- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-06-42 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the substance use disorder treatment voucher system.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-06-42 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **50-06-42. Substance use disorder treatment voucher system.**
 - 1. The department shall establish and administer, within the limits of legislative appropriations, a voucher system to address underserved areas and gaps in the state's substance abuse treatment system and to assist in the payment of addiction treatment services provided by licensed substance abuse treatment programs, excluding regional human service centers, and hospital- or medical clinic-based programs for medical management of withdrawal. An out-of-state licensed substance abuse treatment program located within five miles [8.05 kilometers] of the North Dakota border may participate in the voucher program to serve an underserved area of this state identified by the department.
 - 2. Services eligible for the voucher program include only those levels of care recognized by the American society of addiction medicine, with particular emphasis given to underserved areas and programs. The department shall ensure that a licensed substance abuse treatment program, hospital, and medical clinic program accepting vouchers collects and reports process and outcome measures.
 - 3. The department shall develop requirements and provide training and technical assistance to a licensed substance abuse treatment program, hospital, and medical clinic program accepting vouchers. A licensed substance abuse treatment program,
