- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the sale or purchase of a catalytic converter; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 5 and enacted as follows:
- 6 Sale or purchase of catalytic converter.
- As used in this section, "core recycler" means a person that buys used individual
 catalytic converters previously removed from a motor vehicle. The term includes a
 recycler, junk dealer, valuable metal dealer, pawn shop, and a chop shop as defined in
 section 39-30-01.
 - 2. A core recycler may not purchase or attempt to purchase a catalytic converter, in whole or in part, when the catalytic converter is not attached to a motor vehicle at the time of the sale or attempted sale, unless the seller is a used parts dealer or an automotive repair company.
 - 3. Subsection 2 does not apply if the seller provides:
 - a. The Provides the core recycler with a certificate of title, certificate of registration,
 or a receipt from a transaction of repair, or a bill of sale for the motor vehicle from
 which the catalytic converter was taken; or
 - b. An affidavit executed by a law enforcement officer attesting to the officer's reasonable belief that the catalytic converter lawfully came into the possession of the person attempting to sell the catalytic converter. Is a licensed business that in the regular course of business collects, stores, or sells a catalytic converter or any other motor vehicle part.

A person that violates this section is subject to a fine of one thousand dollars for a first
 offense, and a fine of two thousand dollars for a subsequent offense. In addition to the
 fine imposed for a subsequent offense, the court shall order the defendant to cease
 engaging in the business of a core recycler for a period one year.
