During the 2019-21 interim, the public employees retirement system board shall solicit and receive bids for the 2021-23 biennium hospital benefits coverage and medical benefits coverage for state employees under section 54-52.1-04. The request for proposal must include an option for coverage through a self-insurance plan. The board may not enter a contract for hospital benefits coverage or medical benefits coverage for the 2021-23 biennium until the board reports to and receives input from the sixty-seventh legislative assembly. The report must provide comparative information and the board's evaluation of the bids received, including information on the self-insurance option."

An option for coverage through a selfinsurance plan must be requested in the proposal. The board may not enter into a contract until it receives input from the 67th Legislative Assembly.

The Senate provided funding for a 2 percent salary increase on July 1, 2019, and a 3 percent salary increase on July 1, 2020.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Funding of \$165,476, including 1 FTE undesignated position is removed, of which \$138,796 is for salaries and wages and \$26,680 is for related operating expenses. The Senate did not remove any FTE positions from the base budget.
