# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That for the Sixty-fourth Legislative Assembly, the following positions are designated as employee positions of the House and Senate and are to be paid the daily wages indicated:

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that each employee of the Sixty-fourth Legislative Assembly is entitled to an additional \$1 per day for each previous regular session of the Legislative Assembly during which that employee was paid for at least 45 days, as either an employee of the House or the Senate, and to receive this additional compensation, which may not exceed \$10 per day, that employee must certify to the Legislative Council the year of each regular session during which that employee was employed as required by this resolution; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that each majority and each minority leader is entitled to one administrative assistant and two staff assistants, but each majority or minority leader may hire fewer or more assistants so long as the total daily compensation for the assistants hired does not exceed the total daily amount authorized for those positions by this resolution; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the report of the Employment Committee of the respective house identify the number of employees in each position by listing every employee and the position for which employed; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that with the approval of the Employment Committee of the respective house, a position may be converted to a part-time position, with the daily compensation converted to a per hour rate of pay, and a part-time employee may hold more than one part-time position so long as the positions held do not exceed a full-time equivalent position; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that if any employee resigns, is discharged, or for other reasons terminates employment, the compensation provided by this resolution for that employee ceases effective the last day of employment.

**SB 2233:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 48-01.2-22 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the public opening of subcontractor bids.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Sens. Dever, Axness, Mathern, Oban, Wanzek and Rep. Brandenburg introduced:

**SB 2234:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 25-01.2-01 and section 50-24.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to Down syndrome and eligibility for medical assistance.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sen. J. Lee introduced:

**SB 2235:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to warranty work compensation for outdoor power equipment.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Sen. J. Lee and Rep. Porter introduced:

**SB 2236:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 12-60-24, a new subsection to section 43-17-02, and a new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation and licensure of technical personnel who perform medical imaging procedures and radiation therapy treatments; to provide a penalty; and to provide an appropriation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sens. J. Lee, Dever, Mathern and Reps. Beadle, Delmore, Hofstad introduced:

**SB 2237:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-31-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to information received by the department of human services for substance abuse treatment programs; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Schneider and Rep. M. Nelson introduced:

**SB 2238:** A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the adjutant general for veterans' military caskets.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Schneider, Warner and Reps. M. Nelson, Onstad introduced:

**SB 2239:** A BILL for an Act to provide for the establishment of a center for independent living outreach office on the Turtle Mountain Indian Reservation; and to provide an appropriation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Schneider and Reps. Dockter, Mock, Onstad, Trottier introduced:

**SB 2240:** A BILL for an Act to provide for the display of Indian nation and service flags at certain locations in the state capitol.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Schneider, Warner and Reps. M. Nelson, Onstad introduced:

**SB 2241:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to creation of department of commerce satellite offices on Indian reservations.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Carlisle, Dever and Reps. Dockter, Mock, Onstad introduced:

**SB 2242:** A BILL for an Act to provide for an appropriation for veterans' spouses and dependents burial fees at the veterans' cemetery.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Oehlke, Schneider and Reps. D. Johnson, J. Nelson, Trottier introduced:

**SB 2243:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a department of commerce North Dakota tribal tourism alliance program; and to provide an appropriation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Schneider and Reps. M. Nelson, Onstad introduced:

**SB 2244:** A BILL for an Act create and enact a new section to chapter 37-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the creation, membership, and duties of the tribal veterans' advisory commission.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Marcellais, Schneider, Warner and Reps. Mock, M. Nelson, Onstad introduced:

**SB 2245:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 37-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an Indian veteran representative; and to provide an appropriation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Klein, Campbell, O'Connell and Reps. Brandenburg, Pollert, Weisz introduced:

**SB 2246:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 48-01.2-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the bidding threshold for plans and specifications for a public improvement contract.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions Committee**.

Sens. Grabinger, Miller and Reps. Beadle, Boschee, Haak introduced:

**SB 2247:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-03-02, 54-03-02.1, and 54-35-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reconvened regular sessions of the legislative assembly in even-numbered years; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

# FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Sens. Cook, Poolman, Schaible and Reps. Meier, Nathe, Toman introduced:

**SCR 4011:** A concurrent resolution urging Congress to take a pro-education position, extricate the federal government from any role it has unconstitutionally usurped with respect to the education of our children, and eliminate the United States Department of Education.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.
