Sixty-second Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, January 11, 2011

The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Wrigley presiding.

The prayer was offered by Reverend Tim Jenks, Bethel Lutheran Church, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senators Mathern, O'Connell, and Stenehjem.

A quorum was declared by the President.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Rep. R. Kelsch and Sen. Dever introduced:

HCR 3006: A concurrent resolution designating House and Senate employment positions and fixing compensation.

Was read the first time.

MOTION

SEN. KLEIN MOVED that the rules be suspended, that HCR 3006 not be printed, not be referred to committee, but be read in title only, be printed in the Journal, and placed on the calendar for immediate second reading and final passage, which motion prevailed.

Rep. R. Kelsch and Sen. Dever introduced:

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3006

A concurrent resolution designating House and Senate employment positions and fixing compensation.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That for the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly, the following positions are designated as employee positions of the House and Senate and are to be paid the daily wages indicated:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that each employee of the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly is entitled to an additional \$1 per day for each previous regular session of the Legislative Assembly during which that employee was paid for at least 45 days, as either an

employee of the House or the Senate, and to receive this additional compensation, which may not exceed \$10 per day, that employee must certify to the Legislative Council the year of each regular session during which that employee was employed as required by this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that each majority and each minority leader is entitled to one administrative assistant and two staff assistants, but each majority or minority leader may hire fewer or more assistants so long as the total daily compensation for the assistants hired does not exceed the total daily amount authorized for those positions by this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the report of the Employment Committee of the respective house identify the number of employees in each position by listing every employee and the position for which employed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that with the approval of the Employment Committee of the respective house, a position may be converted to a part-time position, with the daily compensation converted to a per hour rate of pay, and a part-time employee may hold more than one part-time position so long as the positions held do not exceed a full-time equivalent position; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any employee resigns, is discharged, or for other reasons terminates employment, the compensation provided by this resolution for that employee ceases effective the last day of employment.

SB 2150: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-09.1, four new sections to chapter 15.1-18.2, two new sections to chapter 15.1-21, and seven new sections to chapter 15.1-27 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to regional education associations, the professional development advisory committee, North Dakota scholarships, and supplemental teacher-effectiveness compensation plans; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-07-33, 15.1-09-58, 15.1-09.1-02, 15.1-21-02.1, 15.1-21-02.4, 15.1-21-02.5, 15.1-21-02.6, 15.1-21-08, 15.1-21-18, 15.1-21-19, 15.1-27-03.1, 15.1-27-04, 15.1-27-07.2, 15.1-27-11, and 15.1-27-35.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to technology, regional education associations, curriculum requirements, assessments, scholarships, student consultations, and state aid; to repeal section 15.1-27-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to isolated schools; to provide an appropriation; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide for compensation increases, transition payments, and the distribution of transportation grants, principal mentorship grants, and regional education association grants.

SB 2178: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 57-38-30.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a reduction in income tax rates for individuals, estates, and trusts; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sen. Wardner and Rep. N. Johnson introduced:

SB 2179: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-16-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a per diem increase for members of the North Dakota education factfinding commission.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.

Sens. Wardner, Cook, Lyson and Reps. Glassheim, D. Johnson introduced:

SB 2180: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 40-57.3-01, 40-57.3-01.1, and 40-57.3-02 and subsection 22 of section 57-39.2-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to city lodging tax and state sales tax application to stays of thirty days or more and the city visitors' committee; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sens. Olafson, Lyson, Schneider and Reps. Damschen, Klemin, Monson introduced:

SB 2181: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 14-10-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to mitigating factors for contributing to the consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages by a minor.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Nething, O'Connell and Rep. Kingsbury introduced:

SB 2182: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 51-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to false advertisements regarding location of business; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Hogue, Fischer, Wardner and Reps. Bellew, Klein, Weisz introduced:

SB 2183: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 6-08-16 and subsections 2 and 3 of section 6-08-16.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the penalties for issuing a check without sufficient funds or without an account; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Hogue, Cook and Reps. Bellew, Weisz introduced:

SB 2184: A BILL for an Act to provide for a legislative management study relating to the feasibility and desirability of extending the sales tax exemption on purchases of tangible property to all charitable nonprofit organizations.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sens. Oehlke, Burckhard, Robinson and Reps. Mock, Hofstad introduced:

SB 2185: A BILL for an Act to create and enact seven new sections to chapter 43-52 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to regulation of sign language interpreters; to amend and reenact sections 43-52-01, 43-52-02, and 43-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to regulation of sign language interpreters; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions Committee**.

Sens. Wardner, Nodland, Andrist and Reps. Brandenburg, Kaldor introduced:

SB 2186: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-35-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the energy development and transmission committee.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Natural Resources Committee**.

FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Sens. Olafson, Hogue and Rep. Thoreson introduced:

SCR 4007: A concurrent resolution providing for the application for an amendments convention to the Constitution of the United States to be called for the purpose of proposing an amendment that provides that an increase in the federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate states.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Klein's motion.
