A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-10-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 11 15-10-59. Annual report Scholarships.
- The state board of higher education shall provide to the legislative management an annual report regarding the number of North Dakota scholarships, North Dakota academic scholarships, and North Dakota career and technical education scholarships provided and demographic information pertaining to the recipients.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- The state board of higher education shall provide to the legislative management an annual report regarding the number of North Dakota scholarships, North Dakota academic scholarships, and North Dakota career and technical education scholarships provided and demographic information pertaining to the recipients.

AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.9 of the North Dakota Century Code is 10 amended and reenacted as follows: 11 15.1-21-02.9. North Dakota scholarship - Information system. 12 Each school district shall use North Dakota eTranscripts, or an alternative information 13 system designated by the information technology department in collaboration with the 14 department of public instruction, to submit official transcripts for the North Dakota, North Dakota 15 academic, or North Dakota career and technical education scholarship to the superintendent of 16 public instruction. 17 **SECTION 10. REPEAL.** Sections 15.1-21-02.4 and 15.1-21-02.5 of the North Dakota 18 Century Code are repealed. 19 **SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE.** Sections 2, 5, 7, 9, and 10 of this Act become effective 20 on July 31, 2024.
