The House convened at 1:00 p.m., with Speaker Belter presiding.

The prayer was offered by Vicar John Koopman, Bethel and Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Representatives Klein and Vigesaa.

A quorum was declared by the Speaker.

POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

REP. THORESON rose on a point of personal privilege.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE THORESON

Mr. Speaker: Thank you Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Assembly- On Saturday, January 10, in front of over 20,000 fans watching in person in Frisco, Texas - and countless more viewing around the world on ESPN2 - the North Dakota State University Bison football team achieved a level of excellence never before reached by a Division I football program, winning their fourth consecutive FCS national championship. Under the leadership of first-year head coach Chris Kleiman and his staff, the "Thundering Herd" defeated their Missouri Valley Conference rivals - the Illinois State University "Redbirds" - in a thrilling come-from-behind 29-27 victory. Overall, NDSU now holds an unbelievable twelve national football titles over their history in Divisions II and I.

In a series of plays that are sure to become as much of Bison lore as the famous Jeff Bentrin to James Molstre "pitch" back in the 1980s, with just 1:38 left in the game, quarterback Carson Wentz connected with receiver RJ Urzendowski for catches of 32 and 33 yards to get the Bison in scoring range, and then Wentz himself broke a tackle around the 5 yard line and drove into the end zone with 37 seconds left, capping a 78-yard drive in six plays. Linebacker Esley Thorton sealed the Bison victory with an interception as the Redbirds attempted a last-second effort to get into field goal range to win the game.

It should be noted that while the Bison football team has thrilled us with their successes on the field, we must not forget that these are student athletes. It pleases me to say that our players are just as successful in the classroom as they are on the field, with this year's championship team having a 3.08 team average GPA. In addition to a strong overall team showing, six of the Bison team leaders were named to the Missouri Valley Conference's all-academic team, including Buck Buchanan award winner Kyle Emanuel, standout wide receiver Zach Vraa, defensive leader Christian Dudzik, Bismarck native Esley Thorton, who as previously mentioned finished off the victory with an interception, and the championship game MVP: Bismarck native Carson Wentz, who has maintained an impressive 4.0 GPA while leading the team on their title run. It says a lot about the quality of our program, when the leaders of the team are also proven to be leaders in the classroom, and for that we should be extremely proud.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Assembly, as an NDSU graduate and lifetime Bison fan, it is my honor to salute our four-time national champions and hope that next year - with all of their fingers filled with rings already - we'll be playing for "one for the thumb". Go Bison!
