ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2041

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the department of human services to develop a  
2 master plan in conjunction with the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the state  
3 hospital and the James River correctional center; and to provide for reports to the legislative  
4 management.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - STATE**  
7 **HOSPITAL AND JAMES RIVER CORRECTIONAL CENTER MASTER PLAN.** There is

8 appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise  
9 appropriated, the sum of \$125,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the  
10 department of human services for the purpose of developing a master plan, in conjunction with  
11 the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the life skills and transition center, the state  
12 hospital, and the James River correctional center, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and  
13 ending June 30, 2017. The master plan must address:

- 14 1. Land use, vacant structures, and current and projected space needs of the state  
15 hospital and the James River correctional center;
- 16 2. The potential sale of a portion of the state hospital's agricultural land with the proceeds  
17 being used for capital improvement projects at the state hospital; and
- 18 3. The potential to transfer facilities at the life skills and transition center and the state  
19 hospital to the department of corrections and rehabilitation.

20 **SECTION 2. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE**

21 **MANAGEMENT.** The department of human services shall provide periodic status reports of the  
22 development of the state hospital and James River correctional center master plan to the  
23 legislative management and shall present the completed master plan to the legislative  
24 management by July 1, 2016.
