- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 55-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a commission for the commemoration of the two hundred fifty years
- 3 since America's founding; and to provide a continuing appropriation.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 55-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

## 7 <u>America 250 commission.</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> The America 250 commission within the state historical society is comprised of
- 9 members appointed under this subsection. The head of each of the following
- 10 departments and entities shall select one member to represent the department or
- 11 <u>entity, and the state historical society may invite other persons to join the America 250</u>
- 12 <u>commission or select representatives to join the commission:</u>
- 13 <u>a.</u> <u>State historical society;</u>
- 14 <u>b.</u> <u>Department of veterans' affairs;</u>
- 15 <u>c.</u> <u>Department of public instruction;</u>
- 16 <u>d.</u> Indian affairs commission;
- 17 <u>e.</u> <u>State library;</u>
- 18 <u>f.</u> North Dakota council on the arts;
- 19 g. North Dakota humanities council;
- 20 h. North Dakota state society daughters of the American revolution;
- 21 <u>i.</u> North Dakota tourism division of the department of commerce;
- 22 j. Parks and recreation department;
- 23 <u>k.</u> <u>Office of the governor;</u>
- 24 <u>I.</u> Office of each United States senator representing North Dakota;

12	<u>1.</u>	<u>The</u>	e American 250 commission has exclusive authority to represent this state in official	
13		<u>dea</u>	alings with the American 250 foundation and the United States semiquincentennial	
14		<u>con</u>	nmission.	
15	<u>2.</u>	<u>The</u>	e commission may accept gifts, grants, and donations from public and nonpublic	
16		<u>SOU</u>	irces and may expend or invest any funds the commission receives. Any funds	
17		acc	epted by the commission are appropriated to the state historical society on a	
18		<u>con</u>	tinuing basis for the purpose of supporting the commission's lawful activities.	
19	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	e commission may coordinate and engage in semiquincentennial initiatives	
20		pro	posed or undertaken by any public or nonpublic person and may initiate or propose	
21		<u>sen</u>	niquincentennial activities in or for this state.	
22	<u>4.</u>	The commission shall:		
23		<u>a.</u>	Develop and promote plans for statewide recognition of the two hundred fifty	
24			years since America's founding;	
25		<u>b.</u>	Identify statewide and local community partners to provide local opportunities for	
26			public discussion regarding the founding of our nation and the subsequent two	
27			hundred fifty years;	
28		<u>C.</u>	Identify prominent locations to display a replica of the liberty bell;	
29		<u>d.</u>	Identify a permanent location within the state for a plaque or memorial honoring	
30			patriots of the American revolution; and

1	<u>e</u>	Develop and propose to the state historical society a budget to be included in the
2		state historical society's budget proposal to the legislative assembly which
3		includes contributions from local, state, and federal government entities; nonprofit
4		organizations; corporate entities; and individuals.
