- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-62.5-01, 15-62.5-03, 15.1-21-02.4,
- 2 15.1-21-02.5, 15.1-21-02.7, 15.1-21-08.1, 15.1-21-19, and 15.1-21-20 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to student assessment scores and vendor references.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-62.5-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 15-62.5-01. Scholars program.

8 The state board of higher education shall administer the scholars program for the purpose

9 of providing a merit-based scholarship to an individual who:

- 10 1. a. Graduated from a high school in this state;
- b. Graduated from a high school in a bordering state, pursuant to chapter 15.1-29;
- c. Graduated from a nonpublic high school in a bordering state while residing with a
 custodial parent in this state; or
- 14 d. Completed a program of home education supervised in accordance with chapter
 15 15.1-23;
- On the ACT <u>or an equivalent nationally recognized standardized test approved by the</u>
 <u>state board of higher education</u>, achieved composite scores that ranked the individual
 at or above the ninety-fifth percentile among those who took the ACT <u>or an equivalent</u>
 <u>nationally recognized standardized test approved by the state board of higher</u>
- 20 <u>education</u>, prior to July first in the calendar year preceding the individual's enrollment;
- 3. a. Is enrolled at an accredited institution of higher education in this state that offers
 a program of instruction equal to at least two academic years;
- b. Because of a medically certifiable disability is enrolled at an accredited institution
 of higher education outside of this state that offers the individual special services

1		or facilities not available in this state, provided the institution offers a program of
2		instruction equal to at least two academic years; and
3	4.	Is pursuing a course of study determined by the board to be full-time.
4	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15-62.5-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
6	15-6	2.5-03. Scholars program - Ranking and selection of recipients.
7	1.	The state board of higher education shall rank scholars program applicants by their
8		ACT composite scores or equivalent scores on a nationally recognized standardized
9		test approved by the state board of higher education.
10	2.	If two or more applicants have the same composite scores, they must be ranked by
11		the numeric sum of their four scale scores on the ACT or equivalent scores on a
12		nationally recognized standardized test approved by the state board of higher
13		education.
14	3.	If two or more applicants have the same composite scores and the same numeric sum
15		of the four scale scores, they must be ranked by the numeric sum of their English and
16		mathematics scores.
17	4.	The state board of higher education may establish additional criteria to rank applicants
18		who have the same numeric sum of their English and mathematics scores.
19	5.	Scholarships must be offered to applicants in descending order according to this
20		ranking until available funds have been expended or until the pool of applicants has
21		been exhausted.

In addition to the authority granted under subsection 1, a student's parent may direct 29 that the school district in which the student is enrolled not administer any other specific 30 test or assessment to the student, except a parental directive under this subsection 31 does not apply to:
