- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to school district virtual learning policies; to amend and reenact sections
- 3 15.1-06-04 and 15.1-27-23 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the satisfaction of
- 4 school calendar hours through virtual instruction; and to provide for a legislative management
- 5 report.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 **15.1-06-04.** School calendar - Length.

- 10 1. A school district shall provide for a school calendar that includes:
- a. At least nine hundred sixty-two and one-half hours of instruction for elementary
 school students and one thousand fifty hours of instruction for middle and high
 school students;
- b. Three holidays, as selected by the board in consultation with district teachers
 from the list provided for in subdivisions b through j of subsection 1 of section
 15.1-06-02:

17 c. No more than two days for:

- (1) Parent-teacher conferences; or
- (2) Compensatory time for parent-teacher conferences held outside of regular school hours; and
- 21 d. At least three days of professional development not including meals or breaks.
- 22 2. For the first three days of professional development required under subdivision d of
 23 subsection 1, a day of professional development must consist of:

1		a.	Six hours of professional development, exclusive of meals and other breaks,	
2			conducted within a single day;	
3		b.	Six hours of cumulative professional development conducted under the auspices	
4			of a professional learning community; or	
5		C.	Two four-hour periods of professional development, exclusive of meals and other	
6			breaks, conducted over two days.	
7	3.	If because of weather or other conditions a school must cancel hours of instruction or		
8		disn	niss before completing a full dayall hours of instruction for the day, the school is	
9		resp	oonsible for making up only those hours and portions of an hour between the time	
10		of <u>ca</u>	ancellation or early dismissal and the conclusion of a full dayall hours of classroom	
11		insti	ruction for the day if the dismissal will result in the school failing to meet the	
12		requirements of subdivision a of subsection 1. A school district may satisfy the		
13		requirements of this section by providing virtual instruction pursuant to section 2 of this		
14		<u>Act.</u>		
15	4.	For	purposes of this section, a full day of instruction consists of:	
16		a.	At least five and one-half hours for kindergarten and elementary students, during	
17			which time the students are required to be in attendance for the purpose of	
18			receiving curricular instruction; and	
19		b.	At least six hours for high school students, during which time the students are	
20			required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving curricular instruction.	
21	5.	lf a	school district intends to operate under a school calendar that consists of four days	
22		of in	nstruction per week, the school district shall apply and be approved for a waiver by	
23		the	superintendent of public instruction.	
24	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
25	and enacted as follows:			
26	School districts - Policy - Virtual learning - Report to legislative management.			
27	The board of a school district or governing board of a nonpublic school that operates a			
28	physical school plant may adopt a policy to allow students to engage in virtual instruction and			
29	qualify for average daily membership in the district. The superintendent of public instruction			
30	shall adopt rules governing policies under this section. A policy adopted by a school district			
31	under this section must comply with the rules adopted by the superintendent of public

- 1 instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall provide biennial reports to the
- 2 legislative management regarding the academic performance metrics of students participating
- 3 in virtual instruction under this section.

4 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15.1-27-23. Weather or other emergency conditions Closure of schools State aid
 payments to school districts.
- 8 The board of each school district shall establish the length of a period, day, and week 1. 9 in accordance with the requirements of section 15.1-06-04. If a public school or school 10 district is closed or provides less than a full day of instruction, the public school or 11 school district shall reschedule those hours to ensure students receive at least the 12 minimum number of instructional hours required by subdivision a of subsection 1 of 13 section 15.1-06-04. A school or school district may satisfy the requirements of this 14 section by providing virtual instruction under section 15.1-06-04. 15 2. Any public school or school district for which the rescheduling of classes would create 16 undue hardship may request that, for purposes of calculating state aid payments to the
- 17 school district, the governor waive the rescheduling in whole or in part.
