game and fish  
2 department; and to declare an emergency.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds  
5 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the game and fish fund in the state  
6 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and  
7 other income, to the game and fish department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of  
8 that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

1       **SECTION 2. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS LINE.** The grants, gifts, and donations  
2 line item in section 1 of this Act includes up to \$400,000 received by the game and fish  
3 department for surface damage, easements, or reclamation on department-owned or  
4 department-managed properties as a result of mineral exploration and extraction activities.

5       **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$400,000  
6 for a grant to the parks and recreation department for costs associated with the project to raise  
7 the elevation of the Grahams Island state park access road, which is declared to be an  
8 emergency measure.
