- i. Address plans regarding student transportation;
- j. Identify other governmental entities, including multidistrict special education units and area career and technology centers, which may provide services to the new district;
- k. Include the taxable valuation and per student valuation of each participating district and the taxable valuation and per student valuation of the new district;
- I. Include the amount of all bonded and other indebtedness incurred by each participating district;

 - c. The swine production facility is permitted as a concentrated animal feeding operation by the state department of health and consists of at least five hundred swine.
 - 3. <u>The agriculture commissioner shall by rule develop reporting and</u> monitoring requirements to ensure compliance with this section.
 - <u>4.</u> <u>a.</u> <u>If the agriculture commissioner determines that a domestic</u> <u>corporation or a limited liability company is not operating within the</u> <u>exceptions provided by this section, the commissioner shall notify</u> <u>the secretary of state and the attorney general.</u>
 - b. <u>A domestic corporation or a limited liability company that is not</u> operating within the exceptions provided by this section is subject to the enforcement provisions of this chapter."
