

JOURNAL OF THE HOUSE - SPECIAL SESSION**Sixty-fourth Legislative Assembly**

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Bismarck, August 4, 2016

The House convened at 8:00 a.m., with Speaker Belter presiding.

The prayer was offered by Representative Larson.

The roll was called and all members were present except Representatives Glassheim, Holman, Skarphol, and Wallman.

A quorum was declared by the Speaker.

SECOND READING OF SENATE BILL

SB 2379: A BILL for an Act to provide for the reduction of general fund appropriation authority; to authorize transfers from the budget stabilization fund and the Bank of North Dakota; to provide appropriations for the department of human services and the department of corrections and rehabilitation; to provide for reports; to provide legislative intent; and to provide an effective date.

MOTION

REP. M. NELSON MOVED that SB 2379 be rereferred to the Appropriations Committee.

RULING

SPEAKER BELTER RULED that the motion was out of order.

REP. M. NELSON APPEALED the ruling of the Speaker.

SPEAKER BELTER RULED that there would be a voice vote on the ruling of the Speaker that the motion to rerefer was out of order, which voice vote prevailed. Therefore the ruling was deemed in order.

The motion to rerefer SB 2379 was denied.
