1 A BILL ~~for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota~~
2 ~~Century Code, relating to prohibiting entry onto private land without permission.~~ for an Act to
3 provide for a legislative management study of search and seizure procedures.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 ~~SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is created~~
6 ~~and enacted as follows:~~

7 ~~Law enforcement entry onto private land without permission prohibited - Exception.~~

8 ~~1. As used in this section, "law enforcement officer" has the meaning provided in section~~
9 ~~12.1-01-04.~~

10 ~~2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law and subject to subsection 3, a law~~
11 ~~enforcement officer may not search buildings or private land unless the law~~
12 ~~enforcement officer receives permission from the landowner or a lessee of the land.~~

13 ~~3. A law enforcement officer may enter private land without permission if:~~

14 ~~a. Probable cause exists that a violation of law has occurred, is occurring, or is~~
15 ~~about to occur;~~

16 ~~b. A search warrant has been issued; or~~

17 ~~c. Responding to an emergency situation, accident, or other threat to public safety.~~

18 ~~4. Any property or contraband seized by a law enforcement officer in violation of~~
19 ~~subsection 2 may not be used as evidence against a defendant in any criminal~~
20 ~~proceeding.~~

21 **SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - SEARCH AND SEIZURE**
22 **PROCEDURES.** During the 2019-20 interim, the legislative management shall consider
23 studying the fourth amendment to the Constitution of the United States, including the

1 investigation, search, and seizure of private land, livestock, and buildings. The study must
2 include options for protecting property from unreasonable interference by law enforcement. The
3 legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any
4 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative
5 assembly.
