ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2018

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of 2 commerce; to provide an appropriation to the department of transportation; to create and enact 3 a new section to chapter 4.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the transfer of the 4 international business and trade office from the department of commerce to the agriculture 5 commissioner; to amend and reenact sections 54-34.3-13 and 54-60-29 of the North 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to the rural growth incentive program and the unmanned aircraft 7 systems program fund; to repeal section 54-60-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to 8 the international business and trade office; to provide a continuing appropriation; to provide for 9 a transfer; to provide for a report; and to provide an exemption; to provide a statement of 10 legislative intent; to provide for a legislative management study; and to declare an emergency.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

The 2021-23 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2023-25 biennium. The department of commerce shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

26 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION - BEYOND

27 VISUAL LINE OF SIGHT UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM PROGRAM - ONE-TIME

FUNDING. There is appropriated from special funds, derived from grant funds received from the
department of commerce pursuant to section <u>4114</u> of this Act, not otherwise appropriated, the
sum of <u>\$28,000,000</u><u>\$5,000,000</u>, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department
of transportation for the purpose of defraying tower infrastructure construction expenses of the

1 beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program, for the biennium beginning 2 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. The department of transportation may bid, award, and 3 administer any contracts necessary to complete the construction of the tower-infrastructure. 4 This funding is considered a one-time funding item. 5 SECTION 4. TRANSFER - INTERNSHIP FUND. The office of management and budget 6 shall transfer \$755,000 of the amount appropriated in the operating expenses line item in 7 section 1 of this Act to the internship fund for the purpose of administering the operation intern 8 program, for the biennium beginning and ending June 30, 2023. 9 SECTION 5. ENTREPRENEURSHIP GRANTS AND VOUCHER PROGRAM. The 10 entrepreneurship grants and voucher line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$948,467, of 11 which \$740,956 is from the general fund and \$207,511 is from the economic development fund, 12 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the entrepreneurship grants and voucher program. 13 The department shall establish guidelines to provide grants to entrepreneurial centers certified 14 by the department. The department also shall establish guidelines to award vouchers to 15 entrepreneurs to procure business development assistance from certified entrepreneurial 16 centers or to provide grants to entrepreneurs working with an entrepreneurial center. 17 SECTION 6. RURAL HEALTH CARE GRANT PROGRAM - MATCHING FUNDS 18 **REQUIREMENT.** The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$250,000 from the 19 general fund for providing matching funds to an organization assisting in the recruitment, 20 distribution, and supply, and enhancing the quality and efficiency of personnel providing health 21 services in rural areas of the state. The department of commerce may spend the funds 22 appropriated in this section only to the extent the organization has secured matching funds from 23 nonstate sources on a dollar-for-dollar basis. 24 SECTION 7. ESTIMATED INCOME - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS 25 FUND - ONE-TIME FUNDING. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes 26 the sum of \$26,000,000\$29,000,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund, of 27 which \$19,000,000 is for beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system grants and. 28 \$7,000,000 is for enhanced use lease grants, \$1,500,000 is for a job development grant to an 29 organization dedicated to promoting job development and economic growth, and \$1,500,000 is 30 for a workforce safety grant to an organization that provides workforce safety. This funding is 31 considered a one-time funding item.

1	SECTION 8. ESTIMATED INCOME - FEDERAL CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND -
2	ONE-TIME FUNDING. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum
3	of \$12,000,000 from the federal coronavirus relief fund, which is provided for the purposes
4	identified in this section. The department of commerce shall establish guidelines for awarding
5	funding under this section. This funding is considered a one-time funding item and is available
6	for the following:
7	1. \$7,000,000 for tourism marketing and branding initiatives, of which \$6,565,432 is for
8	tourism marketing and branding operating expenses and \$434,568 is for the tourism
9	transportation improvement grant program for a grant to be provided to an
10	organization dedicated to preserving and promoting a historic, tourism destination
11	North Dakota city.
12	2. \$1,000,000 for technical skills training grants.
13	3. \$2,000,000 for travel agent and tour operator emergency resiliency grants. Grants
14	may be awarded only to travel agents that book commission-based travel for private
15	individuals or companies, tour companies that schedule tour details and itineraries in
16	North Dakota, or transportation companies providing transportation services to tour
17	planners for tours originating in North Dakota or operators bringing tours into North
18	Dakota. The department of commerce shall establish additional eligibility requirements
19	for the program. The following organizations are ineligible for a grant under this
20	subsection:
21	a. National companies that provide travel services to individuals in North Dakota but
22	do not employ at least one individual in the state;
23	b. Corporations with staff dedicated to purchasing and arranging travel for
24	employees;
25	c. Military-based travel agents or other individuals employed by government
26	entities; and
27	d. Organizations that only offer guided services and tours of their attraction.
28	4. \$2,000,000 for event center emergency resiliency grants.
29	SECTION 9. BEYOND VISUAL LINE OF SIGHT UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM
30	PROGRAM - MATCHING FUND REQUIREMENT - ONE-TIME FUNDING. The grants line item
31	in section 1 of this Act includes \$1,000,000 from the general fund for grants to an organization

