REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE KLEIN

This past weekend, the Bishop Ryan girls' basketball team achieved a rare goal - a three-peat, winning the North Dakota Class B basketball championship for the past three seasons. The senior class went 107-3 over the past four seasons including 83 consecutive wins against Class B opponents and 11 straight victories in state tournament play.
