1 A BILL for an Act relating to a bill of rights for children who are deaf or hearing-impaired.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

3 SECTION 1.

4 Bill of rights - Children who are deaf or hearing-impaired.

- 5 <u>The legislative assembly believes that children who are deaf or hearing-impaired are</u>
- 6 <u>entitled to the following:</u>
- 7 <u>1.</u> <u>Appropriate screening and assessment of hearing and vision capabilities and</u>
- 8 <u>communication and language needs at the earliest possible age and continuation of</u>
- 9 <u>screening services throughout their educational experience.</u>
- <u>Early intervention to provide for acquisition of solid language bases at the earliest</u>
 <u>possible age.</u>
- 12 <u>3.</u> <u>Their parents' or guardians' full and informed participation in their educational</u>
 <u>planning.</u>
- 14 <u>4.</u> <u>Adult role models who are deaf or hearing-impaired.</u>
- 15 <u>5.</u> <u>Meeting and associating with their peers.</u>
- 16 <u>6.</u> Qualified teachers, interpreters, and resource personnel who communicate effectively
 17 with the child in the child's mode of communications.
- 18 <u>7.</u> <u>Placement best suited to their individual needs, including social, emotional, and</u>
- cultural needs, age, hearing loss, academic level, mode of communication, styles of
 learning, motivational level, and family support.

 education programs.
- 23 <u>9.</u> Full support services provided by qualified professionals in their educational settings.
- 24 <u>10.</u> Full access to all programs in their educational setting.