2	visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system industry, which the department of commerce may		
3	provide only to the extent the organization provides one dollar of matching funds from private or		
4	other public sources for each one dollar provided by the department. This funding is considered

6	SEC	TION	10. A new section to chapter 4.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
7	and ena	cted	as follows:
8	<u>Inte</u>	rnati	onal business and trade office - Advisory board - Continuing appropriation.
9	<u>1.</u>	<u>The</u>	commissioner shall administer the international business and trade office. The
10		purp	pose of the office is to assist North Dakota businesses to expand exports to
11		inte	rnational markets by:
12		<u>a.</u>	Advocating for exporters;
13		<u>b.</u>	Offering export educational opportunities to North Dakota businesses;
14		<u>C.</u>	Researching and raising awareness of export opportunities, issues, and
15			challenges impacting North Dakota businesses;
16		<u>d.</u>	Assisting North Dakota businesses in identifying, developing, and cultivating
17			international markets for products; and
18		<u>e.</u>	Organizing and carrying out trade missions that seek to facilitate contact and
19			communication between North Dakota businesses and international markets.
20	<u>2.</u>	<u>The</u>	commissioner may designate a nonprofit corporation incorporated in this state
21		<u>whic</u>	ch has the primary purpose of assisting North Dakota exporters or contract with a

27	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	commissioner may seek and accept any gift, grant, or donation of funds, property,
28		<u>serv</u>	vices, or other assistance from public or private sources for the purpose of
29		<u>furth</u>	nering the objectives of the international business and trade office. Any funds
30		acce	epted under this subsection are appropriated to the commissioner on a continuing
31		basi	is.

1	<u>4.</u>	The commissioner may establish an international business and trade office advisory
2		board with whom the commissioner may consult in administering the international
3		business and trade office. Each member of the advisory board is entitled to receive
4		per diem compensation at a rate established by the director not exceeding sixty-two
5		dollars and fifty cents and reimbursement of expenses as provided by law for state
6		officers, while attending meetings or performing duties directly related to board
7		membership, except that per diem compensation under this section may not be paid to
8		any member who receives compensation or salary as a regular state employee or
9		official.
10	SEC	CTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.3-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:
12	54-3	34.3-13. Rural growth incentive program.
13	1.	The department shall manage and administer the rural growth incentive program. A
14		city with a population of less than two thousand five hundred may apply to the
15		department to be designated as a rural growth incentive city. A rural growth incentive
16		city may be eligible for a loan, grant, or both under this section.
17	2.	The department shall designate an applicant city as a rural growth incentive city
18		eligible for a loan if the city raises funds in the amount of a dollar-for-dollar match for
19		the amount requested in the loan and meets any additional program requirements
20		provided by rule. The source of city funds used for loan matching funds may be any
21		combination of public and private funds. If the department designates a city as a rural
22		growth incentive city eligible for a loan under this section, subject to the availability of
23		funds, the state shall make a loan to the city in an amount not less than twenty-five
24		thousand dollars and not more than seventy-five thousand dollars. The department
25		shall establish the amount of the interest rate for loans provided to a city under this
26		subsection. The funding source of the state loan is the North Dakota development
27		fund. The city shall distribute the city and state funds to qualifying new or expanded
28		primary sector businesses in the city. A qualifying business in the city includes a
29		business that provides essential services to the city. For purposes of this subsection, a
30		business that provides essential services does not include a public utility. The
31		governing body of the city determines whether a new or expanded primary sector

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1		business qualifies for funding, and the director of the department determines whether
2		a business that provides essential services to the city qualifies for funding. The state
3		shall distribute a loan to a rural growth incentive city once the city establishes the city
4		has chosen a specified qualified business to receive funding.
5	3.	The department shall designate an applicant city as a rural growth incentive city
6		eligible for a grant if the city raises funds in the amount of a dollar-for-dollar match for
7		the amount requested in the grant application and meets any additional program
8		requirements provided by rule. The source of city funds used for grant matching funds
9		may be any combination of public and private funds. If the department designates a
10		city as a rural growth incentive city eligible for a grant under this section, subject to
11		availability of funds, the state shall make a grant to the city in an amount not to exceed
12		ten thousand dollars. The recipient rural growth incentive city shall use the grant
13		money received to conduct a feasibility study for the location of a new business,
14		including an expansion of a business with the primary place of business outside the
15		rural growth incentive city. The business under this subsection is not limited to primary-
16		sector businesses. The funding source of the state grant is the North Dakota
17		development fund. Total grants awarded by the department under this subsection may
18		not exceed one hundred thousand dollars per biennium.
19	4.	The city may not use city or state funds raised or provided under this section for costs
20		associated with administering the rural growth incentive city. The department shall
21		provide the rural growth incentive city with training to assist the city in expanding
22		primary sector businesses, locating new businesses, and working with state economic
23		development programs.
24	SE	CTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 54-60-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:
26	54-	60-29. Unmanned aircraft systems program fund - Continuing appropriation.
27	<u>1.</u>	There is created in the state treasury a special fund known as the unmanned aircraft
28		systems fund, which mustmay be used to defray the expenses of the operations:
20		a Operations of an unmanned aircraft systems test site officially designated by the

