ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1103

Introduced by

(At the request of the Department of Human Services)

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 50-31 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to licensure of an opioid treatment medication unit and fees; and to  
3 amend and reenact section 50-31-01 and subsection 1 of section 50-31-05 of the North Dakota  
4 Century Code, relating to the definition of medication unit and the licensure of substance abuse  
5 treatment programs.

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-31-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 **50-31-01. Definitions.**

- 10 1. "Department" means the department of human services.
- 11 2. "Medication unit" means a facility established as part of, but geographically separate  
12 from, an opioid treatment program, from which a licensed practitioner dispenses or  
13 administers an opioid treatment medication or collects samples for drug testing or  
14 analysis.
- 15 3. "Opioid treatment program" means a program through which medication is dispensed  
16 in the treatment of opioid addiction.

17 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 50-31-05 of the North Dakota Century  
18 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 19 1. The department ~~is authorized to~~ may issue licenses to operate substance abuse  
20 treatment programs, for a period of ~~two~~ three years, which are found to comply with the  
21 provisions of this chapter and rules adopted by the department.

22 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 50-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
23 and enacted as follows:

1        **Opioid treatment medication unit - Licensure required - Rules.**

2        1. A medication unit may not operate in this state, unless the unit operates under the  
3        license of an opioid treatment program and holds:

4        a. A separate registration from the United States department of justice drug  
5        enforcement administration; and

6        b. A medication unit license under the department.

7        2. The department may license a medication unit. A separate license is required for each  
8        location at which a medication unit is operated under this section.

9        3. The department shall adopt rules relating to licensing and monitoring a medication  
10       unit, including rules for:

11       a. Standards for approval and maintenance of licensure;

12       b. Assessment of need for a medication unit in the proposed location, including  
13       community engagement; and

14       c. Standards of patient care.

15       **SECTION 4.** A new section to chapter 50-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
16 and enacted as follows:

17       **Fees - Rules.**

18       An applicant for licensure under this chapter shall submit a one hundred fifty dollar  
19 nonrefundable fee with the application. The department shall adopt rules as necessary to  
20 implement this section. All fees collected under this section must be paid to the department and  
21 must be used to defray the cost of administering and enforcing this chapter.
