## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## 7 <u>Disclosure of directory information.</u>

- An institution of higher education under the control of the state board of higher
  education may disclose directory information regarding a current student only if the
  institution has:
  - a. Provided electronic notification to a student age eighteen or older and to the parent of a student younger than eighteen regarding the types of personally identifiable information that the institution defines as directory information; and
    - <u>Obtained electronic permission to disclose the directory information from the</u>
      <u>student or from the student's parent in the case of a student younger than</u>
      <u>eighteen.</u>
- 2. An institution may disclose directory information about a former student unless the
  former student has electronically prohibited the disclosure.
- 3. a. Nothing in this section prevents an institution from disclosing or requiring a
  student to disclose the student's name, identifier, and institutional email address
  to a class in which the student is enrolled.
  - Nothing in this section prevents an institution from requiring a student to wear, to display publicly, or to disclose a student identification card or badge that exhibits information defined as directory information by the institution.

- 1 <u>c.</u> <u>Nothing in this section prevents an institution from specifying that its disclosure of </u>
- directory information is limited to specific parties, to specific purposes, or both.
