A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-01-05.2 of the North Dakota Century Code,
relating to administration of epinephrine.for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-01-05.2 of

use and immunity from liability; and to declare an emergency.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-01-05.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
7	amended and reenacted as follows:

9	<del>1.</del>	The state health officercouncil shall adopt rules to authorize a laypersonany member
10		of the public to administer epinephrine to an individual who has a severe allergic
11		reaction.
12	<del>2</del> .	An individual authorized to administer epinephrine by the state health officer may
13		obtain premeasured doses of epinephrine and the necessary paraphernalia for
14		epinephrine administration from any licensed physician or pharmacist.
15	<del>3.</del>	An individual authorized to administer epinephrine by the state health officer, and the
16		employer of such an individual, is not civilly or criminally liable for any act or omission-
17		of that individual when acting in good faith while rendering emergency treatment to an
18		individual who has a severe adverse reaction, except when the conduct amounts to
19		<del>gross negligence.</del>
20	<u>4.</u>	Rules adopted under this section may not:
21		a. Limit the individuals authorized to administer epinephrine to teachers, camp
22		counselors, day counselors, day care operators, and security personnel;
23		b. Require training by a physician licensed by the North Dakota board of medicine
24		or the physician's designee to administer epinephrine; or

7	1.	The state health officer shall adopt rules to authorize a layperson to administer

17		a. "Epinephrine" means a single-use disposable device that automatically injects a	
18		premeasured dose of epinephrine.	
19		b. "Health care professional" means a licensed or certified health care professional	
20		who is working within the scope of practice for that profession. The term may	
21		include a physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, and	
22		pharmacist acting in the professional's scope of practice.	
23	2.	A health care professional acting in good faith may directly or by standing order	
24		prescribe, distribute, or dispense epinephrine, if the health care professional provides	
25		training to:	
26		a. An individual at risk of experiencing a severe allergic reaction; or	
27		b. A family member, friend, or other person in a position to assist an individual at	
28		risk of experiencing a severe allergic reaction.	
29	3.	A person acting in good faith may receive or possess epinephrine if that person is:	
30		a. An individual at risk of experiencing a severe allergic reaction; or	

- b. A family member, friend, or other person in a position to assist an individual at risk of experiencing a severe allergic reaction.
- 4. An individual acting in good faith may self-administer epinephrine or administer

  epinephrine to another individual who the administering individual suspects is at risk of

  experiencing a severe allergic reaction.
- 5. A person may receive, possess, or administer epinephrine under subsection 3 or 4, regardless of whether the person is the individual for or the person to which the epinephrine is prescribed, distributed, or dispensed. A person in possession of epinephrine which is acting in good faith may provide training on how to use epinephrine.
- 6. A health care professional who prescribes, distributes, trains on the use of, or dispenses epinephrine as authorized under this section is not subject to professional discipline for such action. This section does not expand the scope of practice of a health care professional.
- 7. A person that prescribes, distributes, dispenses, receives, possesses, trains in the use of, or administers epinephrine as authorized under this section is immune from civil and criminal liability for such action. This subsection provides immunity to the person responsible for the site on which the epinephrine is located. Immunity from liability or discipline under this subsection does not apply if the person's actions constitute recklessness, gross negligence, or intentional misconduct.

**SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
