- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 26.1-36; a new section to chapter
- 2 54-52.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to insurance coverage of cancer treatment
- 3 medications; and to provide for application.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 26.1-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows:

7 <u>Coverage of cancer treatment medications.</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>As used in this section:</u>
- 9a."Cancer treatment medications" means prescription drugs and biologics that are10used to kill, slow, or prevent the growth of cancerous cells.
- b. <u>"Insurer" means an insurance company, nonprofit health service corporation, or</u>
 <u>health maintenance organization.</u>
- 13 <u>c.</u> <u>"Patient-administered" includes oral administration and self-injection.</u>
- 14d."Policy" means an accident and health insurance policy, contract, or evidence of15coverage on a group, individual, blanket, franchise, or association basis.
- An insurer may not deliver, issue, execute, or renew a policy that provides coverage
 for cancer treatment medications that are injected or are intravenously administered
- 18 by a health care provider and that provides coverage for patient-administered cancer
- 19 treatment medications unless-the:
- 20 a. The policy copayment, deductible, and coinsurance amounts for
- 21 patient-administered cancer treatment medications do not exceed the amounts
- 22 for cancer treatment medications that are injected or are intravenously
- 23 administered by a health care provider, regardless of the formulation or benefit
 - <u>category; or</u>

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1		b. The policy copayment, deductible, and coinsurance amounts for a month's supply
2		of a patient-administered cancer treatment medication do not exceed one
3		hundred dollars per filled prescription.
4	<u>3.</u>	An insurer may not increase a copayment, deductible, or coinsurance amount for
5		covered cancer treatment medications that are injected or intravenously administered
6		in order to avoid compliance with subsection 2. An insurer may not reclassify benefits
7		with respect to cancer treatment medications in a manner that is inconsistent with this
8		section.