- 29a.Operations of an unmanned aircraft systems test site officially designated by the30federal aviation administration:
- 31 b. Beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program; and

1 Enhanced use lease grant program. <u>C.</u> 2 <u>2.</u> The fund consists of fees collected for the administration of the test site and other 3 funds appropriated by the legislative assembly. All moneys in the fund are 4 appropriated to the department of commerce on a continuing basis for the purpose of 5 defraying the expenses of the unmanned aircraft systems programprograms identified 6 in subsection 1. Interest earned on moneys in the fund must be credited to the fund. 7 **SECTION 13. REPEAL.** Section 54-60-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed. 8 SECTION 14. EXEMPTION - BEYOND VISUAL LINE OF SIGHT UNMANNED AIRCRAFT 9 SYSTEM PROGRAM. The amount of Of the \$28,000,000 appropriated from the general fund in 10 the grants line item for the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program in 11 section 27 of chapter 40 of the 2019 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11-and, up 12 to \$5,000,000 of unexpended funds may be continued and is available for the program during 13 the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. The department of commerce 14 may provide grants of up to \$28,000,000\$5,000,000, to the department of transportation, for the 15 purpose of defraying tower infrastructure construction expenses of the beyond visual line of 16 sight unmanned aircraft system program during the 2021-23 biennium. 17 SECTION 15. EXEMPTION - UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM PROGRAM. The amount 18 of \$2,250,000 appropriated from the general fund in the operating expenses line item for the 19 unmanned aircraft system program in section 27 of chapter 40 of the 2019 Session Laws is not 20 subject to section 54-44.1-11 and is available for the program during the biennium beginning 21 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. 22 SECTION 16. EXEMPTION - ENHANCED USE LEASE GRANT PROGRAM. The amount 23 of \$3,000,000 appropriated from the general fund in the grants line item for the enhanced use 24 lease grant program in section 27 of chapter 40 of the 2019 Session Laws is not subject to 25 section 54-44.1-11 and is available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, 26 and ending June 30, 2023. 27 SECTION 16. EXEMPTION - EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION PROGRAM. The amount 28 of \$1,500,000 appropriated from the general fund in the operating expenses line item and 29 grants line item for the early childhood education program in section 27 of chapter 40 of the 30 2019 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and is available for the program during 31 the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

1 SECTION 17. EXEMPTION - NONRESIDENT NURSE EMPLOYMENT RECRUITMENT 2 **PROGRAM - ELIGIBILITY.** Of the \$500,000 appropriated from the general fund in the grants 3 line item for the nonresident nurse employment recruitment program in section 27 of chapter 40 4 of the 2019 Session Laws, \$320,000 is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and is available for the 5 program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. In addition to 6 the program eligibility guidelines established for the 2019-21 biennium, the department of 7 commerce shall provide funding authorized in this section to eligible nursing students in the 8 state who have not been employed by a health care provider on a full-time basis in the year 9 preceding the grant award. 10 SECTION 18. EXEMPTION - DISCRETIONARY FUNDS. The amount of \$2,150,000 11 appropriated from the general fund in the discretionary funds line item in section 27 of chapter 12 40 of the 2019 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and is available for the 13 program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. Of this 14 amount, up to \$200,000 must be used to retrain up to ten displaced energy industry workers to 15 enhance programmer development and engineering skills. 16 SECTION 19. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - NORTHERN PLAINS UNMANNED AIRCRAFT 17 **SYSTEM TEST SITE.** It is the intent of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly that the northern 18 plains unmanned aircraft system test site maximize earned revenue to the extent possible while 19 operating and conducting business of the test site. 20 SECTION 20. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - DATA STORAGE. During the 21 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying data storage by state 22 entities. The study must include input from the information technology department, North 23 Dakota university system, and kindergarten through grade twelve education coordination 24 council. The study must consider data security, geographical locations of storage, geographical 25 locations of corporate contractors, state and federal laws that may affect North Dakota data, 26 ownership and control of data storage, and current and estimated data storage costs related to

- 27 cloud-based, out-of-state data storage of North Dakota state and local government data. The
- 28 legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any
- 29 legislation necessary to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative
- 30 assembly.

1	SECTION 21. EMERGENCY. The \$12,000,000 appropriated from the federal coronavirus
2	relief fund, of which \$6,565,432 is in the operating expenses line item and \$5,434,568 is in the
3	grants line item in section 1 and identified in sections 2 and 8, and the \$100,000 appropriated
4	from the general fund for a motion picture production and recruitment grant in the grants line
5	item in section 1 and identified in section 2 of this Act are declared to be an emergency
6	measure.
